Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

September 30, 2018 Twenty-Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time Numbers 11:25-29 Psalm 19:8, 10, 12-13,14 James 5: 1-6 Mark 9:38-43, 45, 47-48

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Mark:

At that time, John said to Jesus,

"Teacher, we saw someone driving out demons in your name, and we tried to prevent him because he does not follow us."

Jesus replied,

"Do not prevent him. There is no one who performs a mighty deed in my name who can at the same time speak ill of me. For whoever is not against us is for us. Anyone who gives you a cup of water to drink because you belong to Christ, amen, I say to you, will surely not lose his reward.

"Whoever causes one of these little ones who believe in me to sin, it would be better for him if a great millstone were put around his neck and he were thrown into the sea. If your hand causes you to sin, cut it off. It is better for you to enter into life maimed than with two hands to go into Gehenna, into the unquenchable fire. And if your foot causes you to sin, cut if off. It is better for you to enter into life crippled than with two feet to be thrown into Gehenna. And if your eye causes you to sin, pluck it out. Better for you to enter into the kingdom of God with one eye than with two eyes to be thrown into Gehenna, where 'their worm does not die, and the fire is not quenched."

Focus questions:

- 1. Describe a time when a simple gesture you performed was really appreciated.
- 2. What do you have to cut out of your life to make room for God?
- 3. Relate a time when you had an experience of God speaking to you through another.

Family and children's question:

When has a sacrifice you made seemed unfair?

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Photographer (to young man): It will make a much better picture if you put your hand on your father's shoulder.

Father: It would be much more natural if he had his hand in my pocket.

We live in a world where the picture, many a time, is better liked than nature. We live in a time in which 'reported news' sounds to be truer than the 'actual truth'.

In today's Gospel, Jesus' disciples aspire to be greatest according to the standard and definition of their time. But Jesus awakens them to the 'real definition' of being 'the greatest' or 'the first'. We understand 'being first' as a position above all the others in power and authority. That is how their world also defined their 'first' and that is what the disciples want to be too. But Jesus invites them to see not 'the depicted or defined truth' but 'the real truth.' 'To be the first' is not a position or title but a service. It starts with an attitude of serving rather than an aptitude of domineering. It should not employ the style of overpowering others but empowering everyone to live out their best.

This all means that 'being first' is a way of life totally contrary to what is being accepted to be 'the first' in the world. The 'first' has to be 'the last'. The person who wants to be 'the first' has to be at the bottom of all to put people's wishes and aspirations above his/her life. It is not that the people do what 'the first' commands. Rather 'the first' is always available to bring out the best in all. Let us pray for all our leaders to be inspired by this message. Let us try to serve others who are under our care.

The latest news from the Weather Center is that Hurricane Florence is heading towards the southeast coast of the United States; its direction seems clear for the moment, though its exact path is uncertain. There are those, however, who are looking for the adrenaline rush of being inside the rages of a hurricane, or to have bragging

It seems as though some people are so comfortable in their everyday lives that they need such a stimulus; they haven't had to worry about having enough food easily available or not enough gas in the car (and, of course, they have a car). Anti-Semitism on the Rise in Europe and on Many American College Campuses

International Report: Part 1

The Anti-Defamation League (ADL), 2017 report tracking American Colleges, reported over 1,700 anti-Semitic incidents from 2015-2017. "In the past several years, Jewish students on certain college campuses - not all, but a large number - have been subjected to unprecedented levels of anti-Jewish sentiment, leading many to feel uncomfortable participating in Jewish campus life or other campus activities whose participants are especially hostile to Jewish students."

"Schools that are promoting the Boycott, Divest, and Sanction (BDS) movement against Israeli businesses and universities, are 3-8 times more likely to target Jewish students for harm," said AMCHA, a group combatting anti-Semitism.

Anti-Semitism is once again a serious concern in

Europe. Incidents of violent attacks, assaults, and vandalism are making headlines almost every day.

France: Assaults on the 500,000 Jewish community are happening, on average, twice per week. These include arson attacks on kosher restaurants.

Germany: German Jews are worried about the rise of the anti-Semitic, Alternative for Germany political party, which is the third largest in parliament.

Poland: The Polish Jewish community wrote, "Polish Jews do not feel safe in Poland" due to "the current wave of anti-Semitism (which) arose in response to" the recent libel law that forbids the belief that Poland was involved in the Holocaust.

Ukraine: There is a 50% increase in violence against Jews.

Britain: Jewish leaders held an "Enough is Enough" event to protest the Labour Party and their leader,

Jeremy Corbyn, for anti-Semitic rhetoric and a marked increase in anti-Semitic incidents.






