

Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

February 12, 2023 Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time Sirach 15:15-20 Psalm 119:1-2, 4-5, 17-18, 33-34 1 Corinthians 2:6-10 Matthew 5:2-22a, 27-28, 33-34a, 37

A reading from the Gospel according to Matthew:

Jesus said to his disciples: "I tell you, unless your righteousness surpasses that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will not enter the kingdom of heaven.

"You have heard that it was said to your ancestors, *You shall not kill; and whoever kills will be liable to judgment.* But I say to you, whoever is angry with his brother will be liable to judgment.

"You have heard that it was said, *You shall not commit adultery*. But I say to you, everyone who looks at a woman with lust has already committed adultery with her in his heart.

"Again you have heard that it was said to your ancestors, *Do not take a false oath, but make good to the Lord all that you vow.* But I say to you, do not swear at all. Let your 'Yes' mean 'Yes,' and your 'No' mean 'No.' Anything more is from the evil one."

Focus Questions:

1) Recount some ripple effects you have seen when someone followed the law of love.

2) Name an experience when you broke from what was expected of you.

3) How seriously do you take today's Gospel? What do you find difficult?

Family and children's question:

How quick are you to forgive a person who hurts you?

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

In a memory recital of a Scripture passage, little Kathy's mind went blank. Her mother sitting in the front row, gestured, moved her lips, trying to form the words for her girl, but it did no good. Finally in desperation she whispered the opening phrase of the memorized scripture: "I am the light of the world." Immediately Kathy's face lit up and a with a smile she said with supreme confidence, "My mother is the light of the world."

We are God's image and can shine like God's light to the world and our "light shall break forth like the dawn."

Today's Gospel invites us to be salt of the earth and the light of the world. There is a very old Tamil proverb which says, "Without salt the food is tasteless and would be disposed in garbage." Salt is an important ingredient for the taste of the food. Jesus says, "if salt loses its taste, with what can it be seasoned? It is no longer good for anything but to be thrown out and trampled underfoot." Salt is not a food in itself but its essence makes the food tasty. It is impossible to eat salt as food, but the food would be flat and insipid without salt.

When Jesus says that we are the salt of the earth, he reminds us that we all carry within us the taste of God because we are created after God's image. If we live God's image which we carry within ourselves, we will taste like God. As salt makes the food tasty, we can bring into the humanity the taste of God and make the humanity taste like God. When we live selfishly projecting the life to be all about our selfish self, then we try to offer us as food to the society. It would be something like offering the salt as food. Salt is not food; it is important ingredient to it. It adds taste; it can preserve food. As salt we don't become food for the humanity but add God's taste to the food of the humanity.

The next image Jesus gives us is that "We are the light of the world." In darkness we can see nothing. Light helps us see everything. As much as the light helps us clearly see everything, the light itself cannot be seen. With dark glass the sun can be seen as the source of light but the light itself that travels from the sun to illuminate the object can never be seen. You and I are light to illuminate. We are sent from the source, God to shine upon the other humans as God-sent light. We will be invisible like the light and can help people see God as the source of our light.

Each of us comes out of God, the light. Our travel from God to the others is like that of the invisible light. Our aim is to shine on the other with God's light. Our shining on others is not to influence our values but to project on them God's values. In Jesus's words, our light must shine before others, that they may see our good deeds and glorify our heavenly Father. Our life can be a taste of God and the shining of God's glory on all.

Mother Teresa explains the same truth in a simple example of how electric power passes through the wires. "Often you see small and big wires, new and old, cheap and expensive lined up. Unless and until the current (electric power) passes through them there will be no light. The wire is you and me. The current is God. We have the power to let the current pass though us, use us and produce the light of the World, Jesus. Or we can refuse to be used and allow darkness to spread." Jesus says to us not to put out or hide our light. "Nor do they light a lamp and then put it under a bushel basket; it is set on a lampstand, where it gives light to all in the house. Just so, your light must shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your heavenly Father." Let us rise and shine."
