Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

July 2, 2017 Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time 2 Kings 4:8-11, 14-16a Psalm 89:203, 16-17, 18-19 Romans 6:3-4, 8-11 Matthew 10:37-42

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew:

Jesus said to his apostles:

"Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me, and whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me; and whoever does not take up his cross and follow after me is not worthy of me. Whoever finds his life will lose it, and whoever loses his life for my sake will find it.

"Whoever receives you receives me, and whoever receives me receives the one who sent me. Whoever receives a prophet because he is a prophet will receive a prophet's reward, and whoever receives a righteous man because he is a righteous man will receive a righteous man's reward. And whoever gives only a cup of cold water to one of these little ones to drink because the little one is a disciple—amen, I say to you, he will surely not lose his reward."

Focus questions:

1. Relate a time when you were made to feel welcome. How did that affect you?

2. How hard is it to put loving Jesus before your family and friends?

3. Relate a time when you thought God was asking you to do something difficult.

Family and children's question:

Talk about a time when you did something for someone without expecting a reward.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

"When bull elephants fight, the grass always loses." This African Proverb pictures exactly what happens when two people fight to take their vengeance on each other. Nobody wins. Vengeance can never win. It only keeps the fighting alive as long as it lives. But in the battle of vengeance, love is lost forever. Vengeance fires up the negatives in humans and burns them alive. Love alone can grow the positives in humans and keep them alive both now and forever.

In the first reading Prophet Jeremiah entrusts himself to God and leaves vengeance to God when he is tempted to act vengefully against his enemies. He prays to God to rescue him from the power of the wicked. Instead of reacting to the evil with evil, Prophet Jeremiah's prayer to God is to make him as a pure act of God. The best way of responding evil is to allow not the vengeance but God to act in us.

In the Gospel Jesus advises the same to his disciples while sending them in his name to do his mission. Nothing happens without the knowledge of God. Not even a sparrow, which is sold for a small coin, falls to the ground without the Father's knowledge. Jesus states that we are worth more than many sparrows. God cares for us so meticulously that even the hairs of our head are counted. Thus Jesus asks us to engage all our energy positively to promote life in and around each of us. Like Jeremiah and like the disciples let us entrust our cause to God and live positively.

The Capital Campaign Thermometer at the Narthex shows how much we have already made and how much more we have to do in order to reach our goal of a million dollars. You must have also received a brochure by mail explaining the ways and modes of making your pledge. I thank all those who have already pledged their contribution. Thank you for your generosity. May God continue to bless you and inspire you to make the right offering, for as St. Paul writes to his believers in Corinth, God loves a cheerful giver. (2 Cor. 9:7).

Frank Bayer who captures all the celebrative moments of the parish, has come forward to photograph the families. The nuns we met clearly put into action the words of Mother Teresa:


"God so loved the world that He gave His only Son.


