

Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

March 5, 2023 **Second Sunday of Lent Genesis 12:1-4a** Psalm 33:4-5, 18-19, 20, 22 2 Timothy 1:8b-10 Matthew 17:1-9

A reading from the Gospel according to Matthew:

Jesus took Peter, James, and John his brother, and led them up a high mountain by themselves. And he was transfigured before them; his face shone like the sun and his clothes became white as light. And behold, Moses and Elijah appeared to them, conversing with him. Then Peter said to Jesus in reply. "Lord, it is good that we are here. If you wish, I will make three tents here, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." While he was still speaking, behold, a bright cloud cast a shadow over them, then from the cloud came a voice that said, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him." When the disciples heard this, they fell prostrate and were very much afraid. But Jesus came and touched them, saying, "Rise, and do not be afraid." And when the disciples raised their eyes, they saw no one else but Jesus alone.

As they were coming down from the mountain, Jesus charged them, "Do not tell the vision to anyone until the Son of Man has been raised from the dead."

Focus Ouestions:

- 1) How does your prayer life help you to listen to God?
- 2) How does your faith help you deal with disappointment or loss?
- 3) Describe a time when you had a "mountaintop" experience", time spent in nature, or a quiet moment in Church that moved you in a way you couldn't put into words.

Family and children's question:

How do you listen to the voice of Jesus as God commanded?

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

A school principal received a phone call. The voice said, "Thomas Bradley won't be in school today." The principal was a bit suspicious of the voice. He asked, "Who is speaking?" The voice came back, "My Father." Lies are the temporary and easy way of escaping from responsibility. A lie is a tempting offer to avoid personal responsibility of living the truth.

Readings of the First week of Lent invite us to face truth of who we are, and encourage us to boldly live our true worth. The first reading narrates how the serpent tricked (tempted) Eve and Adam. It is the story of how they fell away from the truth of who they are according to God and fell for the lie of the serpent suffering the loss of God-given identity. Temptation is a lie sold in the form of truth. Temptation would promise light but ends in darkness. But God's truth is light which would make us glow with light and life. The second reading invites us to change our way of life from following the First Adam – not to be deceived like Adam and Eve, by anything that would not help us live the full and whole truth of who we are according to God. It encourages us to follow the New Adam, Jesus who forgives our sins and offers life in abundance.

Gospel reading is the story of Jesus's temptations describing how Jesus refused to do what the tempter tempted Him to do. The first temptation of the tempter was to selfishly use His power to satisfy His hunger – to turn the stones into bread to appease His hunger. Jesus responded to the tempter that His standard of living is not to do the tempter's suggestion but to live God's will. Jesus answered to him, "One does not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes forth from the mouth of God."

The second temptation was to prove God's care for Jesus. Quoting a scripture passage to show how God cares, the tempter suggested Jesus to jump from the parapet of the temple to see if God would save Him. Jesus answered that He knows for sure who God is for Him and who He is for God. He neither requires any proof to know how much God cares for Him, nor would He put God to any test to demonstrate before others His relationship with God. The message of Jesus is this. When we don't know who we are, anyone can challenge us and detract us from who we are. But when we surely know who we are, we don't need any proof from outside. We would start living who we are and would not waste time and energy to prove to others.

Thirdly the tempter tries with Jesus's personal authority – self-esteem. God created everything in and through Him. But the tempter promised to offer all the kingdoms of the world in their magnificence if he would prostrate and worship him. Jesus knows the value of the human self. He once said, "For what will it profit a man if he gains the whole world and forfeits his soul? Or what shall a man give in return for his soul?" (Matthew 16:26). Humans are worth more than anything in the whole world. when the tempter challenged Jesus's self-esteem (worth) He stopped reasoning with him. He threw away the tempter, "Get away, Satan!" then, He declares His God-given worth saying to the tempter, "The Lord, your God, shall I worship and him alone shall I serve."

Every temptation is not simply an attempt on our desire to do something bad or evil; it is primarily an attack on our Good-Self. Tempter challenges our self-worth of who we are and who we can be. Tempting moments are the occasions when we are tricked to sell our self-truth to something less than our self-worth. Temptations can create in us forceful emotions to pull us down from our strength of doing better things. At times we can reason out with the tempter like Jesus did at the first and second temptation. But there are moments when our self-worth is put to the test. We have to wake up and just realize like Jesus did. We have to stop all kinds of reasonings or justifications and just remove ourselves from that place saying, "Get away, Satan!" Let us pray to God in the words of Jesus, "Lead us not into temptation; deliver us from the evil one. Amen"






