RECONCILIATION—Celebrated in Church every Saturday from 4pm to 4:45pm, or by previous appointment with Parish Office.



Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

June 28, 2015 Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time Wisdom 1:13-15; 2:23-24 Psalm 30:2, 4, 5-6, 11, 12, 13 (2a) 2 Corinthians 8:7, 9, 13-15 Mark 5:22-43

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Mark: When Jesus had crossed again in the boat to the other side, a large crowd gathered around him, and he stayed close to the sea. One of the synagogue officials, named Jairus, came forward. Seeing him he fell at his feet and pleaded earnestly with him, saying, "My daughter is at the point of death. Please, come lay your hands on her that she may get well and live." He went off with him, and a large crowd followed him and pressed upon him.

While he was still speaking, people from the synagogue official's house arrived and said, "Your daughter has died; why trouble the teacher any longer?" Disregarding the message that was reported. Jesus said to the synagogue official, "Do not be afraid; just have faith." He did not allow anyone to accompany him inside except Peter, James, and John, the brother of James. When they arrived at the house of the synagogue official, he caught sight of a commotion, people weeping and wailing loudly. So he went in and said to them, "Why this commotion and weeping? The child is not dead but asleep." And they ridiculed him. Then he put them all out. He took along the child's father and mother and those who were with him and entered the room where the child was. He took the child by the hand and said to her, "Talitha koum," which means, "Little girl, I say to you, arise!" The girl, a child of twelve, arose Immediately and walked around. At that they were utterly astounded. He gave strict orders that no one should know this and said that she should be given something to eat.

3. Describe a time when you hesitated to do something because of fear. What helped you overcome your fear?

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

The football match was about to start. Both teams gathered together and prayed briefly. A fan, seated next to a minister, asked "Whom would the Lord make win, if both teams prayed with equal faith and fervor?"

"In that event," replied the minister, "I imagine the Lord would simply sit back and enjoy the game."

This Sunday's Gospel reading narrates that Jesus was in the stern asleep on a cushion while the disciples are struggling to save the boat from waves of a violent squall. They complained to him, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" Does not God care for human struggles?

When he woke up and calmed the sea, Jesus asked them "why are you terrified? Do you not yet have faith?" They woke up Jesus to save them. But Jesus wakes up within them their dormant faith ,that they should not to be terrified while he is with them.

Today's readings invite us to find God's presence in everything. The person of faith will see God's presence in every moment of life. They will see God's care in the most troubled time. They don't deduce their life to a simple calculation that all favorable situations or persons reveal God's presence and all the unfavorable indicates the absence of God to them. Rather their faith in God's presence to be everywhere interprets for them the meaning and value of each situation or person. It is not the situation that dictates life to them. But it is God's pervading presence that provides the gift of life in every situation.
