Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

June 18, 2017

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

Deuteronomy 8:2-3, 14b-16a

Psalms 147:12-13, 14-15, 19-20

1 Corinthians 10: 16-17

John 6: 51-58

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John:

Jesus said to the Jewish crowds:

"I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world."

The Jews quarreled among themselves, saying,

"How can this man give us his flesh to eat?"

Jesus said to them,

"Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day. For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him. Just as the living Father sent me and I have life because of the Father, so also the one who feeds on me will have life because of me. This is the bread that came down from heaven. Unlike your ancestors who ate and still died, whoever eats this bread will live forever."

Focus questions:

1. Describe what the Eucharist means to you.
2. Relate how the Eucharist related to your everyday life.
3. Jesus instructed his followers to "Do this in remembrance of me." What importance do those words have for you? For the community?

Family and children's question:

If Jesus were right next to you today, what would you say to him?

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

A conductor, at the rehearsal, said to the trumpet player, “I think this part calls for a more Wagnerian approach – if you get what I mean – something more assertive, so to speak, more accentuated, with more body, more depth, more....”

The trumpet player interrupted. “Do you want it louder, sir?”

All that poor conductor could say was, “Yes, that’s what I mean”.

Like music, God is more an experience than an explanation. God is not merely dry truth that we can describe or define; rather God is a living person with whom we have to relate.

Today is Trinity Sunday. We celebrate God not as an unexplainable abstract truth but as One God who relates with us in three persons; God, the Father relates with us as our creator, God, the Son became one of us to reconcile us with God and others; God, the Holy Spirit sanctifies (uplifts) us to our original identity of being God’s children.

No human words can exhaust the reality of God. No human thoughts or images can fully explain who God is and what God’s nature is. But if we allow God to relate with us, as today’s readings say, we will be able to experience God’s mercy, kindness, forgiveness, grace, love, fellowship etc. Our celebration of God is not to define who God is, but to express our willingness to experience who God is for us.

Today we celebrate our Parish Patron St. Thomas More. For the last nine days we prayed the Novena to him for the various intentions of our parishioners. This is our Golden Jubilee celebration of our Patron. As in the Bible (Book of Numbers 25), God blesses with inner freedom and prosperity on the Fiftieth Year. We have been celebrating our blessings since last December through various events, both social and spiritual.

Our Patron is a family man married with four children. When his wife Jane died, he remarried a widow, Alice and became foster father to her two daughters. Thus we found it fit to celebrate all our married couples and their families on St. Thomas More’s Feast Day. At the 12:15 pm mass, we will celebrate, thank and pray for the married couples of all ages. We will also gratefully remember those spouses who are with God and pray for their widows or widowers.

During Feast Weekend masses I will also speak at all the masses about our Sanctuary Renovation; how much progress we have made in our Capital Campaign and how everyone can be a part of it.

The STM Golf Committee planted a Weeping Cherry Tree and memorial stone in Judy Granville's memory. The tree and stone were blessed by Father Antony.



Bibles Banned:

Florida Amid pressure from atheist groups, Orange County Public Schools banned voluntary Bible distribution in high schools on January 16, National Religious Freedom Day. The previous three years, Bibles were placed on a table in a common area for students to pick up if they chose. But when satanists and anti-religion groups announced plans to pass out their own pamphlets, such as "An X-Rated Book - sex & obscenity in the Bible" and others, the district decided to ban Bibles along with the objectionable materials.

"State of Libraries Report" for 2016 The Holy Bible finished 6th on the 10 most "challenged" books for schools and libraries. The other 9 books on the list contained demeaning sexual content.

"That anyone would consider banning the Bible - a book that helped shape Western thought - from public libraries, whether in your school or neighborhood, is dangerously close to the very censorship the First Amendment is designed to prevent," said First Liberty Institute senior counsel, Jeremy Dys.
