SACRAMENT OF THE SICK—Call the Church Office to request visitation of the sick.



# Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

August 2, 2015 Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time Exodus 16:2-4, 12-15 Psalm 78:3-4, 23-24, 25 Ephesians 4:17, 20-24 John 6:24-35

#### A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John:

When the crowd saw that neither Jesus nor his disciples were there, they themselves got into boats and came to Capernaum looking for Jesus. And when they found him across the sea they said to him,

"Rabbi, when did you get here?"

Jesus answered them and said,

"Amen, amen, I say to you, you are looking for me not because you saw signs but because you ate the loaves and were filled. Do not work for food that perishes but for the food that endures for eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you. For on him the Father, God, has set his seal."

So they said to him,

"What can we do to accomplish the works of God?" Jesus answered and said to them,

"This is the work of God, that you believe in the one he sent." So they said to him,

"What sign can you do, that we may see and believe in you? What can you do? Our ancestors ate manna in the desert, as it is written: *He gave them bread from heaven to eat.*" So Jesus said to them,

"Amen, amen, I say to you, it was not Moses who gave the bread from heaven; my Father gives you the true bread from heaven. For the bread of God is that which comes down from heaven and gives life to the world."

#### FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

A school teacher sends this note to all parents on the first day of school: "If you promise not to believe everything your child says that happens at school, I'll promise not to believe everything he says that happens at home." If we want to experience God's working in us we must choose not to believe in our human limitations. To believe is not what we can or cannot do, but what we allow God to do in us.

In today's first reading and in the Gospel we see human limitations being met by God's abundance. The disciples had only a limited amount of bread but are expected to feed a large crowd. God asks them to believe in God's working through their limitation. Their limited quantity of bread gets multiplied. The human insufficiency is now turned into God's abundance. If we consider that we are nothing more than just what we can do, our life will be contained just to our limited resources. We may be able to do only up to our capacity. We would not be able to live not a single minute more than our body can afford to live. But God has given us spiritual strength of believing in God and allowing our life to become God's work. We may have just five loaves and two fishes which may feed just our hunger. But if we offer our resources to God's hand, they will be multiplied into food for five thousand people and more.

The choice is ours. We can either be reduced to be just human limitation or become God's abundance by believing and allowing ourselves to be God's work. Let us offer our five loaves and fishes to be multiplied to be food for many. Let us believe and be abundant.

**My summer visit to India:** I am leaving for India on July 31<sup>st</sup> to visit my mom and be with her and my brothers' families for the whole month of August. See you all in September.

Welcome to Fr. Alexander Mariadass: While I am away Fr. Alexander Mariadass, (Fr. Alex) will be here helping us in the parish. He is a priest for 9 years from the diocese of Coimbatore, India. At present he studies Sacred Liturgy in St. Anselm Pontifical University, Rome, Italy. We welcome him and wish him all the best in his ministry among us.
