RECONCILIATION—Celebrated in Church every Saturday from 4pm to 4:45pm, or by previous appointment with Parish Office.



Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

July 5, 2015 Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time Ezekiel 2:2-5 Psalm 123:1-2, 2, 3-4 2 Corinthians 12:7-10 Mark 6:1-6

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Mark:

Jesus departed from there and came to his native place, accompanied by his disciples. When the sabbath came he began to teach in the synagogue, and many who heard him were astonished.

They said, "Where did this man get all this? What kind of wisdom has been given him? What mighty deeds are wrought by his hands! Is he not the carpenter, the son of Mary, and the brother of James and Joses and Judas and Simon? And are not his sisters here with us?" And they took offense at him.

Jesus said to them, "A prophet is not without honor except in his native place and among his own kin and in his own house."

So he was not able to perform any mighty deed there, apart from curing a few sick people by laying his hands on them.

He was amazed at their lack of faith.

Focus Questions:

1. How would you have responded to Jesus if you met him when he lived 2,000 years ago?

2. Describe a time when you were astonished by someone but went on your way, unaffected by what they said or did.

3. What keeps you going when you don't feel like you are supported by those closest to you?

Family and children's question:

Talk about a time when you didn't see the goodness in another person in your family or in one of your friends.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends.

Dentist: Good grief! You've got the biggest cavity I've ever seen – the biggest cavity I've ever seen. Patient: You don't have to repeat it, doc! Dentist: I didn't – that was the echo. Our life is an echo of what we believe. Our words and actions reverberate our faith.

Today's Gospel is a double miracle – one intertwined into the other. It starts with Jarius inviting Jesus to his home to heal his dying daughter. As Jesus is walking towards his home, comes this woman who was suffering from hemorrhages for 12 years amidst the pressing crowds, believing that she would be healed by touching Jesus's garment. She was healed because she believed. Jesus compliments her, "Daughter, your faith has saved vou."

In the meantime the news arrives from Jarius' home that his daughter has died. At this news Jesus encouraged them, "Do not be afraid; just have faith." Later at home Jesus silenced those who ridiculed him and raised the dead child.

Faith is the forum where we allow God to act. Both Jarius and the woman staved in the course of faith. The woman tried various means of healing for 12 years and spent all her money. Faith took her to a level what the human could not do. She believed that she would be healed and so it happened. Jarius continued to believe even when the odds were against him. His faith brought his daughter back to life.

Faith keeps us going strong even when the odds are against us. Faith fills us with the knowledge and a new consciousness to expect what God alone can do in the midst of what humans cannot do. Our life becomes an echo of what we believe.

We are still suffering from the murder of the nine worshipers, in Emmanuel AME Church, Charleston, N.C. Our faith is the only healing power. Without faith we are left with only depression and hatred. Every measure of healing has to start with believing that God can help us invest in the goodness in each other and work toward peace. In our faith we pray for the families of the victims that God comfort them and heal them.

On June 24th Fr. Harold Noviello started his ministry in our Parish as an Associate Pastor. A warm welcome to him. Let us thank God for the gift of his priestly ministry. Let us wish him well and pray for him that God bless our Parish Family through his ministry.

Congrats to all the graduates of the class of 2015. We are proud of you and glad to pray for you at the 10:45 am mass this Sunday. May God guide you and bring you a

prosperous and brighter future. You are ours and we will continue to pray for you.

Thanks for all those who worked together to make the celebration of Fr. Dahlke's Golden Jubilee a joyful family event. He and his sisters express their heartfelt thanks to us for having made his days here so memorable and his Jubilee celebrative.
