December 6, 2015 Second Sunday of Advent Baruch 5: 1-9 Psalm 126: 1-2, 2-3, 4-5, 6 Philippians 1:4-6, 8-11 Luke 3" 1-6

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke:

In the fifteenth year of the reign of Tiberius Caesar, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea, and Herod was tetrarch of Galilee, and his brother Philip tetrarch of the region of Ituraea and Trachonitis, and Lysanias was tetrarch of Abilene, during the high priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John the son of Zechariah in the desert. FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

The Lord created the world in six days and rested on the seventh. On the eighth day God started to answer complaints. Yes, if one starts to complain, even God's creation is not free from complaints. The Season of Advent, which we begin this weekend, encourages us to look beyond with a heart of hope...not to complain about the darkness but to awaken ourselves to the inner light that each one of us has in order to brighten the darkness. On this first Sunday of Advent we will bless the Advent wreath and light the first candle. The lighted advent candle symbolizes our preparation to receive the light, Jesus Christ in our hearts and home. Not that we are worthy to receive him, but Jesus is willing to enlighten our darkness.

The four candles of the Advent wreath stand for the four weeks of preparation. By lighting a candle each

week we increase the brightness of the light to signify the closeness of Light; Christ increases the light and expels the darkness. The Advent wreath encourages us all to get rid of darkness by bearing the light of Christ. Let us rise and shine instead of complaining and doing nothing about the darkness.

God did not complain about our unworthiness to receive Jesus, His Son, but he sent Him to make us worthy. Let us take this time of Advent to raise our wick to burn brightly. Because God has not abandoned us for our unworthiness but found us as his worthy place to be born. Let us awaken to our worth to shine brightly.

On the first Sunday of Advent you will find new missalettes in the pews which have all the readings, hymns and prayers for the whole year. Since they are to be used for the whole year until end of November 2016, may I request you to please handle them gently. This year they are placed in plastic covers so that they may last the year long. The bookmark-ribbons are to help you find the hymns and readings easily. When not in use please place them carefully in the racks. Please do not jam books into the racks in the open position. Before leaving the church please check your pew to see that the missalettes are in order. Thank you for your cooperation.

St. Anthony's Food Pantry Windows are now installed. When we enter the church we may generously place food for the poor in the movable bin by the windows. These new windows will present the entrance to the church with a spiritual look and motivate our giving with the promises that Jesus has given us in the Gospel of Mathew. St. Anthony, the patron associated with 'bread for the poor' is at the center window. May the words of the Gospel and the model and intercession of St. Anthony inspire our giving. I would like to thank Will Recce of our parish for his invaluable assistance in coordinating this project. The parish also thanks those people who donated generously towards its cost. We welcome people who would like to make a contribution in memory of their loved ones.

December 8th is the Solemn Feast of the Immaculate Conception of Mary, the patroness of our Land. It is a Holy Day of Obligation. Masses will be celebrated on Monday December 7th at 7:00 pm, and on Tuesday December 8th at 9:00 am and 7:00 pm. On December 8th the Mother Church begins the **JUBILEE YEAR OF MERCY**. Pope Francis will open the door of Mercy at St. Peter's Basilica and declare the Year of Mercy open. May this Year of Mercy be a God-given time of experiencing God's Mercy to share the Divine Mercy with each other in our kindness, compassion and forgiveness.

Congratulations and thanks to Nicholas Crociata. This Sunday after the 10:45 am Mass let us gather to bless the Shrine of St. Francis of Assisi near the eastern

entrance of the parking lot. Nicholas Crociata has put together the whole construction as his Eagle Scout Project. The Parish is very proud of his accomplishment and is thankful to him and his parents. Jeanne Marie and Peter Crociata for their dedication and hard work in materializing this Shrine-project. Together with the Crociatas, the Parish is grateful to all the donors who helped Nicholas financially and in every other way manually and morally. In 1967 on a Sunday before Christmas Fr. Kirwin said the first mass for the newly formed parish of St. Thomas More. Two years from now we will become 50 years young - the Golden Jubilee of our Parish. Coach Suspended for "Religious Conduct": A

Washington State H.S. football coach is suspended from his job for offering a lawful, private, personal prayer of thanks at the 50-yard line after every game since 2008 without drawing any complaints. Coach Joe Kennedy, a Marine veteran, will silently "take-a-knee" after shaking hands with the opposing coaches and is sometimes joined by students and game attendees.

Coach Kennedy was told by Bremerton H.S. officials that he could pray after games under one condition: that it wouldn't be "observable to students or the public." Teachers, coaches, administrators - or public employees of any kind - don't lose their religious freedom when they step on school property. Insisting otherwise is a violation of their civil rights.

"No reasonable observer could conclude that a football coach who waits until the game is over, and the players have left the field, and walks to mid-field to say a short, private, personal prayer, is speaking on behalf of the state. Quite the opposite ... to ban or prohibit Coach Kennedy - or any private citizen - praying, violates the First Amendment," said Liberty Institute attorneys. "Among the most basic rights that Americans enjoy are the free exercise of religion, free speech, and the freedom of association." (libertyinstitute.org, 10/27/15; cbsnews.com, 10/30/15)


