Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

November 26, 2017 The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe Ezekiel 34:11-12, 15-17 Psalm 23: 1-2, 2-3, 5-6 1 Corinthians 15: 20-26, 28 Matthew 25: 31-46

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew:

Jesus said to his disciples: "When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, he will sit upon his glorious throne, and all the nations will be assembled before him. And he will separate them one from another, as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. He will place the sheep on his right and the goats on his left. Then the king will say to those on his right, 'Come, you who are blessed by my Father. Inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, a stranger and you welcomed me, naked and you clothed me, ill and you cared for me, in prison and you visited me.' Then the righteous will answer him and say, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you drink? When did we see you a stranger and welcome you, or naked and clothe you? When did we see you ill or in prison, and visit you?' And the king will say to them in reply, 'Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of the least brothers of mine, you did for me.' Then he will say to those on his left, 'Depart from me, you accursed, into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels. For I was hungry and you gave me no food, I was thirsty and you gave me no drink, a stranger and you gave me no welcome, naked and you gave me no clothing, ill and in prison, and you did not care for me.'

Then they will answer and say, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or ill or in prison, and not minister to your needs?'

He will answer them, 'Amen, I say to you, what you did not do for one of these least ones, you did not do for me.'

And these will go off to eternal punishment, but the righteous to eternal life."

Focus questions:

- 1. After reading the Gospel, do you consider yourself a sheep or a goat? What do you have to do to become more of a sheep?
- 2. Describe a time when you found it difficult to do what God was asking of you.
- 3. Relate a time when you or someone you knew judged those in need as not worthy of help.

Family and children's question:

Talk about what you can do to respond to someone who is hungry, thirsty, in need of clothes or shelter, sick or imprisoned.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

When I googled "the worth of human body" this is what I found, "The current monetary worth placed on the basic "elements" in an individual human body is \$4.50: \$3.50 for the skin and the remainder of the worth assigned in the aggregate to the major elements — \$1.00" For most of us the value of the human body is priceless; but we do well to remember a quote attributed to Thomas Edison, "From his neck down a man is worth a couple of dollars a day, from his neck up he is worth anything that his brain can produce."

Today's Gospel story of Jesus explains that our worth depends upon our contribution to life. We can be creative to double our worth like the first two servants. Or we can bury our worth like the third servant trying to find excuses or justifications for our inactiveness. The meaning and joy of living does not consist of how much or how little we have. **Life is basically creative.** Whoever creatively applies all that they are and all that they have, will find the true meaning of life and the joy of living. Life is a creative application of oneself not a mechanical production of one's possessions. Life is a creative engagement of one's whole self with the confidence of growing, not reducing oneself with unnecessary and imaginary fear. Let us pray that all our deeds and words be the creative expression of promoting growth and liveliness.

This Thursday is the Great Feast of Thanksgiving. Thanksgiving is the moment when we stop and look at life to be much more than a mechanical production or a business contract. We celebrate this feast at the end of the harvest. We witnessed in nature how each single seed has brought forth multiple fruit. We laid out a very small amount and nature creatively paid us back in abundance. Just the realization of this abundance inspires in us a feeling called THANKSGIVING. Likewise our relationships in life offer us much more than we put in them. In this mystery of abundant reward from Nature and Life's relationship let us stop for a moment to reflect and raise our hearts in appreciations of the gifts that made us who we are and offered to us all what we have. Happy Thanksgiving to all of you who are the primary reasons of my being, who I am and of having all that I have. HAPPY THANKSGIVING.

And lest we not forget, CHRISTMAS is coming!!!! The Giving Tree will be set up over the week-end of November 18th.



Thanksgiving: The Religious Freedom Holiday

The Pilgrims who established the first Thanksgiving Day were in search of the freedom to practice their faith after being persecuted, arrested and fined for their form of Christianity. After fleeing England, their beloved mother country, and a ten-year sojourn in Holland, these so-called "separatists" prayerfully decided to depart for America to find what the governor of Plymouth, William Bradford, called "freedom of religion for all men."

There were 102 Pilgrims aboard the Mayflower who suffered the 67 days of rough sailing before they finally landed at Plymouth Bay in November, 1620.


After indescribable hardships, by March, 1621, less than a year after arriving, only 51 of the original 102 remained alive. Fortunately, some Native Americans taught the Pilgrims survival skills in this new land, and at the end of their first harvest, they decided to hold a feast of celebration and thanksgiving to God for their harvest, newfound friends, and freedom to worship as their hearts desired.

Now, almost 400 years later, let us reflect on the sacrifice of these brave souls who valued their freedom of religion above all security and comfort and have bequeathed to us this gift.
