



Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

September 2, 2018 Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time Deuteronomy 4:1-2, 6-8 Psalm 15:2-3, 3-4, 4-5 James 1:17-18, 21b-22, 27 Mark 7:1-8, 14-15, 21-23

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Mark:: When the Pharisees with some scribes who had come from Jerusalem gathered around Jesus, they observed that some of his disciples ate their meals with unclean, that is, unwashed, hands. —For the Pharisees and, in fact, all Jews, do not eat without carefully washing their hands, keeping the tradition of the elders. And on coming from the market-place they do not eat without purifying themselves. And there are many other things that they have traditionally observed, the purification of cups and jugs and kettles and beds. — So the Pharisees and scribes questioned him, "Why do your disciples not follow the tradition of the elders but instead eat a meal with unclean hands?" He responded,

"Well did Isaiah prophesy about you hypocrites, as it is written: *This people honors me with their lips*,

but their hearts are far from me;

in vain do they worship me,

teaching as doctrines human precepts.

You disregard God's commandment but cling to human tradition."

He summoned the crowd again and said to them,

"Hear me, all of you, and understand. Nothing that enters one from outside can defile that person; but the things that come out from within are what defile.

"From within people, from their hearts, come evil thoughts, unchastity, theft, murder, adultery, greed, malice, deceit, licentiousness, envy, blasphemy, arrogance, folly. All these evils come from within and they defile."

Focus questions:

- 1. Describe a time when your heart led you to do something good but the law got in the way.
- 2. Relate a time when you judged a person based on externals. What led you to see the person before you as they really are?
- 3. Describe a time when you found yourself challenged not to just hear God's word, but to do it.

Family and children's question:

Share a story of a person who is a doer of God's word.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Jim: My wife can cook but does not.

Garry: Well, my wife can't cook but does.

Life's real wisdom consists in our willingness to do what we can and in declining to do what we cannot. Whenever we live this wisdom of combining our willingness and ability in doing things, we will not fail to experience God in our life.

In the Gospel, when the people refuse to choose Jesus and go away from Him, Jesus asks his disciples if they also want to leave Him. Peter responds as a spokesperson for the disciples, "Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life." Peter puts together willingness and ability in the path of Jesus who has eternal life.

Whenever our willingness and ability focus selfishly on our own whims and fancies, we have nothing more to experience than our own selfish selves. But like Peter, when we invest our willingness and ability on Jesus we begin to experience and possess life eternal. Sin is nothing but an unwillingness to do things even though we have the ability to do them, and willingness to do things which we should not. Likewise, experience of God is nothing but our willingness to choose God and to apply our ability to experience God. Let us pray with Peter, "Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life."

You may be aware from media coverage this past week of the Pennsylvania Grand Jury Report on sexual abuse of minors by Catholic priests that Bishop Barres was referenced in the report stemming from his time as the Bishop of Allentown. The report accuses Bishop Barres of not dealing decisively with accusations against priests, one priest in particular. To be absolutely clear, what the report presents regarding Bishop Barres is inaccurate and misleading on key facts. During his time as the Bishop of Allentown, Bishop Barres was, in fact, as vigilant as he is now about identifying and removing abusive priests and protecting God's children. We urge everyone to take home and read the full statement regarding the inaccuracies in the report. The statement is also available on the diocesan website at www.drvc.org.

The abuse of any human being – particularly of children – is a terrible sin and a crime. It should not happen anywhere and it most particularly should not happen in the Catholic Church. The fact that it did is disgraceful and the Bishop is committed to removing any abusers and keeping out future ones. And we continue to pray and work toward healing for survivors of abuse. The Pennsylvania report looks back at 70 years. It is important to note the progress that has been made since 2002. It is also important to be accurate when reporting on or speaking about the record of Church leaders who have confronted these terrible issues. Clearly, the Church's vigilance in this area can never cease, and, in fact must always be expanded.



And... YES, Students May Express Their Faith - (Part 1)

However, many Americans incorrectly believe that any mention of God by students in school is forbidden. This belief is false! Why do so many Americans believe this? How did we get here?

School-sponsored Prayer was removed from the public education system through a number of court cases over several decades. In 1963, the Supreme Court ruled on two cases that were brought by Madalyn Murray O'Hair in Maryland and the Schempp family in Pennsylvania. The Supreme Court ruling stated that school-sponsored prayer and/or Bible reading by a representative of the State (teacher, etc.) was a violation of the establishment clause of the First Amendment.

Justice Hugo Black, writing for the majority said, "It is no part of the business of government to compose official prayers ..." This ruling did not stop school prayer or Bible reading completely since voluntary student prayer was still permitted and protected.

The widespread misinterpretation of the Supreme Court decision was caused by the news coverage and overly cautious School Boards.

While news services claimed prayer and Bible reading was expelled from public schools, Justice Tom Clark criticized their coverage, insisting the public was wrong to think the court had "outlawed religious observance in public." Prof. Deckman of the Public Religious Research Institute said, "School Boards got so paranoid about dealing with religion (expression and speech) that they just said "We

said, "School Boards got so paranoid about dealing with religion (expression and speech) that they just said, "We shouldn't do any of that at all!"

So - although the Supreme Court decisions did ban

So - although the Supreme Court decisions did ban school-sponsored prayer and scripture readings, scholars agree that the court didn't ban religion from public schools or prohibit students from praying or expressing their religious beliefs.

Nevertheless, for over 50 years, the misunderstanding and misrepresentation of the 1963 Supreme Court ruling has led to countless cases that deny our children their First Amendment free exercise rights.


