The beginning of the gospel of Jesus Christ the Son of God.

As it is written in Isaiah the prophet:
Behold, I am sending my messenger ahead of you; he will prepare your way. A voice of one crying out in the desert: "Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths." John the Baptist appeared in the desert proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. People of the whole Judean countryside and all the inhabitants of Jerusalem were going out to him and were being baptized by him in the Jordan River as they acknowledged their sins. John was clothed in camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist. He fed on locusts and wild honey. And this is what he proclaimed: "One mightier than I is coming after me. Fr. Antony's Letter

Dear Friends,

A man in a restaurant gently touched the arm of a man putting on an overcoat. "Excuse me," he said, "but do you happen to be Mr. Smith of Newport?"

"No. I'm not!" the man answered impatiently.

"Oh-er-well, you see, I am Mr. Smith of Newport, and that's his overcoat you are putting on."

Unless we stay awake, we may lose our identity either by taking the identity of the other or by losing our own.

This weekend we begin the Season of Advent, the time of preparation to welcome the birth of Jesus in our hearts and home. The readings of the First Sunday of Advent invite us to "Stay Awake! Be watchful! Be alert!"

As Christmas is fast approaching the great temptation is to run after sales and finish wrapping the gifts before December 24th. In this yearly rush we may forget to give quality time to refresh in us why we do what we do at this time of the year. Christmas is not about giving gifts but to realize what makes you give the gift. Advent is the time to experience what makes us choose the specific gifts we give to our family or friends. It is not the purse but something deep in our heart that makes us decide whatever we do and for whomever we do it for. Advent is the season to devote quality time to realizing and experiencing that something deep in our heart.

Let us try to find some quiet time during this busy season every day to recapitulate ourselves. While we plan what to give to others, allotting some quiet time every day for ourselves is to give our own selves back to us. If we don't allow this to happen within us, nothing and no one can make it happen for us. May all that we do be inspired from within us i.e., from our heart. Let's not be overwhelmed by the business and find ourselves tired and tensed or drained out and burnt out. Let not this Advent time be a repetition but a time to refresh our heart, an occasion to renew our relationships.

Advent Candles: As we are going to light an Advent candle each week, may it deepen in us the significance of this time and rightly prepare us to receive the blessings of Christmas, both in our hearts and homes. There are four candles on the Advent wreath. We will light a candle each week and thus increase the light from each candle every week. May the increasing light signify our growing more every day in realizing who we are and how we are getting ready to receive the biggest blessing of Christmas, Jesus among us. Let us 'stay awake' and not lose ourselves in the routine business.

December 8th is the Solemn Feast of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary. It is a Holy Day of Obligation. Vigil Mass on 12/7 at 7pm. On 12/8, Masses are at 9:00 am and 7:00 pm.

December 9th is the Christmas Tree Lighting after the 5:00pm Mass. Santa will join us at the Mass and make a special visit in Walden Hall for pictures with us. Food will be available for a nominal price.

His Presence Is Real - Reflections on the Eucharist by Deacon Matt

Non-Catholic Christians & The Eucharist

A question often arises about the Eucharist of our brothers and sisters of the Christian faith who are not Catholic. There is a similar question about our fellow Christians and their participation in the Catholic Mass. This can be a delicate matter.

As Catholics we are committed to the one Church, established by Christ. All of us who were baptized validly (with water and the invocation of the names of the persons of the Trinity, exactly as in *Matthew 28:19*) are members of the Church. However, as you will recall from last week's column, there is sadly a division over certain aspects of our faith and Church hierarchy, and this spills over into an understanding of the Eucharist and the Real Presence of Jesus.

As most of us realize, we request our Christian brethren to refrain from partaking in the Eucharist at a Catholic Mass. This is done out of respect for our belief in the Real Presence and our acknowledgment of the differences that exist in our doctrines. We are happy,



however, to have persons of all faiths, especially fellow Christians, to worship with us at Mass.

There is no restriction on our attendance at services in Christian houses of worship (please note, of course, that this is not a substitute for the obligation to attend Mass each Sunday). However, the Catholic Church forbids us to partake in the Eucharist at these services for exactly the same reason as the prior paragraph. It is disrespectful for us to do so. There is no problem participating in prayers, psalms and hymns that are not contradictory to the Catholic faith.

Despite these differences in our understanding of the Eucharist, let us continue to commit ourselves to and pray for unity among all Christians, united in the one Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

"Catholic ministers may lawfully administer the sacraments only to catholic members of Christ's faithful, who equally may lawfully receive them only from catholic ministers." - *Code of Canon Law, No. 844, Section 1*
