Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

November 20, 2016 The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ the King of the Universe 2 Samuel 5:1-3 Psalm 122:1-2, 3-4, 4-5 Colossians 1:12-20 Luke 23: 35-43

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke: The rulers sneered at Jesus and said,

"He saved others, let him save himself if he is the chosen one, the Christ of God."

Even the soldiers jeered at him. As they approached to offer him wine they called out,

"If you are King of the Jews, save yourself."

Above him there was an inscription that read, "This is the King of the Jews."

Now one of the criminals hanging there reviled Jesus, saving,

"Are you not the Christ? Save yourself and us." The other, however, rebuking him, said in reply,

"Have you no fear of God, for you are subject to the same condemnation? And indeed, we have been condemned justly, for the sentence we received corresponds to our crimes, but this man has done nothing criminal."

Then he said.

"Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." He replied to him,

"Amen, I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise."

Focus Questions:

- 1. What helps you believe that Jesus remembers you?
- 2. Jesus showed mercy to the good thief. How do you show mercy to others?
- 3. What are you holding onto that you need to let go in order to forgive.

Family and children's question:

Thanksgiving is this week. How can you reach out to others and share with those who are less fortunate?

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Abraham Lincoln once said: "The best thing about the future is that it comes only one day at a time." The future is a mystery. We don't know what it will bring. On the other hand, as T. S. Eliot would say, "Time present and time past/Are both perhaps present in time future/And time future contained in time past," we try to interpret the mystery of the future with past experiences or try to predict it with the present because it is too much for us to bear the mystery of the future.

Today's Gospel teaches us how to handle the mystery of the future. Living the present with the grace of God is the best way to face the future. Jesus warns about future troubles and turmoil, sufferings and sudden attacks from nature, rulers and peoples. In all these situations Jesus asks us not to prepare a defense beforehand for he himself would give us wisdom to speak and defend, that all our adversaries would be powerless to resist and refute. Only our perseverance will secure our lives.

Jesus admonishes us to live our PRESENT fully well. Engaging our total self to live our present in God's grace will lift us up from the burden of the past and the anxiety of the future. Future is a mystery in so far as it invites us to live our present well as a preparation to embrace its newness. The future is a mystery in so far as it is not out of God's control. As God brought us out of the past to this present time God will also lead us through an unknown future. Let us live our present as God's gift to liberate us from the clutches of the past and the anxieties of the future.

Reflections from George Washington, June 29, 1788:

"No one can rejoice more than I do, at every step the people of this great country take to preserve the Union, establish good order and government, and to render the nation happy at home and respectable abroad. No country upon earth ever had it more in its power to attain these blessings than the United States of America.

"Wondrously strange then, and much to be regretted indeed, would it be, were we to neglect the means, and to depart from the road which Providence has pointed us, ...we may now and then get bewildered; but I hope and trust that there is good sense and virtue enough left to recover the right path before we shall be entirely lost."

Growing Hostility to Religion in America:

One law firm dedicated to defending attacks on religious liberty (there are now many such law firms) documented 600 such attacks in 2012. By the end of 2015, they identified over 1,200 such attacks - double the number in just three years. These include hostility to religious expression in the public square, targeting America's religious heritage in public places, religious expression in our public schools, punishing religious business owners for their decisions, and threats to free speech and free exercise. 
