



Dear Friends,

Jim: I hear that there is a new remedy on the market for baldness.

Ken: Wow! Does it work?

Jim: Yes. "It's made of alum and persimmon juice. It doesn't grow hair, but it shrinks your head to fit what hair you have." It is not wise to shorten the feet to fit the shoes. Sadly, this is what happens whenever we want to prove something as true or false. When we try to establish truth based on provable evidence, we attempt to accommodate truth to the known facts. It is like customizing the truth to the facts we have. But truth in its nature is bigger than facts.

The sixth and last Sunday of the Easter Season brings home the message that Jesus is sending upon His disciples, the gift from God the Father, the Spirit of Truth, who would remain with them and would be in them. Truth is the revelation of the Spirit which starts from the believers' hearts. Truth is the Holy Spirit's personal relationship with the believer. Truth is the external manifestation of the inner perception/conviction of the Holy Spirit's revelation to the believer. Truth is not the product of putting together the external facts to arrive at a particular concept, but a living expression of inner conviction.

Jesus further says that the truth cannot be seen or known unless the Holy Spirit reveals it. Evidences can interpret an event in the way we want it to be understood and acknowledged. But the truth that the Holy Spirit reveals, empowers the believer to live what is revealed and to stand as a living witness of that revelation. The Holy Spirit does not show the believer evidence which can be manipulated according to the whims and fancies of the human agencies, but forms the believer as embodiment of Truth itself. Such a believer cannot but live and express the Truth, and Truth only. For such a believer, telling lies is to act against one's own self. This is how the Holy Spirit lives in the believer - revealing Truth and empowering them to live the Truth.

In this world which is pluralistic in ideas, philosophies, customs, habits, traditions, and ways of life, Truth is treated as subjective opinions. Truth is neither objective to be abstract and unconnected with everyday life nor subjective to become one's convenient and selfish opinion. Truth is a living harmony which brings together the best of everyone in order to realize the original joy of living as one human family in harmony with the universe...May this Truth liberate us from our selfish prisons and create a life living harmoniously in joy and beauty.

Ascension Thursday

Ascension Thursday, a Holy Day of Obligation, commemorates the ascension of Jesus Christ to the right hand of the Father 40 days after the Resurrection! This year we celebrate this Feast Day on Thursday, May 18th 2023.

St. Augustine's work appears to be the first written evidence of the observance of the feast day on Ascension Thursday, although he traces its origin to the apostles. John Chrysostom, Gregory of Nyssa, and the Constitution of the Apostles also make reference to the feast.

The Feast of the Ascension is one of the ecumenical feasts, celebrated by many Christian churches. In various faiths and provinces, the date of observation varies.




