FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Jim: "I'm so nearsighted I nearly worked myself to death."
Pete: "What's being nearsighted got to do with working

yourself to death?"

Jim: "I couldn't tell whether the boss was watching me or not, so I had to work all the time." The message is "never make life as work; just try to live in work."

In the first reading we hear Job who interprets his life from all his suffering and loss. Life looks bleak, surrounded by misery and trouble without happiness and hope.

On the other hand, in the Second Reading, St. Paul looks at life as a reward or service offered to him for preaching the Gospel of Jesus Christ. He can live in any situation; he is ready to become a slave to all even though he is free; he is willing to become weak for the weak... ready to be all things to all for the sake of the Gospel. Unlike Job, Paul does not see life as a mill to grind him with its burden and pain, but a blessing to live the Gospel of Jesus. Whether to make life a burden or blessing depends on how you look at your life and what empowers you to live.

In the Gospel, Jesus heals Peter's mother-in-law. The next day when they brought more sick people, he left for a nearby village without healing them. The Gospel continues narrating that Jesus went on preaching and healing throughout the whole of Galilee. He did not heal all the sick of his time. Jesus started the mission of healing and proclaiming the Good News and left his mission to be continued by His disciples, you and me. You and I are the mission and the message, the servants and power of Jesus. We are healed by Jesus and are sent as healers in his name and power. May Jesus continue to heal and proclaim through us.

conference has approved three more clothing vouchers for different families, paid a heating oil bill for a family in need, made a payment for someone's car insurance and approved furniture for another family. We have also received several calls for help from persons living in their cars as they cannot find a room or apartment to rent in our area.

Synod of Bishop Lineamenta document

We have been requested to share the following communication from Mr. Sean Dolan, Director of

Communications of the Diocese of Rockville Centre

The Extraordinary Synod of Bishops was held in October 2014 with the theme: “The Pastoral Challenges of the Family in the Context of Evangelization.” This Extraordinary Synod will be followed by the Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops, **October 4-25, 2015** with the theme: “The Vocation and Mission of the Family in the Church and in the Contemporary World.” The final document of the Extraordinary Synod, the *Relatio Synodi*, is the preparatory document or “Lineamenta” of the XIV Ordinary General Assembly. As is customary in the synod process, His Eminence, Cardinal Lorenzo Baldisseri, the General Secretary of the Synod of Bishops invites consultation on this topic to help with its preparation.

Contained within this Preparatory Document which was issued by the Holy See to begin this process is a series of questions. This document can be found at http://www.vatican.va/roman_curia/synod/documents/rc_synod_doc_20141209_lineamenta-xiv-assembly_en.html. It is also available by clicking on the “Synod of Bishops” icon on the index page of our diocesan website – [drvc.org](http://www.drvc.org). Bishop Murphy is welcoming responses to these questions from the faithful of the Diocese of Rockville Centre, and you are invited to read the entire document before responding. .

If you, our parishioners wish to respond to any or all of the questions, please be mindful of the following guidelines:

1. Only E-mail responses sent to synodofbishops@drvc.org<mailto:synodofbishops@drvc.org> will be accepted.
2. Only E-mail responses that include the respondent's name and parish will be accepted.
3. Responses will be accepted in the languages the Lineamenta is available in from the Vatican – that is: English, Spanish, French, Italian, German and Portuguese.
4. Thank you in advance for not sending faxes, mailed, printed or handwritten documents. They will not be accepted.
5. The questions to address upon reflection are those found in the Preparatory Document and may be found on the Vatican website:

6. When responding, specific reference must be given to the question number. So, for instance, if one is responding to question 3 in the Preparatory Document, that fact should be clearly indicated in the response.
