Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

July 3, 2016

Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Isaiah 66:10-14C

Psalm 66:1-3, 4-5, 6-7, 16, 20

Galatians 6: 14-18

Luke 10:1-12, 17-20

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke:

At that time the Lord appointed seventy-two others whom he sent ahead of him in pairs to every town and place he intended to visit. He said to them, "The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest. Go on your way; behold, I am sending you like lambs among wolves. Carry no money bag, no sack, no sandals; and greet no one along the way. Into whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace to this household.' If a peaceful person lives there, your peace will rest on him; but if not, it will return to you. Stay in the same house and eat and drink what is offered to you, for the laborer deserves his payment. Do not move about from one house to another. Whatever town you enter and they welcome you, eat what is set before you, cure the sick in it and say to them, 'The kingdom of God is at hand for you.' Whatever town you enter and they do not receive you, go out into the streets and say, 'The dust of your town that clings to our feet, even that we shake off against you.' Yet know this: the kingdom of God is at hand. I tell you, it will be more tolerable for Sodom on that day than for that town."

The seventy-two returned rejoicing, and said, "Lord, even the demons are subject to us because of your name." Jesus said, "I have observed Satan fall like lightning from the sky. Behold, I have given you the power to 'tread upon serpents' and scorpions and upon the full force of the enemy and nothing will harm you. Nevertheless, do not rejoice because the spirits are subject to you, but rejoice because your names are written in heaven."

Focus Questions:

1. Describe a time when you felt called to be a laborer in God's harvest.
2. How does Jesus call you to spread the Gospel in the world?
3. Where do you see Satan at work in the world? Where do you see God's power overcoming evil?

Family and children's question:

Jesus sent the disciples out two by two. Who is your partner in faith?

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Patient: Doc, what is the difference between an itch and an allergy?

Doctor: About thirty five dollars.

The question of this Sunday's Gospel is, "What is the difference between Jesus's calling us and our decision to respond to his call. The answer is our unconditional giving of our whole life.

Today's Gospel speaks of Jesus's determination to journey to Jerusalem. The Gospel of Luke narrates Jesus's ministry as a long journey from Galilee to Jerusalem, to die on the cross and to rise on the third day. Jesus's determination never slackened. He never drifted away from Jerusalem, the destination of his earthly journey. Nothing, neither praise nor curse from anybody distracted his focus on his death on the Cross and his Resurrection. That is . His mission is to die for people and not to punish them. why he rebukes the disciples when they wanted Jesus to punish the Samaritans who did not welcome him into their village

Jesus expects the same kind of determination of will from those who would like to follow him. Whether one wants to follow Jesus or to adhere to his call, one should follow him without any strings attached. Unconditional following is expected from the disciples of Jesus. Once we set our hand to the plow, we are never to look to what was left behind. We are called to proceed forward focusing on God's kingdom. Let us pray for that kind of determination and commitment to Jesus.

This week our diocese will take up the Peter's Pence Collection, which provides the Holy Father with the funds he needs to carry out his most important charitable works. The proceeds benefit the most disadvantaged: victims of war, oppression, and natural disasters. Through your generosity, we can cast the peace of Christ upon the world.

This Sunday June 26, we will celebrate all the graduates of the class of 2016 at the 12:15 pm mass. We invite all graduates with their families to join us in celebrating and praying for them, that they may be guided and blessed by God for a bright and prosperous future.

Marching on to our Golden Jubilee: We are soon to enter into the 50th year of being St. Thomas More Parish-Family. In December of 2016 we will begin the Golden Jubilee year and complete it in December of 2017. It is an important milestone in our parish history, an occasion worthy of celebration. I welcome your suggestions for celebrating it. Please bring your ideas to make it a memorable event to all of us especially to our younger generation.... Let us celebrate in such a way that this event will be left as spiritual and physical symbols for the forthcoming generation.

Religious Freedom in the Year of Mercy: Part I

by Archbishop W. Lori, May 19, 2016

"Mercy and freedom are the same realities. The Year of Mercy sheds light on the struggle to protect religious liberty (and) will help us better understand how we are to cherish and live our freedoms as individuals, as a church, a nation and a society.

"Most people do not know that we live in an age of martyrs...It was only recently that the State Department, was convinced, largely through the efforts of the Knights of Columbus, to declare the violence against Christians (in the Middle East) as genocide.

"In the Middle East and elsewhere in the world, we glimpse what societies without religious freedom look like. We see that once religious freedom disappears, how human dignity suffers and how communities disintegrate... In the West we are complacent about the sometimes-subtle erosion of religious freedom (and) may suffer from what Pope Francis calls "polite persecution", carried out largely in courtrooms, boardrooms, legislatures, and government agencies."
