
and will declare to you the things that are coming.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

“Parents spend the first part of a child’s life urging him to walk and talk, and the rest of his childhood making him sit down and keep quiet.” By teaching the child to talk and walk we enable the child to do what he or she can be capable of. At the same time we take care that the child should speak the right words and walk the right path. That is the reason parents teach them when to stop walking and to sit down, and when to keep quiet and what to speak. We all have the power to walk and talk but we need the right direction to walk and a pure conscience to speak. God fills us with the Holy Spirit that we may talk and walk right.

Today is the Solemn Feast of Pentecost. Pentecost is a Greek word which means fifty. This Sunday is the fiftieth day of Easter. As the first reading narrates, on the 50th day Jesus sent the gift of the Holy Spirit from God the Father upon the disciples. Before receiving the Holy Spirit they were afraid and clueless what to speak or where to go. After receiving the Holy Spirit they were illumined and emboldened. The Holy Spirit inspired them what to speak and where to go, whom to approach and how to communicate.

Without the Holy Spirit our speaking would be merely words produced by the breath escaping through the vocal cords. It is the inspiration of the Holy Spirit that uplifts our speaking to life-giving words and meaningful communication. Without the Holy Spirit all our activities can easily become burdens and routine. It is the Holy Spirit who turns our routine doing into the joy of living, and to find blessings even in our burdens.

Today’s Gospel narrates how Jesus breathed upon the disciples and said to them ‘Receive the Holy Spirit.’ We too receive the same Holy Spirit in the sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation to live fully well in all that we say or do. In the sacraments of Reconciliation (Confession) and Anointing of the Sick, the Holy Spirit raises us up from our faults and failures and renews our strength to walk and talk with God’s power. In the sacraments of Matrimony and Ordination (Holy Orders) the Holy spirit inspires us to bear witness to God’s love and grace. In the Eucharist ordinary bread and wine is changed into God’s abiding presence in Jesus by the power of the Holy Spirit.

Red Balloons: When we go out from the church after the mass, we will find red balloons tied to cars. These have a spiritual meaning of this Pentecost Sunday. Red is the color of Holy Spirit to signify the red flame of fire that settled upon the disciples when they received the Holy Spirit on the first Pentecost. The balloon filled with air signifies us who are filled with the Holy Spirit in Baptism, Confirmation and the other Sacraments. The rising balloon means that the Holy Spirit always uplifts us heavenwards. We thank all those who work hard to tie the balloons to the cars. Please carry them carefully home and tie them to your mail box.... Let everyone know that your household is filled with the divine gift of the Holy Spirit.

In this case, to hold up can mean to stop, or impede any movement, as in "hold up production" of something...as in faulty seat belts. However, Hold up can also mean a supportive move, as in a support beam to hold up the ceiling, or to hold up your friend with emotional support in a time of tragedy. What a rich language we have!
