



Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

August 20, 2017
Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time
Isaiah 56:1, 6-7
Psalm 67:2-3, 5, 6, 8
Romans 11: 13-15, 29-32
Matthew 15: 21-28

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew:

At that time, Jesus withdrew to the region of Tyre and Sidon. And behold, a Canaanite woman of that district came and called out,

"Have pity on me, Lord, Son of David! My daughter is tormented by a demon."

But Jesus did not say a word in answer to her.

Jesus' disciples came and asked him,

"Send her away, for she keeps calling out after us."

He said in reply,

"I was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel."

But the woman came and did Jesus homage, saying, "Lord, help me."

He said in reply,

"It is not right to take the food of the children and throw it to the dogs."

She said, "Please, Lord, for even the dogs eat the scraps that fall from the table of their masters."

Then Jesus said to her in reply,

"O woman, great is your faith! Let it be done for you as you wish."

And the woman's daughter was healed from that hour.

Focus questions:

1. Name someone in your life who never gave up. How did this person's attitude affect you?
2. Relate an experience when your persistence had positive results in a way you did not expect.
3. Describe a time when you relied on deep faith to help you face a crisis.

Family and children's question:

How do you and your children treat those who are different from you?

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Wife: I can't sleep, dear. I keep thinking there's a mouse under the bed.

Husband: Well, start thinking there's a cat under the bed and go back to sleep.

Today's readings admonish us to come out of our preconceived ideas or prejudices in order to grasp the truth of God.

In the first reading Prophet Elijah expects God to appear in big and glamorous ways amidst heavy wind, earthquake, or fire. But God spoke to him in a tiny whispering sound. God came to him in an unexpected ordinary way.

In the Gospel Peter and the other disciples see Jesus walking on the sea. When Peter was given the grace of walking on the water like Jesus, he, though able to walk on the water, began to sink due to lack of faith in Jesus, fearful of the wind and waves. Just a simple and unwavering faith in Jesus would have empowered Peter to walk on water.

Each of us has our own understanding about life and the people we live with. But the truth that God wants to reveal to us through these people and events of life is bigger than our simple understanding of them. All that God wants us to do is to have an open heart like Elijah, to come out of our preconceived ideas and images in order to grasp the truth in unexpected ordinary ways. God calls us to have simple unwavering faith in order to do things that our human power cannot do.

This Tuesday August 15th we celebrate the Assumption of our Blessed Mother Mary. She is God's great demonstration of how God can exalt a simple insignificant woman from Nazareth to the highest dignity of being God's mother and taking her to be near God in heaven (assumption) all because of her unwavering faith in God. Let pray to God through her intercession to have a simple and unwavering faith like her.

The feast of Assumption is a Holy Day of obligation. We have a Vigil mass on Monday August 14th at 7:00 pm. On August 15th the masses are at 9:00 am and 7:00 pm.

Fr. Antony's Bible Study: How to get interested in the Bible and what to look for in it? What do those ancient stories tell us? You may have many questions like these? Fr. Antony will give a class on 'Reading the Bible' for four Tuesdays in September- 5, 12, 19 and 26 in the Church from 7:00 pm to 8:30 pm. Please call the rectory if you plan to attend.

Marble Tradition: When we traced back our Parish history we found out that the marble work of our existing sanctuary was done by Innocente Mozzacco. In our prayer and further research, God led us to his son Elliot Mozzacco who owns the business, now called Lido Stone Works. He graciously accepted to continue his dad's tradition of laying the new marble floor for the renovated sanctuary. A group of parishioners donated their time and talent to choose the right marble. Elliot has started the primary work.

We hope to begin work on the Sanctuary on October 1st and hope to finish it by Christmas. During the time of renovation the church will remain closed. We will have our daily and weekend masses and all the other sacramental celebrations in Walden and Kirwin Hall. Please bear with the inconvenience. Our patience and co-operation to accommodate the inconveniences with a smile will be a God-given moment of grace to build and grow as a community of love and service. Thank you for your understanding.

We are in conversation with Sauder Worship who will do the upholstery of the seats and kneelers.

Soon we will work on the new lights for the Parking Lot. They will provide more light as we will use long lasting and energy efficient LED lamps. The new paving for the parking lot will take place next year after we finish the sanctuary renovation this year.

We are slowly beginning the renovation works in and around the church. As Psalm 127 says, "Unless the Lord build the house, they labor in vain who build. Unless the Lord guard the city, in vain does the guard keep watch." Let us pray that the renovation work may renew our faith in God.



Freedom of Religion Imposters:

Under the guise of claiming religious freedom, anti-religion and atheist groups promoting Satanic Temples, monuments, black masses, and after-school Satan Clubs, are intent on mainstreaming Satanism in America. These satanic groups seek social acceptance and want to be viewed as normal.

Most communities have chosen to peacefully protest these anti-God groups. In Belle Plaine, MN, Satanists claimed the right to erect a satanic monument in the Veterans' Park after the City Council reinstated the placement of a two-foot-tall iron statue of a soldier praying over a grave marked with a cross. The community's vigorous opposition to the monument led the Council to vote on July 17, 2017, to abolish the park's free speech zone - the proposed site for the monument - and the satanists' move was defeated. One demonstrator said the monument "is not the message of life and love, it is the message of death and decay."

The Satanic Temple tried to organize a "Black Mass" at Harvard University in 2014 before a student group moved the event off campus. The satanists also created an Elementary School after-school program to promote their beliefs and worked to install a satanic statue at the Oklahoma State Capital. Again, citizens rejected these efforts. Another group set up a Satanic Church in Spring, TX, a suburb of Houston and citizens protested.

"Using the false argument of religious freedom, ...(these groups) seek to put Satan in the news and make Satanists accepted at the table," wrote John Horvat, author of *Return To Order*.

"We should be inspired by the individual person of action," wrote Rabbi Aryeh Spero, author of *Push Back*. "It is remarkable what one person can do when he stands proud and pushes back."


CEREAL BOX TOP COUPONS—Drop them off in the Church lobby drop-off box and we will use them to buy things for the students in our regional school.






