

#### Matthew 16:21-27 (Ordinary 22)

Jesus began to show his disciples that he must go to Jerusalem and suffer greatly from the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed and on the third day be raised. Then Peter took Jesus aside and began to rebuke him, "God forbid, Lord! No such thing shall ever happen to you." He turned and said to Peter, "Get behind me, Satan! You are an obstacle to me. You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do."

Then Jesus said to his disciples, "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will find it. What profit would there be for one to gain the whole world and forfeit his life? Or what can one give in exchange for his life? For the Son of Man will come with his angels in his Father's glory, and then he will repay all according to his conduct."

#### Fr. Antony's Letter

Dear Friends.

Employee: I have been here eleven years doing three men's work for one man's pay. Now I want a raise. Boss: Well, I can't give you a raise but if you'll tell me who the other two men are, I will fire them. Everyone sees us as what we appear to be, few experience us as what we really are. Our actions or words can be understood or misunderstood by people depending on how well or ill they are in their relationship with us.

In the Gospel today Jesus wants to know how he has been received by the people and his own close disciples. The answer to His question "who do people say that the Son of Man is?" differs according to the extent of his words, and how his deeds have affected the people. People saw Jesus as one of the prophets. But Peter saw in Jesus something special. Peter's answer reflected that he saw Jesus the Messiah, the Anointed Son of God.

Jesus himself compliments Peter saying, "Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah. For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my heavenly Father." Peter was recognized by Jesus as the Blessed One because he has rightly understood God's revelation happening in Jesus. Peter's response to Jesus's question was not from his human understanding but from God's inspiration. His relationship with Jesus opened his heart to a higher understanding of Jesus. His understanding of Jesus is not merely the fruit of his human thinking, but more so that of God's revelation.

How do we approach Jesus? Or what do we make of Him? Is our belief in Jesus the fruit of what our human mind made of Him? Or is our faith in Jesus built upon what we have read about Him in Gospels or some books? Do we open our heart like Peter for what God can reveal to us about who Jesus is? Or is Jesus the one we invented? Is Jesus the revelation of God, or the product of human thoughts? Is He tailored to suit our convenient philosophy?

Do we believe in Jesus as the God-given gift? Or is Jesus just a human being who lived two millennia back? Is Jesus just a role model who showed how one should love God and each other? Or is He God's presence incarnated as a human person who lived among us, so that we can live in God's presence and can be empowered as His disciples to build God's kingdom among us? Let us be like Peter and acknowledge God's revelation coming to us in Jesus.

#### His Presence Is Real - Reflections on the Eucharist by Deacon Matt

#### The Mass: Liturgy of the Word Part II

We continue our examination of the second section of the Mass, The Liturgy of the Word. In general, the First Reading during Sunday Mass comes from the Old Testament. The exception to this is during the Easter Season, where we hear from the Acts of the Apostles as the Church begins to take form and spread.

You might think the Old Testament really has no relevance in Mass. Hasn't it been superseded by the New Testament? Isn't "New" better than "Old"? No, it is absolutely essential to hear from the Old Testament. Even though the Old Testament covers the time before the birth of Christ, God still

speaks to us through the sacred Old Testament Scriptures, just as he does in the New.

A good place to start our understanding of this is to consider this famous quote about the Bible from St. Augustine: "The New Testament is in the Old concealed; the Old Testament is in the New revealed." This means that the Old Testament functions as a prophetic vision of God's ultimate plan for our salvation: that the history of God's people,

beginning with the first chosen ones, the Jewish people, would climax in the birth, death, resurrection and ascension of the Messiah, Jesus Christ.

The design of the readings at Mass each Sunday centers around the Gospel passage. The Church chose each Sunday's Old Testament reading based on the principal of harmony. That first reading in some way is connected to the Gospel passage. Usually some event or teaching in that Old Testament passage prefigures the day's Gospel reading. We therefore are led to a better understanding of God, Jesus and the Eucharist by being directed through that first reading. Therefore, let's commit ourselves to a deeper appreciation of the first reading we hear at each and every Mass.

"The Old Testament was deliberately so oriented that it should prepare for and declare in prophecy the coming of Christ." - Catechism of the Catholic Church, no. 122 (cf. Dei Verbum, no. 15)

# Saints of August



Feast Day: August 1st
Doctor of the Church
Bishop of Sant'Agata de' Goti
Patron: Arthritis, Lawyers, Confessors

Founded the Redemptorists (religious order), educated as a lawyer.

Considered one of the most widely read Catholic Authors



Feast Day: August 10th
Deacon and Martyr
First Archdeacon of Rome
Patron: Archivists, Librarians

Distributed riches of Church to the poor, rather than turn them over to Roman Empire. Baptized fellow prisoners after arrest.



Feast Day: August 21st
Pope and Traditionalist
Bishop of Rome
Patron: First Communicants

Pope from 1903 to 1914. Promoted daily eucharist, and lowered the age for First Communion. Staunchly opposed to modernist philosophies.



Feast Day: August 4th Priest and Confessor Known as "Cure d'Ars" Patron: Parish Priests

Known for his radical spiritual transformation of the community in Ars, ardent devotee of BVM. Often spent 12-16 hrs hearing confessions



Feast Day: August 11th
Virgin
Founder: Order of Poor Ladies
Patron: Eye Disease

One of the first followers of Francis of Assisi, professed she would have no husband but Jesus Christ. Fought to keep her order's vows of poverty.



Feast Day: August 24th Apostle and Martyr aka Nathaniel Patron: Bookbinders

Reportedly went on mission to India, where he left the Gospel of Matthew.
Continued to Armenia with Jude
(Thaddeus) where he was martyred,





Feast Day: August 8th
Priest
Founder: Dominican Order

Founder: Dominican Order Patron: Astronomers, Natural Science

Sold his clothes and books to feed the hungry during famine. BVM gave him a rosary in a vision, his order promulgated the form of prayer.



Feast Day: August 14th
Priest and Martyr
Conventual Franciscan Friar
Patron: Prisoners, Journalists

Polish priest, turned his monastery into a hospital during WWII. Was sent to Auschwitz, where he volunteered to die in place of another.



Feast Day: August 28th
Doctor of the Church
Bishop of Hippo Regius
Patron: Brewers, Theologians

Considered an eminent early Church Father by Catholics and Protestants. Heavily influenced Western Christianity, help develop the just war theory.
