John 20:19-31 (Easter 2)

On the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord.

Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained."

Thomas, called Didymus, one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples said to him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nailmarks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe."

Now a week later his disciples were again inside and Thomas was with them. Jesus came, although the doors were locked, and stood in their midst and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe." Thomas answered and said to him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed."

Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples that are not written in this book. But these are written that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that through this belief you may have life in his name.

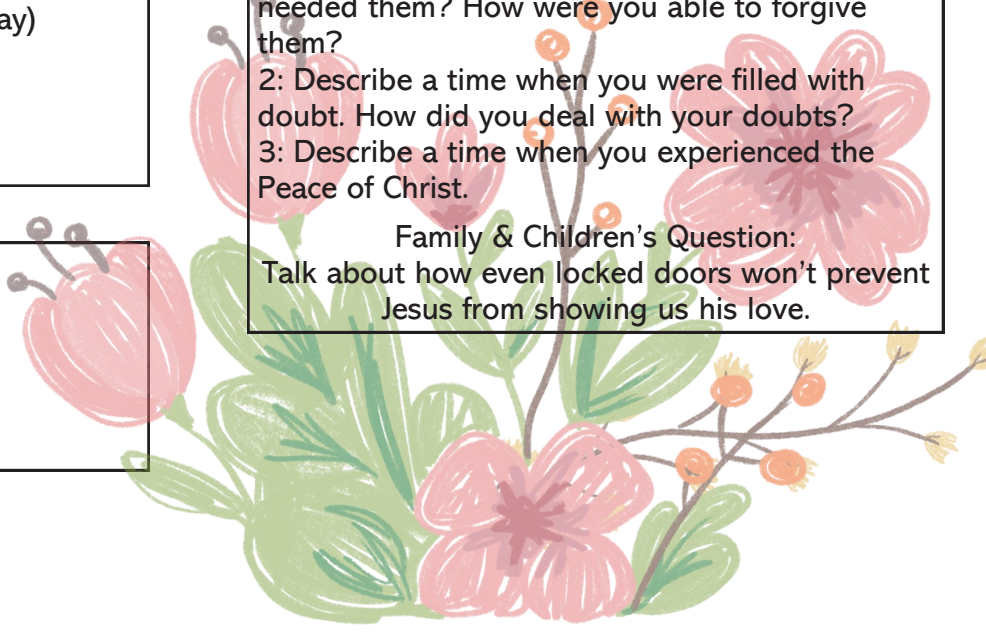

Fr. Antony's Letter

Dear Friends,

Jesus is Risen! Halleluiah!! Blessed Easter!!!

On the Sunday morning of the first Easter, as we read in today's Gospel, the women went to the tomb with the spices to embalm the dead body of Jesus. (Because they entombed the body of Jesus hurriedly on Good Friday without proper embalming). They did not expect the tomb of Jesus to be open and his body missing. The tomb was bare and empty – an empty tomb. They saw a young man (angel) inside the tomb who explained why the tomb was empty and wide open. Yes, Jesus is Risen!

Faith is the key to experience the risen Jesus. The one who believes will see the risen one and feel His presence. Faith is seeing with the heart. When all that the eyes see is darkness, the heart sees the light with faith. The resurrection stories of the four Gospels reiterate that those who believed in the risen presence of Jesus saw Him and experienced His glorious presence. The heart believed in the resurrection of Jesus and the eyes saw the risen Jesus. Risen Jesus appeared only to those who believed in him. The risen Jesus did not appear to those like the pharisees, scribes, or priests who refused to believe in the resurrection.

Faith is the key which makes the experience of the resurrection available to us. Those who believe in the resurrection of Jesus become the people of the resurrection. We who celebrate Easter are the people of the resurrection. We are called to live by faith. We live in hope. Look at the bulbs we buried in the fall. We buried them with faith. We hoped and waited through the winter. Our faith and hope did not go in vain. They all spring up to new life now in the changing of seasons. Some are already blooming!

Easter, the feast of the resurrection of Our Lord affirms that what we see in nature can happen to us. We too can become like the bulbs, to be buried in order not to decay as dust, but to rise and bloom with heavenly glory. For those who believe, what happened in Jesus will happen in his believers. **HAPPY EASTER TO EACH AND EVERYONE OF OUR FAMILY OF ST. THOMAS MORE!** May the blessings of the risen Christ bring newness in our lives and relationships.

My heartfelt thanks to all those who worked with heart and soul to make our Holy Week, Easter Vigil, and Easter Sunday a great spiritual and faith-filled experience of the mysteries of our faith. Those who decorated the Church and altar, various ministers who served in the liturgies both on and behind the scenes, and those who helped with their time, talent, and treasure. Thanks to the Choir for elevating the liturgical ceremonies to meaningful and joyful celebration as they always do. Thanks to the volunteers of our Outreach Program and Food Pantry, who through your generosity provided food and gift cards to over 60 needy families, as well as Easter Baskets for the children. God bless you all. Thank you, the family of St. Thomas More for your support.

His Presence Is Real - Reflections on the Eucharist by Deacon Matt

Easter and the Eucharist

A blessed and joyous Easter to one and all! He is truly risen! How appropriate it is today to look at the connection between the great feast we celebrate today and the sacrament of Jesus in the Eucharist.

We can say with certainty that the risen Jesus is the Eucharist. How truly profound it is to know that the Resurrection isn't celebrated on just one day of the year. Indeed every time we partake in the Eucharist, the Resurrection continues before our very eyes.

Easter is by its nature a Eucharistic feast. In both Easter and the Eucharist we celebrate the belief that Jesus is present to us in ways that he could not be before he died for us on the Cross. Easter and the Eucharist are intimately linked together.

In the Eucharist, we receive the Real Presence of Christ. But isn't it also true that in Holy Communion, Christ also receives us? He does this so we may be transformed in love. Everything about us is received: our joys, sorrows, pains, sins, sufferings and hopes. Those things



in our lives that are dark and negative are put to death, while those aspects of our life meant to be preserved are brought to new life. Isn't this what Jesus first did on the Cross at Calvary? And isn't this what Christ did first by rising from the dead on that first Easter Sunday?

It is fitting, therefore, that the Church requires us to receive Holy Communion at least once a year, during the Easter season. All Christian hope is rooted in the Resurrection. That hope continues in the Sacrament of the Eucharist. In both, we have the assurance of the presence of the Lord, now and in the life to come. May we celebrate the glorious Resurrection of our Lord each and every time we partake in his Real Presence during Holy Communion.

“Communion with the flesh of the risen Christ, a flesh ‘given life and giving life through the Holy Spirit,’ (*Presbyterorum ordinis*, no. 5) preserves, increases, and renews the life of grace received at Baptism.” – *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, no. 1392.

Liturgical Minister Training- Spring 2024

The Diocese of Rockville Center will offer training in Spanish and English for those who wish to serve as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion and Lectors. No walk-ins permitted, all participants must be registered in advance with a letter from their pastor.

Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion: Part A - This training is required for **all** those who are beginning as Ministers. This “BASIC” training is required for **all** Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. Those who wish to minister in hospitals, nursing homes and to the homebound are required to attend Part B training in addition to BASIC training. One **must** attend Part A training prior to Part B training. A **Lector Workshop** is available for both new and experienced lectors.
