



Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

January 28, 2018 **Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time** Deuteronomy 18:15-20 Psalm: 95: 1-2, 6-7, 7-9 **1 Corinthians 7:32-35** Mark 1: 21-28

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Mark:

Then they came to Capernaum, and on the sabbath Jesus entered the synagogue and taught. The people were astonished at his teaching, for he taught them as one having authority and not as the scribes.

In their synagogue was a man with an unclean spirit; he cried out, "What have you to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are—the Holy One of God!"

Jesus rebuked him and said,

"Quiet! Come out of him!"

The unclean spirit convulsed him and with a loud cry came out of him.

All were amazed and asked one another,

"What is this? A new teaching with authority. He commands even the unclean spirits and they obey him." His fame spread everywhere throughout the whole region of Galilee.

Focus questions:

- 1. Jesus restored himself with prayer. Describe a time when you needed time alone for prayer to feel restored.
- 2. Relate a time when you or someone you know was healed through prayer.
- 3. Describe a time when you cried out to God "Enough already".

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

A hungry little boy was beginning to eat his dinner when his father reminded him that they had not prayed. "We don't have to," said the little boy. "Mommy is a great cook."

When hunger becomes prominent, prayer becomes secondary. That which is made as prominent will give strength to make everything else as secondary.

Today's readings invite us to examine what empowers us to give up something; and how we can be misled into choosing something secondary as primary. The first reading narrates how the people of Nineveh were led to the right path of conversion by the preaching of Jonah. They had no clue that they had made the wrong choice until Jonah indicated it to them. Once they heard something better, they were ready to give up their former ways. One can give up anything at the realization of getting something better. Only the hope of reaching somewhere better will make us leave the present place. Only something of higher taste will give us the heart to sacrifice that of lower taste.

In the Gospel Jesus inspires in the first disciples the higher goal of becoming fishers of men which in turn empowered them to sacrifice their work of being regular fishermen. God always calls us to the present that can be better than the past. God certainly will empower those who adhere to God's call. Let us not settle for the regular and routine taste of life that we have learnt from culture, politics, human tradition etc. Let us open our heart in prayer and meditation to God's call to live in the power of God.

CATHOLICS FOR FREEDOM OF RELIGION

Why Religious Freedom Matters:

As a New Year begins, America finds itself at a tipping point, with the stakes for religious freedom at an all-time high. Many cases are working their way through the courts while some will be heard by the U.S. Supreme Court. These cases involve prayer, military religious rights, faith-based business owners, and houses of worship. Unfortunately, many cases don't even make it to the court system since citizens will often capitulate to intimidation out of ignorance of their First Amendment protections, fear of job or societal repercussions, or legal costs (though many law firms defend religious freedom pro-bono.)

Examples of Student Religious Expression on trial:

At two different Long Island, NY, public schools students were made to turn their t-shirts inside out to hide the Bible verses on the shirts.

A Florida agency banned two Christian schools from using a stadium speaker system to pray before a championship game, even though this was common practice.

These 2 cases are each one step below the Supreme Court.

Examples of Military Religious Rights on trial:

A 33-year Air Force veteran, Oscar Rodriquez, was forcibly removed from a private retirement ceremony at a CA airbase because he planned to say the word "God" in his speech.

Two high-ranking military officers, Col. Bohannon and Col. Madrid, are being punished for their religious views on marriage.

Examples of Business Owners on trial:

An OR family-owned bakery is being fined \$135,000 for declining - on religious grounds - to create a custom cake for a same-sex wedding. The government says it also wants to "rehabilitate" their religious views.

MN film makers, Angel & Carl Larsen, are facing large fines or 90 days in jail for declining to video a same-sex wedding.

Examples of Houses of Worship on trial:

A synagogue in Dallas, TX, is fighting for its existence against zoning regulations.

An Orthodox Jewish community in Los Angeles, CA, was sued by animal rights activists trying to prevent a millennium-old religious ceremony (kosher chicken) from taking place in various synagogues. (CFFR, Students of Faith lessons, 2017; firstliberty.org, 12/28/17; ncregister.com, 6/22/12; thf media, s3,amazonnews)

DIOCESE OF ROCKVILLE CENTRE ANNOUNCES DEADLINE EXTENSION FOR INDEPENDENT RECONCILIATION AND COMPENSATION PROGRAM

The Diocese of Rockville Centre announced that the deadline to file for Phase I of the Independent Reconciliation and Compensation Program (IRCP) for survivors of sexual abuse by clergy of the Diocese of Rockville Centre has been extended to **January 31, 2018.** The first phase of the IRCP was originally scheduled to end on December 31, 2017.

Any person wishing to file a new claim alleging sexual abuse not previously reported to the diocese may be eligible to participate in Phase II of the program when it is implemented in early 2018. These reports will be turned over to the local District Attorney and investigated fully prior to a determination by the IRCP. 


