Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

September 17, 2017 Twenty-Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time Sirach 27:30-28:7 Psalm 103:1-2, 3-4, 9-10, 11-12 Romans 14: 7-9 Matthew 18: 21-35

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew: Peter approached Jesus and asked him, "Lord, if my brother sins against me, how often must I forgive? As many as seven times?"

Jesus answered, "I say to you, not seven times but seventy-seven times. That is why the kingdom of heaven may be likened to a king who decided to settle accounts with his servants. When he began the accounting, a debtor was brought before him who owed him a huge amount. Since he had no way of paying it back, his master ordered him to be sold, along with his wife, his children, and all his property, in payment of the debt. At that, the servant fell down, did him homage, and said, 'Be patient with me, and I will pay you back in full.' Moved with compassion the master of that servant let him go and forgave him the loan.

When that servant had left, he found one of his fellow servants who owed him a much smaller amount. He seized him and started to choke him, demanding, 'Pay back what you owe.' Falling to his knees, his fellow servant begged him, 'Be patient with me, and I will pay you back.' But he refused. Instead, he had the fellow servant put in prison until he paid back the debt. Now when his fellow servants saw what had happened, they were deeply disturbed, and went to their master and reported the whole affair. His master summoned him and said to him, 'You wicked servant! I forgave you your entire debt because you begged me to. Should you not have had pity on your fellow servant, as I had pity on you?' Then in anger his master handed him over to the torturers until he should pay back the whole debt. So will my heavenly Father do to you, unless each of you forgives your brother from your heart."

Focus questions:

- 1. Describe a time when you regretted not responding to another's need.
- 2. Relate a time when you found it hard to forgive.
- 3. Talk of a time when someone forgave a debt or obligation you owed. How did that affect you?

Family and children's question:

Talk about a time when you forgave someone. How did that person react?

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

He: Will you marry me?

She: No.

And they lived happily ever after.

This little joke is said to explain how living together will not always be happy. When two people live together, they begin to experience two different worlds of thoughts, emotions, expressions, and decisions. This in turn makes them either grow cherishing their differences in each other or to argue about their differences with each other.

Today's Gospel explains how to live with the differences that we are unable to tolerate in the other or the hurts that we suffer from each other. First we have to try if we can reconcile one on one. If not, try with the community-court system of establishing who is right by facts and witnesses. If these two ways fail, then the Church tries to bring them to terms through religious values of forgiveness, compassion etc.

If none of these works, the Gospel suggests totally a new way to repair the strained relationship. This approach does not start with how different we are. It encourages us to experience the possible rich relationship whenever two or three come together in Jesus's name. In our living together we can experience primarily the experience of Jesus living with us. Our living together, humanly speaking is to adjust with our differences, but divinely speaking it is a great opportunity of experiencing Jesus among ourselves and lifting us up to the God's experience in each other. Let us start with God, not our differences, in order to experience life in its richness.

Parking Lot New Lights: At night our parking light shines like the day. Bringing bright light is the first phase of our renovation project which we are ready to launch in the coming months. Guided by the building committee and Finance Council, Steve Lott coordinated this work, and on your behalf I thank him.

We are waiting for permission from the diocese to begin the work in October. Having been guided by the Diocesan Department of Construction and Renovation, our building committee submitted all that is needed to the diocese. It is not merely what we do or strive. It is primarily what God builds us to be. Renovating the sanctuary is only an occasion and opportunity to renew each of us and to grow together as a community of God. So please pray that all will go well and that we will soon get the permission from the diocese and the cooperation of all the various workers to begin and finish the work of renovation on time.

Thanks to your generosity the Capital Campaign has reached almost 80% of our million dollar goal. I request those who still pray about contributing, to please make your donation to enable us to reach our goal.



Religious Persecution - 2016 Worst Year on Record:

Before that, the worst year was 2015 and before that, 2014, reported the Center for Studies on New Religions. Christians killed for their faith have been in the tens of thousands and as many as 600 million were prevented from practicing their faith through "intimidation, forced conversions, bodily harm or even death."

Persecution is at historic levels and getting worse. North Korea tops the list of offenders but Islamic countries account for nearly all major persecution of Christians. Some of the world's oldest Christian communities are simply going extinct due to the continuing Syrian civil war and the aggression of ISIS throughout the Middle East.

Now Russia has been included in a new global report from the U.S. Commission on International Religious Freedom. "Not only has Russia continually intensified its repression of religious freedom at home," the commissioners wrote, "it has also expanded its repressive policies to territory of a neighboring country (Crimea and eastern Ukraine) where 'religious freedom is at the whim of armed militias not beholden to any legal authority.""

"The right to practice any faith, or have no faith, is a fundamental human right of all people, no matter where they live," said Sen. James Lankford. He is concerned that America's hostility to religious liberty at home has led to incredible indifference abroad. (state.gov, 7/19/17; worldwatchmonitor.org; opendoorsusa.org)


CEREAL BOX TOP COUPONS—Drop them off in the Church lobby drop-off box and we will use them to buy things for the students in our regional school.
