A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew:

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

The phone rang in the maternity ward and an excited voice on the other end said, "this is George Smith and I'm bringing my wife in ... she's about to have a baby!"

"Calm down," replied the attendant. "Tell me, is this her first baby?"

"No," the voice replied, "this is her husband". The husband's reply can be correct or incorrect depending on the way one approaches the question asked by the attendant or as heard by the husband. **Today's Gospel story seems fair or unfair** depending upon whose version we choose to hear that of the hired laborers or of the land-owner. For the laborers who put in a full day's work, it is unfair to pay the same wage to all the laborers, even though all did not work the same number of hours. From the land-owner's view point, it is fair to compensate his laborers whatever amount he wishes to pay them so long as it is the amount to which they had mutually agreed.

Life is not merely made of contracts, laws and bylaws. Life begins and is continuously sustained by the generosity of others to us and our generosity to our individual selves.

When life is viewed through laws, life can offer nothing more than fairness or unfairness. But when life is cherished through generosity, then the spiritual sides of life, such as respect, love, care, compassion etc. will begin to spring up. We need laws to measure ourselves, to know where we stand but it is generosity that will move us towards where life wants to take us, especially towards the joy of living. Our Parish celebration of the Beach Mass and Picnic last Sunday at Otto Schubert Beach, Nissequogue, was a great spiritual and family event. Over 225 attended. It was a picture-perfect day with plenty of sunshine, a gentle breeze and no humidity... I thank all the people who made this mass and picnic a joyful event by their participation and by bringing salads and desserts. I am grateful to Pam Tarry and Rochelle Rouse for having spearheaded the event and coordinated all the activities. A big thanks to the Knights of Columbus for transporting the necessary items for mass and for cooking at the barbecue; I gratefully remember all the volunteers in different activities in the celebration of mass, setting the tables, serving and cleaning at the end. Thanks a lot to the Choir and to Lou Savarese for the sound service. Hope to see more of you at the next year's beach mass.

"Stop right there! Take your seat.", said a Temecula Valley, CA teacher as her 1st grade student talked about Jesus during a presentation about the Star of Bethlehem. She had brought it to school as part of an assignment about family Christmas traditions. Her mother contacted legal firm, Advocates for Faith & Freedom, who sent a 7 page letter to the Superintendent and BOE. "After Brynn took her seat the teacher explained to Brynn in front of all the other students that she was not allowed to talk about the Bible or share its verses," stated Advocates for Faith & Freedom.
