#### Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

January 27, 2019 **Third Sunday in Ordinary Time** Nehemiah 8:2-4A, 5-6, 8-10 Psalm 19: 8, 9, 10, 15 1 Corinthians: 12: 12-30 Luke: 1: 1-4,4, 14-21

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to St. Luke:

Since many have undertaken to compile a narrative of the events that have been fulfilled among us, just as those who were eyewitnesses from the beginning and ministers of the word have handed them down to us, I too have decided, after investigating everything accurately anew, to write it down in an orderly sequence for you, most excellent Theophilus, so that you may realize the certainty of the teachings you have received.

Jesus returned to Galilee in the power of the Spirit, and news of him spread throughout the whole region. He taught in their synagogues and was praised by all.

He came to Nazareth, where he had grown up, and went according to his custom into the synagogue on the sabbath day. He stood up to read and was handed a scroll of the prophet Isaiah. He unrolled the scroll and found the passage where it was written:

The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor.

He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord.

Rolling up the scroll, he handed it back to the attendant and sat down, and the eyes of all in the synagogue looked intently at him.

He said to them,

"Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing."

#### FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

The rancher's daughter had just broken off her engagement with a young doctor of medicine. "Do you mean to tell me," exclaimed her girlfriend, "that he actually asked you to return all his presents?"

The ranch girl nodded. "Not only that," she replied, "He also sent me a bill for forty-four house calls."

In the first reading God the bridegroom does not vengefully break off with His Bride but vindictively re-affirms His relationship with her. The difference between revenge and vindication is in the fact of reclaiming. Vengeance would brand her as "Forsaken" and "Desolate". But God is God who shines forth her vindication like dawn. Vindication re-claims her to be God's "My Delight" and "Espoused." In vindication God wants to claim in her also what she has lost. Even though God may find in us, His bride all that could break the relationship, God still sees in us all the best that can build relationship, and thus claim us as His loving bride.

In the Gospel Jesus changes the water into wine so that the wedding celebration does not stop. If we, the bride wants to continue the marriage-relationship with God, the Groom we need only to fill our jars with what we have, the water. When we show our desire to be in relationship God is ready to claim even our water to be the wine. God knows we will soon run out of our worthiness (wine) but God does not want our wedding-celebration to be stopped. All that he needs from us to bring our unworthiness (water) to Him. God is ready to change our unworthiness (water) into worthiness (wine) so that the relationship (Wedding-celebration) can go on. God is more the God of Vindication of bringing in each of us how worthy we are. We are not "Forsaken" and "Desolate but God's "Delight" and "Espoused"

Life is most of the time regular and ordinary. Every day is not a party day. Thank God for the ordinary days. They give joy to the party day. God is ready to fill our ordinary days(water) with celebrative spirit(wine) if we bring our days activities (six jars of water) to Jesus, he will make us to serve them as wine by the touch of His Grace.

#### **How to Crush Free Speech:**

<u>Facebook</u>: Evangelist Franklin Graham was suspended from Facebook for 24 hours at the end of December, for his stand on biblical beliefs that were posted in 2016. Graham accused the social media giant of actively "censoring free speech."

"Well, now we know. **Facebook has a secret rule book for policing speech**. I was banned from posting ... because of a post back in 2016 about North Carolina's House Bill 2 (the bathroom bill). Facebook said the post went against their 'community standards on hate speech.' Facebook is trying to define truth."

Even though his account was restored, the suspension raises serious questions as critics ask, if Facebook is willing to block one of the most prominent Christian leaders in the world, then what's next?

Apple: Apple pulled a Christian app from its App Store after a small group of 356 LGBT petitioners demanded the app be removed. The app from the online store is designed to help individuals struggling with same-sex attraction. Living Hope Ministries designed the app to "proclaim God's truth as we journey with those who are seeking sexual and relational wholeness through a more intimate relationship with Jesus Christ."

Living Hope is "a ministry that for nearly 30 years has helped individuals resolve their feelings they deem incongruent with their faith. We help people deepen their relationship with Jesus Christ through Bible study and accountability. We walk with them to align their lives with the teachings of Jesus Christ," said Ricky Chalette, executive director of Living Hope Ministries.

After its victory intimidating Apple, Wayne Besen, director of the LGBT group said, "We demand that Google and Amazon immediately stop selling and promoting this app ..."
