At the sight of the crowds, Jesus' heart was moved with pity for them because they were troubled and abandoned, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest." Then he summoned his twelve disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits to drive them out and to cure every disease and every illness. The names of the twelve apostles are these: first, Simon called Peter, and his brother Andrew; James, the son of Zebedee, and his brother John; Philip and Bartholomew, Thomas and Matthew the tax collector; James, the son of Alphaeus, and Thaddeus; Simon from Cana, and Judas Iscariot who betrayed him.

Jesus sent out these twelve after instructing them thus, "Do not go into pagan territory or enter a Samaritan town. Go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. As you go, make this proclamation: The kingdom of heaven is at hand.' Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse lepers, drive out demons. Without cost you have received; without cost you are to give."

Fr. Antony's Letter

Dear Friends,

A little boy was working hard on a drawing and his daddy asked him what he was doing. The son replied, "Drawing a picture of God". His daddy said, "You can't do that, honey. Nobody knows what God looks like." But the little boy was undeterred. He said, "They will in a few minutes when I finish drawing it."

Jesus is Emmanuel which means "God with us." He was God's incarnation. But He did not leave his picture that we might know what He looked like. Artists through the centuries have drawn pictures of Jesus from their imagination or models. Some have tried to rework the image of Jesus from the facial impression of the man in the Shroud of Turin. Jesus did not leave anything physical (biological) to represent his memory. But in His Last Supper with His disciples on Holy Thursday, "He took the bread and said, "This is my body... do this in memory of me." He took the Chalice of wine and said, "This is my blood... do this in memory of me."

The Feast of Corpus Christi is celebrated this Sunday. 'Corpus Christi', these two Latin words mean 'The Body and Blood of Christ'. In every Mass we celebrate the memory of Jesus and his presence in the form of Bread and Wine. Jesus offers himself in the form of food. The food we eat becomes part of our body. In the same way, Jesus, whom we take in the form of Bread and Wine becomes one with us. When we eat Christ's body in the form of bread, we the humans become of God and of the body of Christ.

In the Gospel today, Jesus explains what will happen to those who eat Jesus in the bread. "Whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world." In consuming Jesus in the bread, we become nourished not only in the life we live here on earth, but also for eternal life. Jesus' offering Himself as food first nourishes the believers. The more we eat Jesus's body, the more we become like Him. Jesus's food will assimilate into us and transform us into His body. As His body, we will be sent by God to share ourselves with others just as Jesus shares Himself with us. God will offer us the body of Christ as food for others. We become Corpus Christi to others by eating the Corpus Christi. We will become the bread that Jesus would give as His flesh for the life of the world.

What is a Eucharistic Congress? A Eucharistic Congress is an especially powerful manifestation of the unity of the Church, where a large number of Catholics gather to worship Our Lord in the Eucharist through the communal celebration of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. These gatherings reaffirm and re-emphasize the source and summit of our faith, putting Jesus where he belongs—at the center.

From July 17 to 21, 2024, the Church will gather as one American family for a Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis. Together we will ask the Holy Spirit to revive our love of the Eucharist, breathing his life into our dry bones. Let us get ready for this historic moment of revival, where God has particular grace planned for US. Our life—and our Church—will never be the same. Let us pray for the success of the Eucharistic Congress.

His Presence Is Real - Reflections on the Eucharist by Deacon Matt

Corpus Christi

It is fitting that the second year of our three-year National Eucharistic Revival begins today on the Feast of Corpus Christi. How did this feast come about?

In the year 1246, the bishop of Liège, Robert de Torote, directed this feast be observed in his diocese. He was persuaded to do so by St. Juliana, who was the prioress of Mont Cornillon, which was near Liège, and who had visions of this feast. Fifteen years later, Jacques Pantaléon, the archbishop of Liège, became pope and took the name Urban IV. In 1264 he directed the entire Church to observe the feast. It took until about the middle of the 1300s for the feast to be accepted world wide, and by the 1400s it had become one of the principal feasts of the Church. As its Latin name implies, today we celebrate the Body and Blood of Christ. We believe Christ is truly present (the "Real Presence") in the Eucharist. This is a fundamental doctrine of the Catholic Church which has been taught since the time of the Apostles.



The Eucharistic Procession is a devotion that goes back to those early years of the feast. It gives us an opportunity to move with Jesus, representing the journey we are on with him in our lives. It shows that Jesus is present among us out in the world, and we, the baptized, are called to bring him to others. We will celebrate such a procession today!

Thus, in the Feast of Corpus Christi, we celebrate our Savior's closeness to us. He gives us the gift of himself in the Eucharist, and we become most intimately joined to him in Holy Communion. How blessed indeed we are that Jesus loves us so much that he would do this for us.

"How holy this feast in which Christ is our food; his passion is recalled; grace fills our hearts; and we receive a pledge of the glory to come, alleluia." - Liturgy of the Hours, Corpus Christi, Evening Prayer, Antiphon of the Canticle of Mary

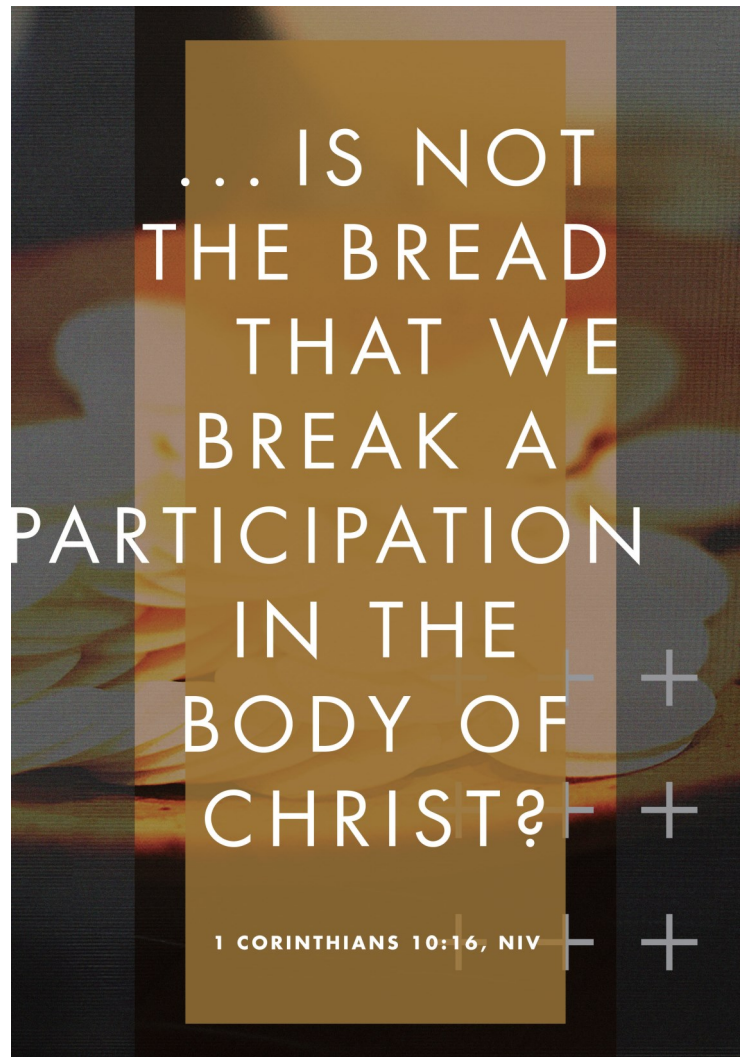

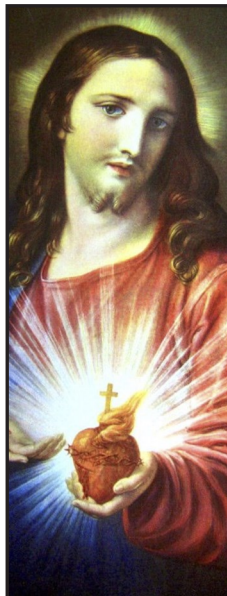

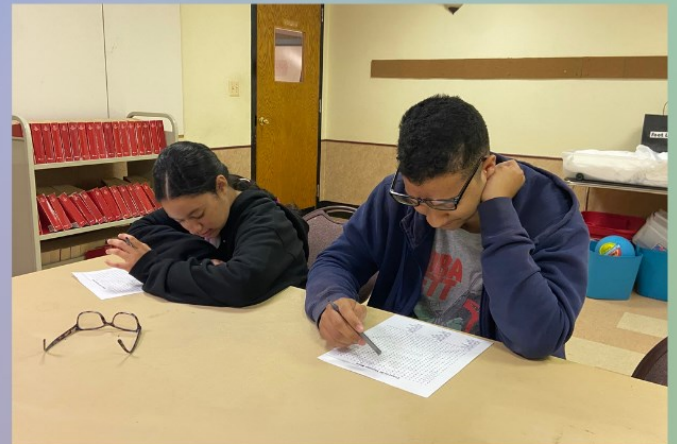

Council Scholarship Application

Who is eligible? All current graduating high school seniors who are members of the St. Thomas More Parish

How will the winner be selected? The winner will be selected by the Grand Knight and a committee comprised of officers of the council. The winner will be notified by the end of June.
