Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

June 7, 2015
The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ
Exodus 24: 3-8
Psalm 116:12-13, 15-16, 17-18
Hebrews 9:11-15
Mark 14:12-16, 22-26

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Mark:

On the first day of the Feast of Unleavened Bread, when they sacrificed the Passover lamb, Jesus' disciples said to him, "Where do you want us to go and prepare for you to eat the Passover?"

He sent two of his disciples and said to them,

"Go into the city and a man will meet you, carrying a jar of water. Follow him. Wherever he enters, say to the master of the house, 'The Teacher says, "Where is my guest room where I may eat the Passover with my disciples?" Then he will show you a large upper room furnished and ready. Make the preparations for us there."

The disciples then went off, entered the city, and found it just as he had told them; and they prepared the Passover. While they were eating, he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, gave it to them, and said,

"Take it; this is my body."

Then he took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, and they all drank from it. He said to them,

"This is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed for many. Amen, I say to you, I shall not drink again the fruit of the vine until the day when I drink it new in the kingdom of God." Then, after singing a hymn, they went out to the Mount of Olives.

Focus Questions:

- 1. What difference does your belief in the real presence of Jesus in the bread and wine make in your life?
- 2. Describe a time when you sacrificed something for another
- 3. Recall a Mass that was especially meaningful for you.

Family and children's question:

Jesus and the apostles left the Last Supper singing. Relate a time when you left the church singing or a song from church stayed in your head.

Dear Friends,

After a heated argument with his wife, the husband said,

"Why can't we live peacefully like our two dogs that never fight?"



Catholics for Freedom of Religion

Christians Under Attack:

Nigeria: "This is just the beginning of the killings. What you've witnessed is a tip of the iceberg. More deaths are coming ...," said a Boko Haram leader after executing their largest attack to date. Their January attack killed 2,000 people. (opendoorsusa.org, 5/13/15)

Syria: Assyrian Christians fled to southwest Turkey following a brutal Islamic State offensive begun in February. The Assyrian refugees in Turkey view ISIL targeted violence against Christians as a genocide against their people much like the first massacre that occurred in 1915, when the crumbling Ottoman Empire killed as many as 1.5 million Armenians and 300,000 Assyrians. "Islamic State is trying to commit genocide against us. After 100 years, the past is coming back to us," said one refugee. (opendoorsusa.org, 4/2/15)

Ethiopia: Prayers of mourning are being said for 30 Ethiopian Christians killed in Libya by ISIL. Pope Francis expressed his "great distress and sadness" at the "shocking violence perpetrated against innocent Christians." An ISIL video shows fighters in Libya holding captives who are described as "followers of the cross from the enemy of Ethiopian Church." Ethiopia's population is almost 2/3 Christian. (nytimes.com, 4/19/15; america.aljazeera.com, 4/21/15)
