



Fr. Antony's Letter

Dear Friends,

Michelangelo was asked by his friend, "How could he sculpture such master piece works out of rough rocks?" He answered, "I see in marble stones hidden sculptures inviting me to bring it out by my chisel." God is the excellent and skillful artist who can chisel out all the unwanted from us to bring out the best we can be. Within each of us is hidden the wonderful image of God. If we allow God, the Artist to work on us we will shine as God's wonderful work of art.

We begin the Holy Week with Palm Sunday. Holy Week commemorates the events that happened to Jesus during the last week of His earthly life. Palm Sunday celebrates how people saw Jesus as their Messiah entering the city of Jerusalem. Holy Thursday is the Last Supper in which Jesus offered his presence in the form of Bread and Wine – the Eucharist. Good Friday, Jesus died on the Cross expressing God's incredible love for us. Holy Saturday evening we will celebrate the vigil of Jesus' Resurrection from death.

The events of the Holy Week show us how God chiseled the best sculpture in Jesus. In Jesus God reveals to us how God can chisel the best out of each one of us if we too allow ourselves like Jesus did.

When we participate in the events of the Holy Week, we join ourselves with the suffering Jesus on His walk to Calvary, die with Him on the Cross, only to rise with Him and celebrate Easter with Him. Thus, we can become God's wonderful act of victory even over death. Holy Week encourages us, no more our sufferings to depress our life in misery, but our hope in the Resurrection of Jesus to revitalize our life in divine strength. As St. Paul says, 'if we die with Jesus we will rise with Jesus'. (2 Timothy 2:11)

I extend a personal Welcome to each of you to celebrate the mysteries of Holy Week. Let us journey with Jesus. We have something going on in our Church every day of the Holy Week. Please go through the Holy Week Schedule and allow yourselves to be chiseled by God for the best of you to come out as God's wonderful work of art.

Reconciliation Monday: Monday April 3rd is the Reconciliation Monday. Confessions will be heard from 3:00 pm to 9:00 pm in our Church and in all the Catholic Churches of our Diocese of Rockville Centre. Individual Confession cleanses and illumines the hearts to enter into the mystery of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday and Easter Sunday. All are welcome.

"The Way of the Cross with Mary". Our Choir has put lot of efforts and practiced this Spiritual Musical. Please don't fail to come. It is on Wednesday April 4th at 7:30 pm. It is a very nice way to start the Holy three days of the Holy Week.

Another moving way to enter into the somber mood of Good Friday is TENEBRAE, at 7:30pm which is the evening prayer celebrating the Redemptive death of Jesus with candles in the dark through the scriptures. Wish you all the blessings of the Holy Week. Come let us walk with Jesus to Calvary and come out of our tombs.



Follow the instructions below to create your own palm cross!



Holding a palm strip with the curled edge toward you, fold up the widest end in a loop about 2" long.



Then fold the top piece downward until it covers the top of the previous fold and forms a loop about 2". Place a staple at the intersection.



Bend the thin end of the palm to the right, creasing on a diagonal line.



Fold the palm behind the cross, forming a loop about 1 1/2" on the left. Secure in the center with another staple.



Continue the fold toward the front of the cross forming a loop 11/2" on the left. Secure it with another staple.



Wrap the remainder of the palm over the top-right angle of the cross, bringing it straight across the back and over the top-left angle to the front. Cross it diagonally to the bottom-right corner . . .



... straight across the back and bring it to the front from the bottom-left corner. Bring it from the bottom-left corner to the top-right corner and to the back again.



Weave the small remaining piece in the back under loops and tie it off. If needed, you can use another staple of a drop of glue.



Add dried flowers or a tiny bow.

The May of the Cross
