



A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Mark:

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

"I can do things you cannot, you can do things I cannot; together we can do great things." These words of St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta inspire us all to get into life's action in every small or great way possible.

Today's Gospel invites us to join together with God to do great things as Jesus did. After healing Peter's mother-in-law, Jesus spent his time curing the sick and driving out many demons. The next day even though many expected him to stay with him, Jesus expressed his vision of going to nearby villages to preach his Mission.

The vision of Jesus is to cover as many places and gather as many followers as possible to participate in his vision and mission. His purpose is to reveal that God's work is not the achievement or show of a single man Jesus, but God working among and through humans. It is not that God cannot do things and that God needs our help. God's way of doing things is that together we all can do great things for God's Kingdom.

Whenever something catastrophic happens, we tend to complain about where God is in this, or does not God see this and how can he allow this to happen. The answer is that the God from whom we expect action is residing within us, to do the things we expect to happen with us and to avoid the danger we expect. The travelling Jesus is now in our village, he wants us to join His mission. Let us join him with the spirit of Mother Teresa, "Never worry about numbers. Help one person at a time and always start with the person nearest you. If you can't feed a hundred people then feed just one. What can you do to promote world peace? Go home and love your family." Mother Teresa.

The Catholic Ministries Appeal 2018: This week is the Kick-off Sunday for Catholic Ministries Appeal. Our Parish's assessment this year is \$70,100. Last year we made 78.2% of our Goal. When we reach our goal we will get a rebate of approximately \$13,000. Thus our generosity will help both others and our parish through the rebate. I personally ask you to help meet the goal. Building our Parish Community: In Religious Formation last week, we had two groups of children, one getting ready for First Communion and the other getting ready for Confirmation. The main focus of their learning was "Who is Jesus?". At the end of the meeting I invited them all to attend Sunday mass regularly, if not then at least to try to come as often as possible. I explained to them that Spirituality means allowing God to act in their life. Thus spirituality is not one of the many things that they learn. But it is the master science that brings all that they learn into a value-filled life by God's grace. The children all raised their hands in approval of coming to Sunday Masses to exercise Spirituality to be integrated into their lives. So I request all the parents to bring them to Church. If you come then they will be able to come. Please give them a chance that they may have the strength of Grace to face their life in all its challenges.

Punished for Religious Beliefs in the Military -Part 2

In 2017, USAF Colonel Michael Madrid's law firm demanded that the Air Force rescind Col. Madrid's punishment and attempt to destroy his career or face further legal action. Col. Madrid is a decorated Air Force veteran, former Naval aviator, and a flight surgeon who has served the military for 26 years and is a Christian with traditional beliefs about marriage.

In 2014, an Airman who was court-martialed and found guilty of serious misconduct, accused Col. Madrid of making derogatory comments about homosexuality. Col. Madrid denied this charge and submitted to a thorough Air Force investigation which found the allegations unsubstantiated, was cleared of all charges, and the investigation was closed.

However, two years later, without any new evidence or new investigation, a new commander, Maj. Gen. McCoy, decided that Madrid had lied in 2014 when he denied making derogatory comments. As a result, he placed a Letter of Admonishment in Col. Madrid's stellar permanent record that now guarantees he will never be promoted to Brigadier General.

"Colonel Madrid is the latest victim of extreme political correctness ...," said First Liberty Institute. "We are concerned that Maj. Gen. McCoy judged and punished Madrid because he became aware of his traditional religious views. If so, that not only harms the military, it is illegal." (prnnewswire.com, 3/29/17; MadridCaseFacts.com)
