



Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

January 14, 2018 Second Sunday of Ordinary Time 1 Samuel 3:3B-10, 19 Psalm: 40:2, 4, 7-8, 8-9, 10 1 Corinthians 6:13C-15A, 17-20 John 1:35-42

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John:

John was standing with two of his disciples, and as he watched Jesus walk by, he said,

"Behold, the Lamb of God."

The two disciples heard what he said and followed Jesus. Jesus turned and saw them following him and said to them, "What are you looking for?"

They said to him, "Rabbi" — which translated means Teacher —, "where are you staying?"

He said to them, "Come, and you will see."

So they went and saw where Jesus was staying, and they stayed with him that day. It was about four in the afternoon. Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter, was one of the two who heard John and followed Jesus. He first found his own brother Simon and told him.

"We have found the Messiah" — which is translated Christ —.

Then he brought him to Jesus. Jesus looked at him and said. "You are Simon the son of John; you will be called Cephas" — which is translated Peter.

Focus questions:

- 1. Describe a time when you had a choice that would influence the rest of your life.
- 2. Andrew called Peter to come and see Jesus. The call to follow Jesus is often heard through another person or group. Who has helped you deepen your relationship with Jesus?
- 3. What are you looking for in your spiritual life?

Family and children's question:

The Gospel story tells of one brother, Andrew, bringing his brother, Peter, to Jesus. Who in your family has brought you to Jesus?

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

The Epiphany of the Lord: Christmas says that God, the infinite mystery is born in the finite human categories of a particular race and culture, of time and space. The feast of the Epiphany proclaims that the human baby Jesus is God bound neither by a particular culture or group of people, nor constrained by a particular period of time or place. God in Jesus reveals to all, belongs to all and includes all in God's gracious plan of salvation.

The star that appears in the sky announces to all creation and every nation that God is born. The three wise persons from the East represent the people beyond the borders of the Jewish nation, race and culture in which Jesus was born. The Epiphany celebrates the divine truth that those who seek God will find God. The Lord reveals and only those who seek will recognize the revelation. The Lord is the light and we can see the reality of this light only when we open our eyes. The Epiphany shows who God is and invites us to see it. Let us open our eves and recognize the Lord.

"20+G+M+B+18": The Epiphany is the time to celebrate our home as the home which recognizes God and invites God's grace to fill the house. You may have noticed that over the inside entrance of the Church are written in chalk: "20+C+M+B+18" which are the first letters of the names of the three kings - Caspar, Melchior and Balthazar enclosed within the year 2018. You can bless your home in the same way writing this inscription on the inside of the entrance of your home. This signifies that God is revealing to us that we are the present day magi. God is not a God of Old times, but of our time, now, today of 2018.

Prayer for the blessing of the Home on Epiphany: Bless, + O Lord God almighty, this home, that in it there may be health, purity, the strength of victory, humility, goodness and mercy, the fulfillment of Thy law, the thanksgiving to God the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit. And may this blessing remain upon this home and upon all who dwell herein. Through Christ our Lord.

Partial Victory for First Amendment Freedoms:

A federal court judge ruled in mid-December that an Atlanta, GA, city policy requiring public employees to get permission to do other work outside their city employment, that led to the firing of Fire Chief Kevin Cochran in 2015, was unconstitutional. The long-time fire chief had a distinguished career that included an appointment by Pres. Obama as the U.S. Fire Administrator. Nevertheless, he was fired for authoring and self-publishing a book for his men's Bible study that upholds the biblical view on sexuality.

"Atlanta can no longer require employees to get permission from the city for speech unrelated to work or punish them if they don't," said an Alliance Defending Freedom attorney. "This win protects all city employees wanting to engage in 'controversial' speech - whether that be what the Bible has to say about marriage or what Charlie Brown and the Bible have to say about Christmas."

However, the Atlanta city attorney is also declaring victory. "We are pleased that Judge May ruled that the mayor acted lawfully and appropriately in terminating Mr. Cochran's employment. ... (This lawsuit) is an employment matter involving an executive in charge of more than 1,100 firefighters and tasked to lead by example."

For now, Cochran's case will continue through the courts to determine if the chief gets his job back and receives some compensation.

Chief Cochran said, "It's still unthinkable to me that the very faith and patriotism that inspired my professional achievements and drove me to treat all people with love and equity is what the government ultimately used to bring my dream career to an end. All Americans are guaranteed the freedom of actually believing and thinking in such a way that does not cost them the consequences that I've experienced in this termination."

DIOCESE OF ROCKVILLE CENTRE ANNOUNCES DEADLINE EXTENSION FOR INDEPENDENT RECONCILIATION AND **COMPENSATION PROGRAM**

The Diocese of Rockville Centre announced that the deadline to file for Phase I of the Independent Reconciliation and Compensation Program (IRCP) for survivors of sexual abuse by clergy of the Diocese of Rockville Centre has been extended to January 31, **2018.** The first phase of the IRCP was originally scheduled to end on December 31, 2017. Any person wishing to file a new claim alleging sexual abuse not previously reported to the diocese may be eligible to participate in Phase II of the program when it is implemented in early 2018. These reports will be turned over to the local District Attorney and investigated fully prior to a determination by the IRCP. To learn more about the Independent Reconciliation and


