



Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

August 13, 2017 Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time 1 Kings 19:9a, 11-13a Psalm 85:9, 10, 11-12, 13-14 Romans 9:1-5 Matthew 14:22-33

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew:

After he had fed the people, Jesus made the disciples get into a boat and precede him to the other side, while he dismissed the crowds.

After doing so, he went up on the mountain by himself to pray. When it was evening he was there alone.

Meanwhile the boat, already a few miles offshore, was being tossed about by the waves, for the wind was against it. During the fourth watch of the night, he came toward them walking on the sea. When the disciples saw him walking on the sea they were terrified.

"It is a ghost," they said, and they cried out in fear. At once Jesus spoke to them, "Take courage, it is I; do not be afraid."

Peter said to him in reply,

"Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water."

He said, "Come."

Peter got out of the boat and began to walk on the water toward Jesus. But when he saw how strong the wind was he became frightened; and, beginning to sink, he cried out, "Lord, save me!"

Immediately Jesus stretched out his hand and caught Peter, and said to him, "O you of little faith, why did you doubt?" After they got into the boat, the wind died down.

Those who were in the boat did him homage, saying,

"Truly, you are the Son of God."

Focus questions:

1. Relate a time when you found yourself sinking. Did you call out "Lord save me" or try to rely on your own Resources? .

2. Where in your daily schedule do you find time to listen to God?.

3. Relate a time when fear was more powerful than trust.

Family and children's question:

Jesus went off to pray. How often did you find time to pray this week? What can you do to allow more time to pray??

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

A rancher asked a veterinarian for some free advice. "I have a horse that walks normally sometimes, and sometimes he limps. What shall I do?"

The veterinarian replied, "The next time he walks normally, sell him."

Life has its own glory-times as well as gloomy ones. Of course we always prefer to live in glory-time.

Today's Gospel narrates one of the Glory-times of Jesus. Jesus transfigured and shone like the sun in his human body. But on their way down from the mountain after the transfiguration, Jesus forbids the Apostles to relate this vision to anyone until He has been raised from the dead. Jesus seems to connect his glorious moment of transfiguration with his most sorrowful and shameful death on the cross. His Glory-time is connected with his Gory time.

God in his Godly essence is full of glory. St. Paul describes (Phil.2:7-8) that God became a slave dying on the cross to serve life to us. God is a Supreme Being as well as a humble servant. The transfiguration of God affirms to us that God's supremacy or servanthood are not opposed but complement each other. Thus the feast of Transfiguration enlightens us to see both our glory and gloomy times as complementary factors. In our glory we are called to serve and in our gloomy time we are called to rise to our God-given glory.

Prose and Prayer: Mary Ellen Carroll is giving a course on Prose and Prayer explaining how God wrote our story with us in the past and what God wants to write with us in future and how God writes our present with us and fellow humans. It is a spiritual exercise of writing God's journal of our life. It begins on Monday, August 7th and continues for the following three Mondays from 7:00 pm to 8:30 pm in Walden Hall. We hope to begin work on the first of October and finish it by Christmas. During the time of renovation the church will remain closed. We will have our daily and weekend masses and all the other sacramental celebrations in Walden and Kirwin Hall.

Please bear with the inconvenience. Our patience and co-operation to accommodate the inconveniences with a smile will be a Godgiven moment of grace to build and grow as a community of love and service. Thank you for your understanding.

We are in conversation with Sauder Worship who will do the upholstery of the seats and kneelers. We are slowly beginning the renovation. As Psalm 127 says, "Unless the Lord build the house, they labor in vain who build. Unless the Lord guard the city, in vain does the guard keep watch." Let us pray that the renovation work may renew our faith in God.

On Saturday July 28th the Attar Servers had a Garage Sale to raise fund to meet the cost of new albs in celebration of our Parish Golden Jubilee. I thank Dottie who coordinated this event from the beginning to end with such success, raising more money than we expected. I know how challenging scheduling family activities can be but I truly appreciate whatever time the servers were able to give but I cannot go without a special thanks to the Fortmeyer and Vermilyea Families (not only servers but parents and siblings and Grandpa too!). We also had some familiar parishioners, Ann Anatrella and Eileen Weidig who gave up their entire weekend to make sure this sale went smoothly and profitably.



Parents' Freedom of Conscience vs State & Doctor Assisted Dying

Two Cautionary Tales:

England: Charlie Gard, an 11 month-old baby born with a rare genetic disease, died on July 28 after being removed from his ventilator despite his parents' objections. For many months they had petitioned the courts to release Charlie from the hospital in order to seek experimental treatment in America. However, the hospital argued in court against the rights of Charlie's parents to decide their son's course of care. English and European courts ruled that the hospital could block his parents' wishes and pull Charlie's life support.

Then, mounting public pressure plus the support of Pope Francis and President Trump caused the court to request that an American specialist come to England to examine Charlie. Unfortunately, this examination was a few months too late since Charlie's muscles were too significantly deteriorated for treatment to help. Had Charlie been allowed to be examined sooner, his parents said, he would "have had the potential to be a normal, healthy little boy." They lamented "a whole lot of wasted time."

Los Angeles: On August 25, 2016, 2-year old Israel Stinson was removed from a breathing ventilator at Children's Hospital of Los Angeles, after a judge upheld the hospital's decision to remove life support against the parents' wishes. The family is "devastated," said Life Legal Defense Foundation. "They lost their son yesterday after a long, long battle for him and for his life."

We are working on collecting and duplicating the final items for our parish history project. The next few months will be spent in completing the video editing so that it may be shown to the parish in September.



CEREAL BOX TOP COUPONS—Drop them off in the Church lobby drop-off box and we will use them to buy things for the students in our regional school.


USED CELL PHONES—We thank everyone for giving us their old cell phones. We forward them to a
