Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

October 14, 2018 Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time Wisdom 7:7-11 Psalm 90:12-13, 14-15, 16-17 Hebrews 4:12-13 Mark 10:17-30

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Mark:

As Jesus was setting out on a journey, a man ran up, knelt down before him, and asked him, "Good teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?"

Jesus answered him, "Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone. You know the commandments: You shall not kill; you shall not commit adultery; you shall not steal; you shall not bear false witness; you shall not defraud; honor your father and your mother."

He replied and said to him, "Teacher, all of these I have observed from my youth." Jesus, looking at him, loved him and said to him, "You are lacking in one thing. Go, sell what you have, and give to the poor and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me."

At that statement his face fell, and he went away sad, for he had many possessions.

Jesus looked around and said to his disciples, "How hard it is for those who have wealth to enter the kingdom of God!"

The disciples were amazed at his words. So Jesus again said to them in reply, "Children, how hard it is to enter the kingdom of God! It is easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for one who is rich to enter the kingdom of God." They were exceedingly astonished and said among themselves, "Then who can be saved?"

Jesus looked at them and said, "For human beings it is impossible, but not for God. All things are possible for God." Peter began to say to him, "We have given up everything and followed you." Jesus said, "Amen, I say to you, there is no one who has given up house or brothers or sisters or mother or father or children or lands for my sake and for the sake of the gospel who will not receive a hundred times more now in this present age: houses and brothers and sisters and mothers and children and lands, with persecutions, and eternal life in the age to come."

Focus Questions:

- 1. What does Christian discipleship mean to you?
- 2. What would you let go of to increase your trust in God?
- 3. How does your wealth/possessions distract you from following Jesus?

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Marriage Counselor: Do you enjoy talking to each other?

Counselee: We enjoy talking to each other. But the problem is listening to each other.

In today's Gospel a Pharisee justifies the husband's legal right to divorce his wife. Jesus explains to him that the law which hardens the human heart can solve any problem legally. Marriage as a legal contract can easily be divorced by law. But is marriage just a law based institution? Does marriage have anything more than a legal right over the spouses?

Jesus claims that marriage is a union blessed by God. It is not just a legal contract but a union of two becoming one flesh intended and blessed by God. It is not just two persons put together as they like or trying to adjust/tolerate each other claiming and maintaining their individual rights. It begins as a woman and a man trying to live together, while having the potential to grow as two persons becoming one flesh. In marriage the man loses himself in the woman, his otherness to his woman; likewise the woman loses herself in the man, her otherness to her man. Their marital union is so blessed by God that there is no otherness to each other, but only the rich oneness in which each of them grow their newness of being in each other.

St. Paul calls this newness of the partners in marriage a mystery like that of Christ in Church and the Church in Christ. (Letter to Ephesians 5:28-32). Marriage is a sacred mystery in the sense that is has a bigger hidden truth which is realized in the everyday living of the oneness between husband and wife. Let us pray that God help all married couples to realize God's blessings of oneness in living their marriage every day.

October is the month of Our Lady of the Rosary: "The family that prays together stays together" is an adage. The Rosary is a family prayer that all generations of a family pray together. October is the month dedicated to Our Lady of the Rosary. If your work or other concerns of daily life do not give enough time to pray the full Rosary, please try to come together as a family to pray a decade of the Rosary. A decade of the Rosary is praying an "Our Father", 10 "Hail Marys" and conclude with the "Glory Be". Also when you wait on line, or are stuck in traffic, or waiting in the doctor's office... you can raise your heart to God by praying the Rosary. In our Church we pray the Rosary every day before Mass.

Respect Life Sunday: Sunday, October 7th is Respect Life Sunday. As we celebrate Respect Life Sunday, we are reminded that the assaults on human dignity come in many forms. The Respect Life Office is charged with deepening our already strong commitment to pro-life activities and parish education. Satanism & Religious Freedom:

The latest effort to normalize Satanism in America occurred on August 16 when the Satanic Temple paraded an 8 ½ foot-tall, one-ton demon statue to the Arkansas State Capital. The goal is to get Americans accustomed to the mistaken belief that Satanism is a protected religion by the First Amendment. It is not.

Nonetheless, these groups have won victories in Oklahoma, Minnesota, and Detroit as well as in after school programs in Washington State (to rival the Good News Club), and offering satanic curses to open a city council meeting in Alaska.

Knowing and understanding First Amendment Freedom of Religion protections is essential in order to refute the Satanists claims.

"The freedom of religion found in the First Amendment is a freedom to worship God according to the dictates of one's conscience - not the license to disparage or deride Him," wrote author Gunnar Gunderson. "Satanism is irreligion or anti-religion ... Thus, granting Satanism religious-freedom protections undermines rather than strengthens religious-freedom rights by directly attacking their foundation. There is no evidence that either our Founders or founding citizens understood freedom of religion to include irreligion. Nor would such a right even make sense."


