

Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

June 24, 2018 Solemnity of the Nativity of St. John the Baptist Isaiah 49:1-6 Psalm: 139: 1B-3, 13-14B, 14-15 Acts 13: 22-26 Luke 1:57-66, 80

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke:

When the time arrived for Elizabeth to have her child she gave birth to a son. Her neighbors and relatives heard that the Lord had shown his great mercy toward her, and they rejoiced with her.

When they came on the eighth day to circumcise the child, they were going to call him Zechariah after his father, but his mother said in reply,

"No. He will be called John."

But they answered her,

"There is no one among your relatives who has this name." So they made signs, asking his father what he wished him to be called.

He asked for a tablet and wrote, "John is his name," and all were amazed.

Immediately his mouth was opened, his tongue freed, and he spoke blessing God. Then fear came upon all their neighbors, and all these matters were discussed throughout the hill country of Judea.

All who heard these things took them to heart, saying, "What, then, will this child be?"

For surely the hand of the Lord was with him. The child grew and became strong in spirit, and he was in the desert until the day of his manifestation to Israel.

Focus questions:

- 1. Talk about how you came to be called your name.
- 2. Relate a story about a couple you know who waited a long time to have a child. What was the impact on them and those around them?
- 3. Talk about someone you grew up with who went on to do something great. Did you see any signs of that when you were growing up?

Family and children's question:

John means God is gracious. Look up what your name means..

Dear Friends,

Son: What is a monologue, Dad?

Dad: That is a conversation between a husband and wife.

Son: But our teacher said that was a dialogue.

Experience in life makes each one define terms and relationships differently from others. In today's second reading St. Paul says "We walk by faith, not by sight." By that he invites us to define life not from seeing (senses) but by faith (from what we believe).

He has no power over the seed to sprout as he would like. He can only wait in hope for it to come up. He should believe in the inner power of the seed to become what God designed it for.

Thus our life is more of believing in the inner power and wisdom that God has invested in us. We are encouraged to do all that is necessary for life to survive. We also must believe in the plan that God has for us and has empowered us for that plan to come to fruition. We are called to patiently grow up to what is expected of us from God. Let us not be lazy to care for our life in the way humanly possible. Let us also pray that God's plan may fulfill in us, growing our inner seeds to bear fruit in God's standard.

Wish you all a Happy Feast of our Patron St. Thomas More: This weekend we celebrate the Parish Feast, the feast of our Parish Patron, St. Thomas More. Both in his glory as the chancellor of Henry VIII and in his death for what he believed, St. Thomas More drew his strength from what God wants to do in him. He saw his life as not merely what he does but more so of what God achieves in him.

Our Patron is a family man who cared for and cherished his family. He knows all the cares and concerns of a family. Let us pray for our families through his intercession that God may help us grow in love, prosper in our needs, fulfill our dreams, guard and provide for our children. Truth vs. Relativism:

Jesus said, "...and you will know the truth and the truth will set you free ..." (John 8:32)

Veritatis Splendor (The Splendor of Truth) was written by Pope John Paul II in 1993 and revolves around man's ability to discern good, the existence of evil, the role of human freedom, human conscience and natural law. Pope John Paul II emphatically says that moral truth is knowable and there is no contradiction between freedom and following the truth. The Hebrew word for "truth", emeth, means "firmness, constancy, duration" and implies everlasting substance and something that can be relied on. Truth is that which corresponds to reality.

It's important to understand and embrace the concept

of absolute truth in all areas of life, including faith and religion, because life has consequences for being wrong. The freedom we enjoy as rational creatures does not extend to determining what is true and what is false in matters of morality any more than in other matters. We cannot choose that a circle has 4 sides and we cannot choose that adultery is good. "The fact is, the truth matters - especially when you're on the receiving end of a lie," said Christian author, Ravi Zacharias.

Much of our modern culture is based on a belief in relativism which says there is no absolute truth and that truth is merely what a particular individual or culture happens to believe. Veritatis Splendor insists that moral law is universal across people in varying cultures and is in fact rooted in the human condition and natural law.

"Serving Others in God's Love" Religious Freedom Week, June 22-29, 2018

[Religious] freedom remains one of America's most precious possessions. And, as my brothers, the United States Bishops, have reminded us, all are called to be vigilant, precisely as good citizens, to preserve and defend that freedom from everything that would threaten or compromise it. Pope Francis

If we don't know the facts of our religious freedom...

How do we know when it is being lost? How can we defend and preserve it for our children?

Some Basic Facts of America's Religious Freedom:

- Our founders believed man's natural and unalienable rights come from our Creator and individual conscience was to be protected so each person could serve his God according to his conscience. George Washington, for example, said... "every man, conducting himself as a good citizen, and being accountable to God alone for his religious opinions, ought to be protected in worshipping the Deity according to the dictates of his own conscience."
- **Conscience rights were protected by the first amendment's** prohibition of state-imposed religion and protection of the free exercise of religion. "Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof; or abridging the freedom of speech, or of the press; or the right of the people peaceably to assemble, and to petition the government for a redress of grievances." 1st Amendment
- "Freedom of Religion" allows us to live our morals and faith in school, church community and state. A limited "Freedom of Worship" confines faith and morals inside our churches, away from the public square.
- "Separation of church and state" is a phrase that is not in the Constitution or any founding document but is generally taken out of context and used to attack the religious freedom it actually affirmed. It was a phrase in a letter from Thomas Jefferson assuring Baptists in Danbury, CT, that religious freedom and individual conscience were from God, not government. He confirmed that the first amendment was meant to protect individual conscience and churches from government control by building a "wall of separation between church and state".

"Religious freedom allows the space for people of faith to serve others in God's love in ministries like education, adoption and foster care, health care, and migration and refugee services.

On the June 22 feast of Sts. Thomas More and John Fisher, we remember these saints who were martyred in 1535 for standing up to King Henry VIII for the sanctity of marriage and the freedom of the Church. In our country today, the Church faces challenges to her freedom to serve in healthcare, child welfare services, and education. 


