Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

March 11, 2018 Fourth Sunday of Lent 2 Chronicles 36:14-16, 19-23 Psalm: 137: 1-2, 3, 4-5, 6 Ephesians 2: 4-10 John 3: 14-21

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John:

Jesus said to Nicodemus:

"Just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, so that everyone who believes in him may have eternal life."

For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him. Whoever believes in him will not be condemned, but whoever does not believe has already been condemned, because he has not believed in the name of the only Son of God. And this is the verdict, that the light came into the world, but people preferred darkness to light, because their works were evil. For everyone who does wicked things hates the light and does not come toward the light, so that his works might not be exposed. But whoever lives the truth comes to the light, so that his works may be clearly seen as done in God.

- 3. Re-read John 3:16. What does it mean for you?

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

"Why are you carrying the door under your arm?"

"It is the front door of my house. I lost the key and am taking it to have a new key made."

"Make sure you don't lose the door now or you won't be able to enter your house."

"Well, I left a window open just to be on the safe side."

Every place of worship (church, synagogue, mosque, temple etc.) is just a door to enter into God's presence. The aim of worship is to find and experience in each other God's abiding presence. When we fail to realize this key-message, we will end up carrying the door of the house of God thinking that we are protecting God and God's house.

In today's Gospel we see how people used God's house for their whims and fancies as a market place of buying and selling. Jesus redeems it to its original place of worship as God abiding as Father, in order to relate with them as His children. It is not a market place but God's home where everyone becomes God's children. The aim of the Church/Temple is not to enshrine or imprison God in order to have access to Him whenever we want and for whatever we need Him. The place of worship is the inviting presence of God to make each one of us as His walking/live presence in our day- to-day lives. Let us pray that our Lenten spiritual exercises make us





Play - but Don't Pray: Students Fight Back Against Atheist Group:

Beloit, Ohio - A community prayer before basketball and football games, led by a local pastor, has been a tradition at West Branch School District for the past 30 years. Pastor Mark Reich said he prays for the athletes "protection, good, their best efforts and for everyone to go home saying, 'I did my best.'"

The atheist Freedom From Religion Foundation (FFRF) sent a letter of complaint to the school district in January. This anti-God group routinely attacks and threatens small towns and average Americans for exercising their First Amendment freedoms. (They even sued Presidents Obama and Bush over the National Day of Prayer, claiming they were offended by the proclamation. Fortunately, in this case, the appeals court concluded, "Hurt feelings differ from legal injury.") Nevertheless, each year, FFRF continue their dozens of complaints against schools and too often, the schools will capitulate rather than engage in a legal defense.

West Branch Superintendent Saxton decided to stop the prayer while exploring a compromise. In the meantime, over 100 students and adults arrived at a recent game wearing "Prayer Matters" tee-shirts. "I was upset and outraged because our community is so close-knit and it's upsetting to see something that's important to so many people get taken down," said a West Branch graduate.


