Fr. Antony's Letter

Dear Friends,

Sally says to Charlie Brown, "We have to write a short piece for school that expresses our professional philosophy. So far I've written, 'who cares?' and 'Forget it.'" Charlie Brown says, "How about 'Why me?'" Sally says, "That's good, I'll fit it in." Every one of us has our own philosophy which becomes the meaning and the driving force in our life. We may not formally code our own philosophy or be consciously aware of it in our daily actions and thought patterns, but it works within us and shapes our style of living.

Today is the last (Seventh) Sunday of Easter Time. Last Thursday we celebrated the Solemn Feast of The Ascension. Jesus left us for Heaven, promising to be with His Church, to guide and govern it through the power and Wisdom of the Holy Spirit which He would send upon us next Sunday, Pentecost. So, what is the philosophy of the Church? – What is that specific philosophy that shapes us and shows us to the world as a community of believers called the Church? How does that philosophy continue to be a guiding principle and living force in this community called the Church?

The first reading describes what did the believers in Christ do after Jesus's Ascension. "After Jesus had been taken up to heaven the apostles returned to Jerusalem All these devoted themselves with one accord to prayer, together with some women, and Mary the mother of Jesus, and his brothers" This is the model and the living mode of the church as a group of believers in Jesus Christ. They were both men and women who 'together, devoted themselves in one accord' in 'prayer'.

Believers were a human group bound by devotion and prayer. Devotion is the attitude that kept them together. Prayer provided them the power and guidance from God. The human gathering as a Church must have both devotion and prayer as an essential character/philosophy to hold them together and grow. The group does its best by being devoted to each other while God accomplishes in them God's best in them through their prayers.

In the second reading Peter defines the follower of Christ as the one who suffers for others and never inflicts suffering on others. It is a negative way of saying the positive truth of the Christian way of life. The individual Christian or Christian community exists as a locus and occasion where God's glory is revealed in exultant Joy at any cost. It will bear anything and do everything so that joy in the Risen Lord becomes its way of life.

The Gospel takes the believers into deeper Spiritual reality that the Church is called to live. Jesus has ascended to heaven and no longer is in the world, but His disciples (believers) are in the world. As we heard in last Sunday's Gospel, He will not leave the Church orphaned. He promised the Church and wants the church to be consciously aware that HE is in the Father and His believers are in Him and He is in believers. Jesus further explains that He accomplished the mission (work) given to Him by the Father, and the Church is called to accomplish the mission that Jesus entrusts to the church.

The church is the continuation of Jesus's work in the world. Its philosophy is the living presence of Jesus among the believers. Its power is to love all as Jesus loved. Its wisdom and strength are the indwelling Holy Spirit. Its only goal is to realize and reveal the Kingdom of God in its everyday living. As we prepare for the Feast of Pentecost, that is on next Sunday, let us pray the whole week for the Holy Spirit to come upon each of us and the whole church to enlighten and empower us.

face of the earth.



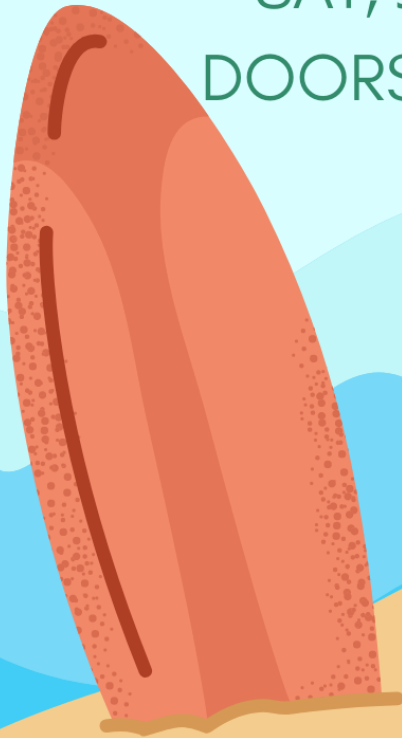

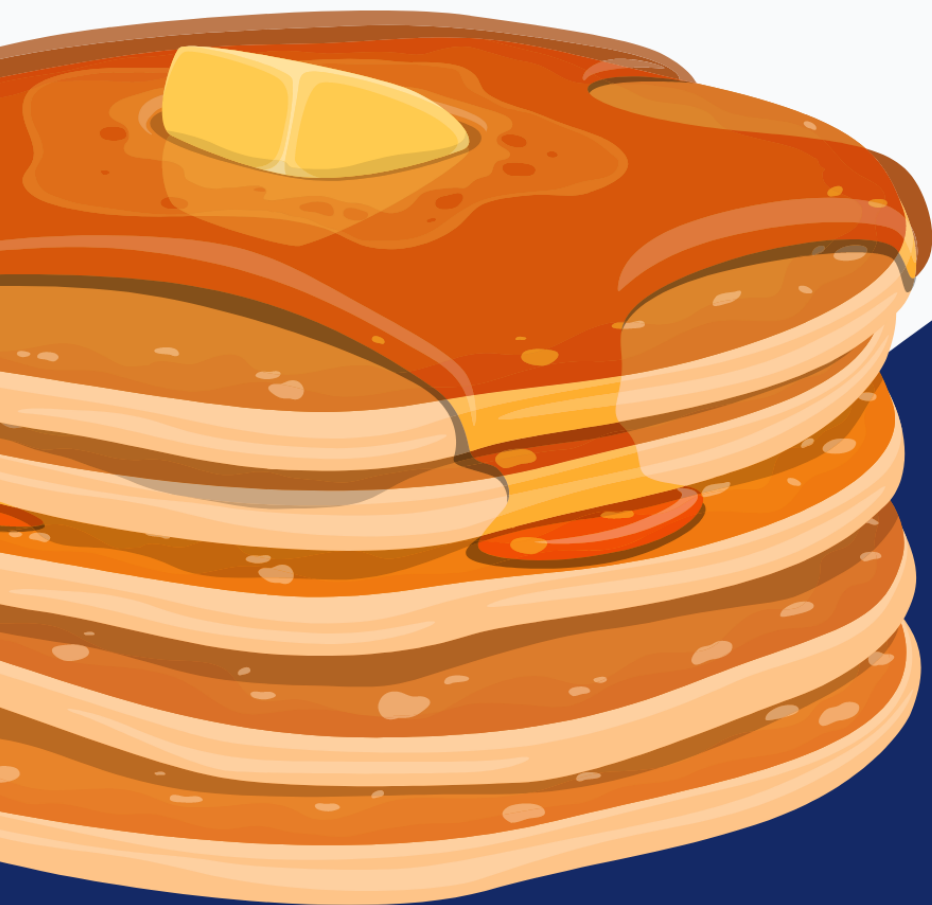
