# Fr. Antony's Letter

Dear Friends,

**A little girl invited her friend over to her house to play.** When her friend said that she needed to use the bathroom the little girl led her to the one her parents used, and then pointed to the scale in the corner. "Whatever you do," cautioned the little girl, "don't step on that thing!"

"Why not?" asked her friend.

"I don't know," replied the little girl, "All I know is that whenever my mom gets on it, she starts screaming like mad."

**The scale shows how much we weigh** – the right number, nothing more or nothing less. It performs just its function. It does not care if we are happy or upset. We too will be exactly like a machine when we perform functions without meaning, or act without love, or live without the right relationship with others. But let us not forget; our heart can transform us from being machines to becoming lively humans.

**Especially in our act of forgiving,** we can clearly perceive the power of the heart to transform our life. Our brain will find reasons for how right it is to punish the wrong. Our Body will remind the hurtful pain to hold on to the grudge. It is our heart that alone has the power to overrule the brain and body and can freely give the gift of forgiveness. The real power of the heart is forgiveness which can empower us to bear the burden of reasons and heal us from the painful hurts of body.

**In today's Gospel, Jesus invites us to learn from Him, the power of the heart.** It is neither easy for the mind to accept a yoke easily, nor for the body to bear its burden lightly. But Jesus promises that His meek and humble heart will make our yoke easy and our burden light. May all our worships and prayers be the moments of learning from Jesus' heart to live the power of our heart. May the power of our heart transform us. Let us try to make our yoke easy and burden light from the strength of the heart which is greater than that of the reason and body. Let us pray our traditional prayer every day to the Sacred Heart, "Jesus, meek and humble of HEART make my heart unto thine."

# His Presence Is Real - Reflections on the Eucharist by Deacon Matt

## St. Cyril of Jerusalem

One aspect of the Eucharist we'll touch on from time to time in this bulletin series are the saints who are particularly associated with the Eucharist. One of the most important of these is St. Cyril of Jerusalem. St. Cyril comes from an era of the Church known as the Patristic Period. This was the first four centuries of the Church, when the Fathers of the Church laid the initial groundwork for doctrine and theology that carries us forward to this day.

St. Cyril was born around the year 315 in Jerusalem. He was eventually named bishop of Jerusalem in 350 and died in the year 386. His feast day in the Catholic Church is celebrated on March 18. In his younger years, after becoming a priest, he was asked to begin to instruct catechumens (those who are not yet baptized) to prepare them to receive the Sacraments of Initiation. Some of the most powerful of these teachings concerned the Eucharist.

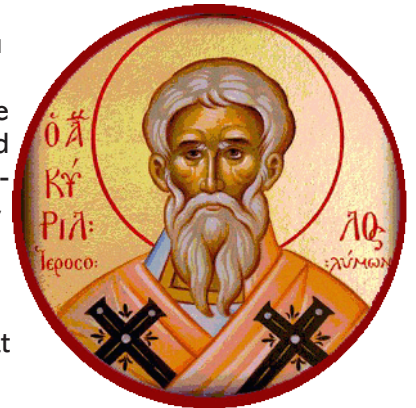
When it came to matters of theology, St. Cyril didn't really have many other teachers or works to fall back on. He simply had Scripture and only about 200 years of development of understanding of Christ and his teachings, as well as the inspiration of the Holy Spirit.

His teachings emphasized the Eucharist as Sacrifice, Communion and Real Presence in a clear and uncomplicated way. He supported the belief that a priest was given the power to confect the Eucharist during Mass.

In our prayers today, let us ask for the intercession of St. Cyril for all those who are the catechists and coordinators of our young students of the Eucharist. Let's also lift up in a prayer of thanksgiving all those who taught each of us to love and respect the True Presence of Jesus in Holy Communion, no matter how long ago.

"Wherefore with full assurance let us partake as of the Body and Blood of Christ: for in the figure of Bread is given to you His Body, and in the figure of Wine His Blood; that you by partaking of the Body and Blood of Christ, may be made of the same body and the same blood with Him." - *St. Cyril of Jerusalem, Catechetical Lecture 22, no. 3*

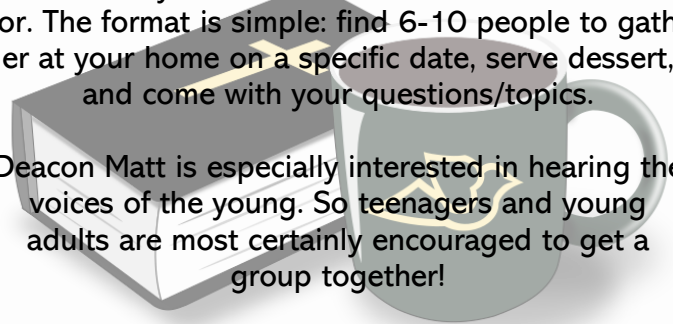
## This & That with Deacon Matt

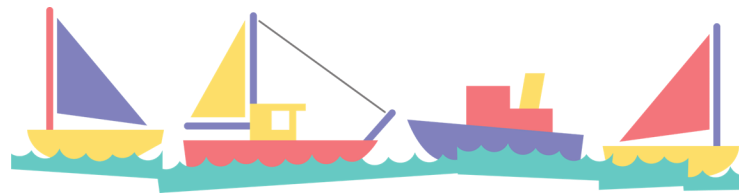
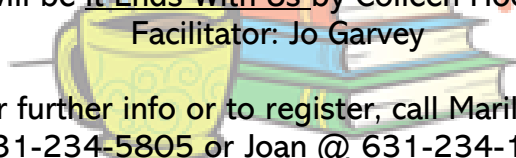
## Circle of Women

## Golf Outing Raffle!

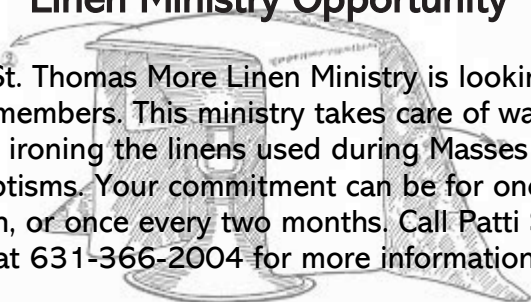
Raffle tickets for the Parish Golf Outing are now being sold after all masses. \$10 each, 3 for \$20, 9 for \$50. Please help support our parish.
