Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

July 16, 2017 Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time Isaiah 55:10-11 Psalm 65:10, 11, 12-13, 14 Romans 8:18-23 Matthew 13:1-23

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew: On that day, Jesus went out of the house and sat down by the sea. Such large crowds gathered around him that he got into a boat and sat down, and the whole crowd stood along the shore. And he spoke to them at length in parables, saying:

"A sower went out to sow. And as he sowed, some seed fell on the path, and birds came and ate it up. Some fell on rocky ground, where it had little soil. It sprang up at once because the soil was not deep, and when the sun rose it was scorched, and it withered for lack of roots. Some seed fell among thorns, and the thorns grew up and choked it. But some seed fell on rich soil and produced fruit, a hundred or sixty or thirtyfold.

Focus questions:

- 1. Share a time when you heard God speaking through someone you knew or something you read.
- 2. What do you do to be a more faithful hearer of God's word.
- 3. Who do you help to hear the word of God?

Family and children's question:

Support local farmers by buying some of the food they sell at farm stands.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Jack: My wife used to play the piano a lot, but since the children came, she does not have time.

Mack: Children are a comfort. Aren't they?

Annoying children would become comforting ones for dad when they free him from hearing mom playing the piano. Even a problem can be considered as a blessing if it can solve another bigger problem. It is like swallowing a bitter pill to be relieved of a crucial pain.

In today's Gospel Jesus promises to give rest to those who labor and are heavily burdened. He liberates us from our burden by placing his yoke upon us. We are liberated from the yoke in the sense that we are still going to carry a yoke but an easy and light one.

Jesus tells us that as humans we cannot be totally free from burdens. Humans by nature have to bear one kind of burden or the other because of who we are and what we do with ourselves and others. But if we follow Jesus' way of living, our life's natural burdens will be made easy and light to carry. Jesus would teach us from his heart the meekness and humility which will make our daily burdens as an easy and light yoke to carry. Let us follow Jesus with faith and learn from him the way and be empowered by him for the strength to make our yoke easy and burden light.

For some of us, it's work, but then we get to go to the beach whenever we can....for some of us, it's babysitting for non-camp grandchildren who are out of school for the summer, and for others, well, it's an amazing variety of lifestyle choices. Some of us, though, don't have choices. Some of the people living in the St. Thomas More parish boundary are in poverty. They worry about food to feed their children...about gas for their car (if they have one) and clothes for the family. We don't help with clothing (we direct them to St. Vincent de Paul Society) but we can help with food. We do that mainly through the generosity and compassion of our parishioners, who donate what they can. Please continue to do that...we depend on you!

The nuns we met clearly put into action the words of Mother Teresa:


"God so loved the world that He gave His only Son.

Religious Freedom Victory at Supreme Court:

The Supreme Court ruled decisively on June 26, in a 7-2 decision, that denying a church "an otherwise available public benefit on account of its religious status," violates the Free Exercise Clause of the First Amendment

The State of Missouri had prohibited a Lutheran preschool from participating in a public benefit program that provided school playgrounds with recycled rubberized material made out of old tires in order to resurface their playground. State officials believed this benefit would be an unconstitutional state endorsement of religion.

In his majority decision, Chief Justice Roberts wrote, "the exclusion of Trinity Lutheran from a public benefit for which it is otherwise qualified, solely because it is a church, is odious to our Constitution and cannot stand."

Sadly, Justices Sonia Sotomayor and Ruth Bader Ginsburg argued that Christian groups should be denied access to these programs - unless and until they give up their religious identity.


CEREAL BOX TOP COUPONS—Drop them off in the Church lobby drop-off box and we will use them to buy things for the students in our regional school.
