Fr. Antony's Letter

Dear Friends,

The boy and the girl believed that they were in love and wished to grow intimate. One day the boy said to the girl, "Let us live! Let us love! Let us share the deepest secrets of our souls! You go first." True Love allows no secret between lover and the beloved. True Love blossoms in self-revelation; in giving unconditionally and expecting nothing.

Today is the Feast of The Holy Trinity. Holy Trinity is not a logical concept or theological explanation of God, but the experiential love that exceeds all human logic and theological explanation. Love alone can give a taste and glimpse of the truth about God. The unsurpassable reality of God can be grasped only through love, because God reveals in creation as the Father who provides and as the Mother who sustains.

Trinity is the mystery of how God treats a world that is becoming messy with hatred and violence, war and destructions. God was not reactive to the world, by punishing it for all the sins and failures it committed. Rather God, the Father who created it began to love it even more to set it right. God, the loving Father so loved our world and sent His only son Jesus to save it. God turned the course of our human history by forgiving our sins and failures through the death and resurrection of His Son. Then, by sending the Holy Spirit upon the humans, God empowers each of us to walk in the Way and the Truth His Son Jesus taught us, so that we may always live with God eternally.

Holy Trinity is one God, not three different Gods, but one God. Holy Trinity is three persons in the sense that this God reveals himself to us as God the Creator, as God the Savior in Jesus, and as God the gift of Love in the Holy Spirit. Their oneness can be experienced in love and cannot be explained in human intellectual terms. Love exceeds all reason and sets in us a state of relating to God for who God is and offering to God all what we are. This way of knowing God through love is the way of living our life in its fullness. Since we are created by God after God's image, our life will become real only when we love God as God loves us. Love is the fulfillment of love. The feast of the Trinity invites us to live by love. Our life is nothing but a simple act of loving God and loving all that God has given us, the people and the whole creation.

This weekend is our Parish Feast - the Feast of our Parish Patron St. Thomas More. For the last seven days we prayed for the whole parish in a special Novena to our patron for all our intentions. May St. Thomas More bless and intercede for each of us and all our families, to grow in grace and peace. The Knights of Columbus are hosting a pancake breakfast after the masses on Sunday. We are all invited. Just \$3 per person. Please come and celebrate with our Parish Family of St. Thomas More.

His Presence Is Real - Reflections on the Eucharist by Deacon Matt

The National Eucharistic Revival

Next Sunday begins the second phase of a three year National Eucharistic Revival in our Church. Perhaps you are surprised that we are already one year into this revival?! So let's step back a moment and see what this is all about (and why I am writing this column in our bulletin). In 2019 a survey done by the Pew Research Center found that of those who responded and described themselves as Catholics, only one third said they personally believed the bread and wine truly become the Body and Blood of Jesus at Mass (the rest believed it was only symbolic). The bishops of the United States felt that something needed to be done to help more people align with a core Catholic tenet of our faith, and to help all of us become closer to Jesus through the Eucharist. And so this three-year program was devised.

Year One (the "diocesan year") began on the feast of Corpus Christi last year. Each diocese in the U.S. was asked to design certain programs to begin to help the faithful on their journey to a better appreciation of the Eucharist. And now, next Sunday, we enter probably the most important phase: the year of the parish. Every

parish in our diocese will have a liaison to work with Auxiliary Bishop Andrzej Zglejszewski (I'm honored to have been asked). There will be many special events ahead for our parish that you'll hear about. And Fr. Antony has asked me to write a column in the bulletin each week on some aspect of the Eucharist. So, over the next year, I'll be sharing information about the Eucharist from various perspectives: theology, liturgy, catechism, Church history, practice, and much more. Please see elsewhere in this bulletin information about a very special event taking place next Sunday, a Eucharistic Procession, and make every effort to try to participate - you won't regret it.







FEAST OF ST. THOMAS MORE

Thomas More was born in London in 1478 and studied to become a lawyer. Recognized for his great intelligence, impartiality, and wisdom, he rose through the ranks of Parliament and earned King Henry VIII's favor. until he became Lord Chancellor in 1529. He resigned the chancellorship three years later, however, when he was unable to support Henry's divorce of Catherine of Aragon and marriage to Anne Boleyn. In 1535, he was convicted of treason and beheaded, and four hundred years later, he was canonized.

St Thomas More's feast day is June 22nd and he is the patron saint of adopted children, lawyers, civil servants, politicians and difficult marriages.


SUN JUNE 11TH, AFTER 11:30 MASS


