


John 15:11b-19 (Easter 7)

Lifting up his eyes to heaven, Jesus prayed saying: "Holy Father, keep them in your name that you have given me, so that they may be one just as we are one. When I was with them I protected them in your name that you gave me, and I guarded them, and none of them was lost except the son of destruction, in order that the Scripture might be fulfilled. But now I am coming to you. I speak this in the world so that they may share my joy completely. I gave them your word, and the world hated them, because they do not belong to the world any more than I belong to the world. I do not ask that you take them out of the world but that you keep them from the evil one. They do not belong to the world any more than I belong to the world. Consecrate them in the truth. Your word is truth. As you sent me into the world, so I sent them into the world. And I consecrate myself for them, so that they also may be consecrated in truth."

Fr. Antony's Letter

Dear Friends,

Mom: What does your girlfriend like in you?

Son: She thinks I'm handsome, talented, clever and a good dancer.

Mom: And what do you like in her?

Son: I like in her that she thinks I'm handsome, talented, clever and a good dancer.

This week's Gospel explains why and how much Jesus loves us. "As the Father loves me, so I also love you." Jesus is loved by God the Father. He is nothing but the Father's love for us. That makes Him express His love for us. He is nothing but love for us so He invites us to "remain in my Love." He wants to continue in us as God's love that we too may be the gift of love and love alone to each other. "This is my commandment: love one another as I love you."

Jesus also explains how He loves us. He loves as His equals who can relate with Him as friends. He would not treat us as His slaves who have to obey orders, but we are His friends with whom He shares His total self without any inhibition or pretension. He welcomes us to love Him without any reservation. "I no longer call you slaves, because a slave does not know what his master is doing. I have called you friends, because I have told you everything I have heard from my Father." No condition is laid out. We come before Him as we are and relate to Him as He is.

Jesus offers His love beyond measure. "No one has greater love than this,

to lay down one's life for one's friends." He is the measure of His love. He offers His total self as an expression of His love for us. The believers are loved by Jesus in God's measure. Jesus does not love us according to the measure we deserve but according to the measure that He generously wants to give. He loves us without measure to the extent that He gives His life for us. Even before we could realize that He loves us Jesus started to love us. He says, "It was not you who chose me, but I who chose you."

Again, when Jesus says, "If you keep my commandments, you will remain in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and remain in his love," it is a direct invitation from Jesus to us how to experience love. Love can be experienced only by love. There is no other way. We can't feel the love of the lover unless we begin to love the lover back. Love feels the love. Unless the beloved falls in love with the lover, love will never become a reality. Unless we reciprocally love Jesus as He loves us, we will never feel His love for us. As the second reading instructs, we can experience the love of God when we exercise our willingness to love others. A loving heart opens all venues of love for the love to be experienced by us. Let us love and feel the love. Let us allow ourselves to be loved by others in order that we be filled with love.

This Thursday May 9th is the 40th day of Easter, the Feast Day of the Ascension of our Lord. The Feast of the Ascension ends the Easter Season. It is a solemn day of obligation. There will be a vigil mass on Wednesday at 7:00 pm. The masses on the Feast Day of the Ascension are at 9:00 am and 7:00 pm.

His Presence Is Real - Reflections on the Eucharist by Deacon Matt

The Mass: Lit urgy of the E ucharist - Part XVI pray a prayer derived

We are still examining the Liturgy of the Eucharist, and we are very close to actually being able to receive Jesus. Last week we looked at the Sign of Peace. This week we will observe all that takes place before Holy Communion is actually distributed.

While the Sign of Peace is being exchanged, the deacon goes to the tabernacle and brings any ciboria with previously consecrated hosts to the altar, so that they may be distributed along with those just consecrated at the present Mass. If you watch the priest very closely, you will see him break the large host over the paten. This is in imitation of what Christ himself did at the Last Supper, where he blessed the bread and then broke it before sharing it with his disciples. The priest also takes a small piece of the host and places it into the Precious Blood in his chalice, praying quietly that "the mingling of the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ bring eternal life to us who receive it."

Together, we are led in the "Lamb of God," recalling references to John's Gospel and the Book of Revelation. Note that as a link to what was discussed last week, we pray once again that Jesus grant us his peace. The host is shown to us all for us to "behold," and we recognize that we are about to take part in the "supper of the Lamb." Then together we

pray a prayer derived from *Matthew 8:8*, that like the centurion, we state we are unworthy for Jesus to come under our roof (our very bodies). Yet Jesus indeed wishes to become a part of us. And so we come forward, partaking in the Real Presence of our Lord, who loves us so much, he instituted this vital Sacra-



ment of the Eucharist - for our sake.

"The celebration of the Eucharistic sacrifice is wholly directed toward the intimate union of the faithful with Christ in communion. To receive communion is to receive Christ himself who has offered himself for us. " - Catechism of the Catholic Church, no. 1382






Pentecost





Liturgical Minister Training-Spring 2024

The Diocese of Rockville Center will offer training in Spanish and English for those who wish to serve as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion and Lectors. No walk-ins permitted, all participants must be registered in advance with a letter from their pastor.

Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion: Part A - This training is required for **all** those who are beginning as Ministers. This "BASIC" training is required for **all** Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. Those who wish to minister in hospitals, nursing homes and to the homebound are required to attend Part B training in addition to BASIC training. One **must** attend Part A training prior to Part B training. A **Lector Workshop** is available for both new and experienced lectors.
