## Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

July 23, 2017 Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time Wisdom 12:13, 16-19 Psalm 86:5-6, 9-10, 15-16 (5a) Romans 8:26-27 Matthew 13:24-43

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew:

Jesus proposed another parable to the crowds, saying:
"The kingdom of heaven may be likened to a man who sowed good seed in his field. While everyone was asleep his enemy came and sowed weeds all through the wheat, and then went off. When the crop grew and bore fruit, the weeds appeared as well. The slaves of the householder came to him and said, 'Master, did you not sow good seed in your field? Where have the weeds come from?'
He answered, 'An enemy has done this.'

His slaves said to him, 'Do you want us to go and pull them up?' He replied, 'No, if you pull up the weeds you might uproot the wheat along with them.

Let them grow together until harvest; then at harvest time I will say to the harvesters,

"First collect the weeds and tie them in bundles for burning; but gather the wheat into my barn.""

### **Focus questions:**

- 1. Have you ever felt your spiritual growth wither? What did you do?
- 2. How do you respond to the people in your life who are like weeds, choking the plants, keeping you from growing?
- 3. Describe a time when something good began as a small thing and mushroomed into something larger than you thought.

### Family and children's question:

Talk about how you and your family can take better care of the earth by reducing, recycling and re-using.

### FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends.

Employer: We want a responsible man for this job.

Applicant: Well, I guess I'm your man. In all the other jobs I have worked at, whenever anything went wrong, they told me I was responsible.

We are always responsible either for what we do or for what we do not do. Our life is in our hands. When we don't make it we lose it.

In today's Gospel Jesus compares our life to a seed. It is our responsibility either to just remain as a seed or to allow ourselves to be thrown at the right soil and nurtured in the right way. Our germinating and growing, flowering and bearing fruit depend on where we would allow our seed to fall. Our choice of being on the road will make our capacity to germinate to be stolen away by anybody who passes us by. If we happen to sow our seed on the rock of habits and convenient philosophies, we will not have enough soil of grace to grow and will soon dry and wither away without

If we choose to fall among the bush, we will easily be choked by various useless thoughts and lazy convictions. But if we allow ourselves to fall on good soil, we, as the God-created seed, will bear fruit to our full capacity. May all our prayers and meditations enrich our belief in God, to realize our real potential as God's seed.

Some of us, though, don't have choices. Some of the people living in the St. Thomas More parish boundary are in poverty. They worry about food to feed their children...about gas for their car (if they have one) and clothes for the family. We don't help with clothing (we direct them to St. Vincent de Paul Society) but we can help with food. We do that mainly through the generosity and compassion of our parishioners, who donate what they can. Please continue to do that...we depend on you!

(They also provide a homeless shelter for 20 men).

When work was done, we were able to pray in the sisters' chapel and view some of Mother Teresa's mementos. She is the founder of this order. It was a tiring, but energizing day.

"God so loved the world that He gave His only Son.

God still loves the world and sends you and me to be His love,

His compassion to the poor."

Beats Back Challenge to Religious Liberty - for now:

California: On June 23, 2017, a second CA court rejected a lawsuit against Chabad of Irvine, a small Orthodox Jewish Synagogue, but it is still under legal attack. Animal rights groups, attempting to block the congregation from participating in their religious atonement ritual that takes place between Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kipper, have now appealed to the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals - just one step below the U.S. Supreme Court.

During the centuries-old religious ceremony, the atonement of sins is contemplated through prayer and the humane, Kosher killing of chickens, reminding participants of their own mortality. "To be ordered to stop our religious practice because some refuse to tolerate our beliefs was deeply distressing," said Rabbi Alter Tenenbaum.

Had the first and second lawsuits been successful, the synagogue's religious ceremony would have been declared a "business practice," putting at risk the religious practices of every mosque, church, temple, synagogue, or house of worship by transforming their religious ceremonies into government-regulated business practices.
