

Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

January 22, 2017
Third Sunday in Ordinary Time
Isaiah 8:23-9:3
Psalm 27:1, 4, 13-14
1 Corinthians 1:10-13, 17
Matthew 4: 12-23

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew:

When Jesus heard that John had been arrested, he withdrew to Galilee. He left Nazareth and went to live in Capernaum by the sea, in the region of Zebulun and Naphtali, that what had been said through Isaiah the prophet might be fulfilled: *Land of Zebulun and land of Naphtali, the way to the sea, beyond the Jordan, Galilee of the Gentiles, the people who sit in darkness have seen a great light, on those dwelling in a land overshadowed by death light has arisen.*

From that time on, Jesus began to preach and say, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand."

As he was walking by the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon who is called Peter, and his brother Andrew, casting a net into the sea; they were fishermen. He said to them, "Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men." At once they left their nets and followed him. He walked along from there and saw two other brothers, James, the son of Zebedee, and his brother John. They were in a boat, with their father Zebedee, mending their nets. He called them, and immediately they left their boat and their father and followed him. He went around all of Galilee, teaching in their synagogues, proclaiming the gospel of the kingdom, and curing every disease and illness among the people.

Focus questions:

1. Jesus invites us into God's Kingdom. Change is required. What do you need to change in your life to enter the Kingdom?
2. Describe a time when you walked in darkness. Who helped you to see the light?
3. Relate a time when you responded to the call of Jesus.

Family and children's question:

Talk about a time when someone showed you the way to God.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Jim's wife was very sick so he called Dr. Griffin. The doctor gave her some medicine and she got worse. He then called Dr. Kurth and he prescribed some other medicine and she got even worse. Jim thought that she was going to die, so he called Dr. Cross who was too busy to attend to her. Eventually Jim's wife got well. What makes one healthy? The medicine? or the body's capacity to heal? Medicine does not produce health. Its function is only to put the body on the right track of regaining its health. The health is there in the body already. Medicine helps the body to revive/restore it.

Likewise in spiritual life, as the first reading says, God restores Israel; God brings back Jacob. They have gone away from the Lord but the Lord wants to bring them back. They may feel that they are the lost sheep. But the Shepherd finds them worthy of being in his flock. God restores and revives the relationship with them.

In the Gospel John the Baptist proclaims that Jesus would baptize with the Holy Spirit. As followers of Christ we are all baptized in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. We have God's grace and power within us. Because of our negligence or ignorance we may not realize our inner worth and spiritual power. But it is there in us. Prayer and sacraments are like the medicines that help us live our inner worth. They put us on the right path of living from God's grace and power.

Help Wanted: Our church-Family of St. Thomas More is blessed and built strongly upon the volunteer service of many ministers and helpers serving in the Spirit of Love. On Friday January 6, 2017 the coordinators of three ministries -- Lectors, Altar Servers and Eucharistic Ministers --had a meeting to discuss ways and means of scheduling the ministers with fewer conflicts.

At present there are 90 Eucharistic ministers, 42 lectors and 60 altar servers. Twenty seven of the 42 lectors serve generously also as Eucharistic ministers. Two young people do double ministries as Lectors and Altar Servers. Thus conflicts would inevitably arise while scheduling the ministers. The coordinators have come up with a computer software to schedule the ministers who are involved in multiple ministries with less conflict. It would also remind the ministers on Wednesday if they are scheduled for Sunday. Ministers also can interact with one another when in need of a substitute. Coordinators are working hard to implement the program as soon as possible. Ministers will be welcomed for training sessions to get used to this program. Please wait for more information.

I thank all the ministers. I greatly appreciate their readiness and willingness to volunteer whenever needed, at the last minute and even when they are not scheduled.

Happy Religious Freedom Sunday!

Let's celebrate America's First Freedom on Jan. 16th, when the President calls upon Americans to "observe this day through appropriate events and activities in homes, schools and places of worship."

This day is the anniversary of the passage, on Jan.16, 1786, of the Virginia Statute of Religious Freedom, drafted by Thomas Jefferson and considered one of his greatest achievements. It stopped the practice of taxing people to pay for the support of the local clergy and it protected the civil rights of people to express their religious beliefs without suffering persecution.

Our recent history reflects this spirit of freedom in protecting our faith.

Jan.15, 1998: "Among the early settlers who came to our shores, many were seeking escape from religious compulsion and persecution. William Penn, Roger Williams and others strove to make their settlements havens for freedom of conscience, laying the foundation for the great tradition of religious liberty that would ultimately be the First Amendment to the Constitution."


