Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

August 27, 2017 Twenty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time Isaiah 22: 19-23 Psalm 138: 1-2, 2-3, 6, 8 Romans 11: 35-36 Matthew 16: 13-20

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew:

Jesus went into the region of Caesarea Philippi and he asked his disciples, "Who do people say that the Son of Man is?" They replied, "Some say John the Baptist, others Elijah, still others Jeremiah or one of the prophets." He said to them, "But who do you say that I am?" Simon Peter said in reply, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." Jesus said to him in reply. "Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah. For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my heavenly Father. And so I say to you, you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it. I will give you the keys to the kingdom of heaven. Whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven; and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven." Then he strictly ordered his disciples to tell no one that he was the Christ. **Focus questions:** 1. How would you describe your relationship with Jesus? 2. What qualities do you see in yourself that Jesus saw in 3. Describe the impact the words of Jesus to Peter about the church have on you. Family and children's question: Talk about the importance of Jesus in your life.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

It was the little girl's first day at school. The teacher asked her,

"What is your father's name?"

"Daddy" replied the child.

"Yes, I know, but what does your mother call him?"

"Oh, she doesn't call him anything, she likes him!"

A name is a human convenience to distinguish one from the other. Faith and love recognize and relate beyond all distinctions and discriminations. God is love and does not need a name or distinguished quality to relate with us. Likewise, for those who have faith, God is seen everywhere and in all persons beyond name, color and creed. In the world of love and faith, names and all their distinctions collapse. They become unnecessary and meaningless.

In the Gospel today we see the power of faith that changes even the plan of God. God's plan in Christ is, as Jesus says, to work primarily with the lost sheep of the house of Israel. Thus Jesus tries to ignore the request of a non-Israelite woman. But we read that the relentless cry of her faith obliges Jesus to attend to her wish and cure her daughter.

Faith-filled prayer will never go unanswered or ignored even by God because faith breaks all distinctions and reconciles all discriminations. It unites the wills of God and of the one who prays to God. Faith and love bring God and humans together. Yes it is true, as St. Paul says "all things work for good for those who love God."

Antony will give a class on 'Reading the Bible' for four Tuesdays in September-- 9/5, 9/12, 9/19 and 9/26-- in the Church from 7:00 pm to 8:30 pm. Please call the rectory if you plan to attend. **Marble Tradition:** Elliot Mozzacco of Innocente Mozzacco who originally laid the marble in the existing sanctuary, is taking up the marble work for the renovated sanctuary. With a team of parishioners, we have already selected the texture and the color of the marble. Elliot has started the primary work.

We are in conversation with Sauder Worship who will do the upholstery of the seats and kneelers. The linoleum and the carpet for the floor of the main Church will be replaced.

We hope to begin the work of Sanctuary Renovation on the first of October and complete it by Christmas. During the time of renovation the church will remain closed. We will have our daily and weekend masses and all the other sacramental celebrations in Walden and Kirwin Hall.

Please bear with the inconvenience. Our patience and co-operation to accommodate the inconveniences with a smile will be a God-given moment of grace to build and grow as community of love and service. Thank you for your understanding. **Soon we will work on the new lights for the Parking Lot.** They will light the lot better than the present lamps. They will be long lasting and energy efficient LED lamps. The new paving for the parking lot will take place next year as we will finish the sanctuary renovation this year.

Catholics For Freedom of Religion was happy to provide our ideas and resources to laymen and clergy. We shared our mission to educate and inspire, on a non-partisan basis, for First Amendment Freedom of Religion - how rare it is, how dearly it was purchased for us and how quickly it can be lost. 




