A reading from the Gospel according to Matthew:

Jesus said to his disciples: "You have heard that it was said, *An eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth.* But I say to you, offer no resistance to one who is evil. When someone strikes you on your right cheek, turn the other one as well. If anyone wants to go to law with you over your tunic, hand over your cloak as well. Should anyone press you into service for one mile, go for two miles. Give to the one who asks of you, and do not turn your back on one who wants to borrow.

"You have heard that it was said, *You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy.* But I say to you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, that you may be children of your heavenly Father, for he makes his sun rise on the bad and the good, and causes rain to fall on the just and the unjust. For if you love those who love you, what recompense will you have? Do not the tax collectors do the same? And if you greet your brothers only, what is unusual about that? Do not the pagans do the same? So be perfect, just as your heavenly Father is perfect."

Focus Questions:

- 1) When did you go the extra mile?
- 2) Describe an experience when you felt injured by someone and you struggled to love that person after.
- 3) Relate a time when you freely gave yourself to others.

Family and children's question:

Relate a time when you did a good deed for someone not expecting to be thanked or noticed for what you did.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

When wine was outlawed, boot leggers began to press grape concentrate into the form of bricks, which wasn't against the law. On the label this warning was printed: "Do not let this brick sit in a gallon of water for 21 days. It will ferment and become illegal wine." What a subtle way of selling the illegal alcohol in a "legal way!" What shall we say about this? Were they illegally legal or legally illegal? Does this mean that the law is weakly framed with loopholes, or the humans are so cunning to transgress the law in the pretension of observing it?

In today's Gospel Jesus speaks about Law. The purpose of any Law is that all everyone in society can live and enjoy the best that life can offer to them. The goal of the Law is to secure and protect life in its best possibility to all. But no law is perfect and wholesome. Each law is weak and has its own loophole. If the law is not observed for its purpose, it can be easily mis-handled in its loophole. That is why Jesus says, "Do not think that I have come to abolish the law or the prophets. I have come not to abolish but to fulfill."

Jesus asks us not to merely observe the law but to fulfill it. He asks us not to do but to live what the law commands. Though the Law stipulates to do or to avoid an action, its aim is to make its meaning alive in its observance. The purpose of the law is not to burden us with its mandate to do or avoid an action, but to liberate us to live a life fully alive and meaningful both for us and others. When Jesus says that He would not abolish the law but fulfill it He means that Jesus would empower His believers to live the meaning (purpose) of the Law. His message is not to oppress them with the burden of observing the laws but to free their inner vision and power to live richly their lives in all its aspects by observing the Law.

Jesus then continues to explain with examples how the Law was burdening in the past and how He makes it a life-giving source. He does not limit a law to its functional aspect of what one should do or should not do. He rather invites us to live the Law for its original life-giving purpose. He takes for example the law of murder. The law mandates "*You shall not kill; and whoever kills will be liable to judgment.*"

The act of "Killing" is only the final violent expression of murdering a person. But it actually began when a person was angry or uttered curses against that person. So, the right way of observing the law of "You shall not kill", is to stop the negative thought and words against others and start to develop a positive attitude towards the others. Jesus explains this by giving an example of how to preemptively reconcile with the others and start loving them. "Therefore, if you bring your gift to the altar, and there recall that your brother has anything against you, leave your gift there at the altar, go first and be reconciled with your brother, and then come and offer your gift."

Today's Gospel presents us with Jesus's explanations of few other laws on adultery and swearing. We are invited to observe the laws in Jesus's way of freeing us from the burdens of the law. Let us try with the mind of Jesus to live the law with its life-giving- intentions. When we read today's Gospel, at the outset Jesus's words would sound making the laws more demanding and impossible to observe them. But when we take time to meditate His words, Jesus will make us realize how the Law is here not to burden but to liberate our life-giving energies from within. Let us allow the words of Jesus to empower us not merely to observe the laws but fulfill them.




