#### FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

**Did you hear about the son of the atheists who asked his parents,** "Do you think God knows we don't believe in him?" It is a thought-provoking question. For the atheist- parents God is a person whose existence cannot be proved. But for their son, God is a person who can be conscious of human existence. Today's readings invite us to see God, not as a hard core matter to be proved or disproved, but to realize God as a person who can lovingly relate with us.

In the Gospel reading two of the disciples of John the Baptizer who tried to follow Jesus, wanted to know His whereabouts. Instead of giving the needed details about him, Jesus invites them to "come and see." Jesus invited them to know for themselves by living with Him. Knowing a person is not being aware of certain facts about that person. Knowing is to live with that person. Knowing without relating is not a real knowing. As humans we are not mere lifeless facts to be stored as knowledge in mental memory. Knowing is relating. The more we develop a relationship with a person, the more we come to know about that person.

The only purpose that God was born as Jesus among us is to relate with us and thus come to know more about Him. The more we know of Him, the more His presence becomes real. The main question is not, if God exists or not; rather it is, if we want to relate with God or not. For those who want to relate, there is always an invitation from Jesus 'Come and See'. Whoever desires to consciously relate with God, they can experience God as a living person.

**Ordinary Time:** Festive days are over. We had food, fun and family to celebrate our relationship during the festive days. Now the regular days of work and duty, chore and responsibility have become the daily routine. In Church such a time is called 'The Ordinary Time.' It does not mean any lack of fun or feast. It just means that our life is composed more of this style of living than the living we had during the festive time.

But we break the ordinary time every week with weekend celebration of Jesus' Resurrection. The purpose of the Sunday celebration is to lighten the burden of the ordinary weekdays. Sunday's celebration and rest would recharge the battery to face again the routine of the weekdays. Sunday worship would refresh and revitalize the meaning of our sweat and labor. May our feast and fun continue on Sundays. So don't miss the Sunday worship to empower the week (ordinary) days. Snowy winter, slippery roads and cold climate may not encourage us to go out of our home. When this situation continues especially on a weekend, it could make a great excuse to stay in bed. It happened already two to three times this winter. The church attendance was not that great. A small number or a large number of people may attend the Sunday worship, but the parish continues to operate with all its holy celebrations. The expense is the same, even if the collection is down owing to a smaller attendance. So may I request parishioners to consider Electronic contribution called 'Faith Direct'. You can contribute through Credit or Debit Card or through your Bank. Your loving support will be automatically credited to the Parish account even at those times you will not be able to attend Church due to vacation, inclement weather, sickness or other reasons. An academic report from Princeton University argues that vigorously advancing religious freedom is in America's national interests:

- The basis for religious freedom is awareness of the reality and dignity of the human person. Since religion is a human impulse to know and relate to something bigger than one's self and is a phenomenon found in all times and cultures, to interfere with living out religious experience, is to interfere with human fulfillment.
- "When citizens are free to have an ultimate commitment to something more than human, something beyond the authorities of state and society, the power of the state is thereby limited."
- At the same time, religious freedom disciplines religious people to treat their non-coreligionists with respect.
- Morally, religion is just not religion unless it is done freely.
- Legally, democracies have recognized that far from being a marginal special interest - religious freedom is a central human right.

#### DIOCESE OF ROCKVILLE CENTRE ANNOUNCES DEADLINE EXTENSION FOR INDEPENDENT RECONCILIATION AND **COMPENSATION PROGRAM**

The Diocese of Rockville Centre announced that the deadline to file for Phase I of the Independent

Reconciliation and Compensation Program (IRCP) for survivors of sexual abuse by clergy of the Diocese of Rockville Centre has been extended to January 31, 2018. The first phase of the IRCP was originally

scheduled to end on December 31, 2017.

Any person wishing to file a new claim alleging sexual abuse not previously reported to the diocese may be eligible to participate in Phase II of the program when it is implemented in early 2018. These reports will be turned over to the local District Attorney and
