RECONCILIATION—Celebrated in Church every Saturday from 4pm to 4:45pm, or by previous appointment with Parish Office.


SACRAMENT OF THE SICK—Call the Church Office to request visitation of the sick.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

"Darling, I read your new book yesterday. I loved it. Who wrote it for you?"

"I'm glad you liked it. Who read it to you?"

If we think that we are smart to put down some one, it will not take much time for the other to put us down. Soon we will be repaid with the same coin. The measure we measure to others will be measured unto us.

Today's readings show how God is ready to uplift us and never to put us down.

The gospel narrates how Jesus saves the woman caught in adultery from the jaws of death. Jesus makes the accusers judge their lives with the same law with which they have condemned the woman. If the woman is condemned by the law for her sin, they too stand condemned before the law for their sins. For no one is sinless and everyone has failed to live up to the law to some degree or other. At the awareness that we are all sinners, Jesus invites every one not to condemn and kill but forgive and heal.

In the first reading God instructs us to forget the things of the past. He welcomes us to perceive and participate in the New that springs forth. Let us imitate Paul as he says in the second reading, "Forgetting what lies behind but straining forward to what lies ahead, I continue my pursuit toward the goal, the prize of God's upward calling, in Christ Jesus." The past always provokes to judge the other and the future awaits with the new to live in hope and peace.

EWTN and Supreme Court:

As the U.S. Supreme Court prepares to hear the religious freedom case of Little Sisters of the Poor on March 23, EWTN Global Catholic Network has filed a brief with the Court. "Our brief argues that the government's mandate (requiring employers to offer health insurance plans covering contraception, sterilization and abortion-producing drugs) ... seek to coerce EWTN and other religious organizations into violating our strongly held beliefs," said EWTN Chairman. "The Supreme Court needs to find the mandate unconstitutional."

For failing to comply with the mandate, EWTN would face fines of \$35,000 per day, about \$12.7 million per year. The brief charges that the government aims to force EWTN into "complicity with wrongdoing. ... Giving in would not only violate EWTN's conscience, but would destroy its credibility as a witness to the Catholic faith it proclaims every day to a worldwide audience." (www.patheos.com, 1/13/16)

LENTEN PROJECT 2016

CATHOLIC RELIEF SERVICES WORKING TO PREVENT A LOST GENERATION

The donations collected for this year's Lenten project will go to help Catholic Relief Services in their outreach to the children of Syrian refugees. CRS provides more than 53,546 Syrian Refugee children with education classes, school materials, counseling, recreational activities, and safe spaces to learn and play. Since the conflict began in Syria five years ago, 7.5 million children are in need of humanitarian aid, 2.5 million children are no longer in school. According to UNICEF, for Syrian children, "what is at stake isn't politics. It's their future. Having already lost their homes, schools and communities, their chance of building a future may also soon be lost."

Catholic Relief Services is working, along with Caritas, on the ground in Syria, Lebanon, Jordan, Egypt and Greece helping children and their families with food, clothing, housing and education. Pope Francis' first pastoral visit outside of Rome was to the tiny island of Lampedusa, where many refugees landed after making the perilous sea voyage from North Africa. Two years later, he is still urging the Church and the world not to turn their backs on the suffering of those people fleeing conflict and death.

Pope Francis has declared this year to be a Jubilee Year of Mercy. Remember Jesus' words in Matthew 25 "Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for Me."

Donations can be placed in the Lenten Project House in the narthex or can be collected in the CRS Rice Bowls and brought back to Church at the end of Lent

We are also encouraging all parishioners to fill in a heart (found in an envelope on the narthex bulletin board) with words of hope and encouragement for the refugee children.
