RECONCILIATION—Celebrated in Church every Saturday from 4pm to 4:45pm, or by previous appointment with Parish Office.



A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John:

Many of Jesus' disciples who were listening said, "This saying is hard; who can accept it?" Since Jesus knew that his disciples were murmuring about this, he said to them, "Does this shock you? What if you were to see the Son of Man ascending to where he was before? It is the spirit that gives life, while the flesh is of no avail. The words I have spoken to you are Spirit and life. FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

A doctor was called in to see a very busy patient. "Well, sir, what's the matter?" the doctor asked cheerfully.

"That is for you find out" the patient snapped.

"I see," said the doctor. "Well, if you'll excuse me a minute, I'll phone a friend of mine, a veterinarian. He's the only man I know who can make a diagnosis without asking questions." Wisdom does not hide itself. Stupidity cannot reveal itself.

This Sunday's readings describe the invitation of Wisdom to the banquet of life. Whoever is not snobbish but humble will hear its invitation and cherish life. Whoever is not selfishly closed but open to Wisdom's invitation will live forever. Life is available to us to the extent we open ourselves to Wisdom. We reap what we sow in life. If we accept Wisdom in faith we will reap the fruits of Wisdom in life.

In the Gospel, Jesus the living Wisdom of God invites us to believe in him that He is the banquet of God offered for us humans. He offers himself as the food and drink which nourishes us, not only for this earthly life but for eternal life as well. We are what we eat, and we are promised by Jesus to become Jesus-like by eating Jesus, the food.

We are created by God in God's own image. Now God's own Son Jesus offers himself as God's food to nurture us. In the celebration of the mass we recall and reenact the Last Supper. We re-celebrate his living presence in the Eucharist in the form of bread and wine. Thus in every mass the Wisdom of God, Jesus, invites us to his banquet. Let us be nourished by the Eucharist, the body and blood of Jesus in the form of bread and wine.

Atlanta Fire Chief Fired:

Fire Chief Kevin Cochran lost his job because, on his own time, he self-published a men's devotional book that briefly mentions the biblical view of sex as reserved for marriage between one man and one woman. Cochran was ordered to complete "sensitivity training" after complaints from activists who objected to his Christian views. An investigation concluded that Cochran did not discriminate against anyone but the mayor fired him anyway.

"Your action against Chief Cochran appears to violate fundamental principles of free speech and religious freedom. The only way Chief Cochran could avoid his views would be to disown his religion..." said Georgia's congressional delegation.

Supreme Court Victory:

A small church in Gilbert, AZ, uses signs to invite & direct the community to it's services but was restricted to small, 6 sq. ft. 14 hour display temporary signs while home association 80 sq. ft., political 32 sq. ft., and ideological 20 sq. ft. signs are permitted for display indefinitely.

In a unanimous decision, the U.S. Supreme Court decisively affirmed that the government cannot play favorites when it comes to free speech. "The government (ordinance) cannot target one form of speech with severe restrictions while allowing more speech for others in similar circumstances," said Alliance Defending Freedom Senior Counsel, Jeremy Tedesco.
