## ***Growing through the Sunday Scriptures***

**February 3, 2019**  
**Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time**  
 Jeremiah 1:4-5, 17-19  
 Psalm 71: 1-2, 3-4, 5-6, 15-17  
 1 Corinthians 12: 31—13:13  
 Luke: 4:21-30

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to St. Luke:

Jesus began speaking in the synagogue, saying:  
 "Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing."  
 And all spoke highly of him and were amazed at the  
 gracious words that came from his mouth.  
 They also asked, "Isn't this the son of Joseph?"  
 He said to them, "Surely you will quote me this proverb,  
 'Physician, cure yourself,' and say, 'Do here in your native  
 place the things that we heard were done in Capernaum.'"  
 And he said, "Amen, I say to you, no prophet is accepted in  
 his own native place. Indeed, I tell you, there were many  
 widows in Israel in the days of Elijah when the sky was  
 closed for three and a half years and a severe famine spread  
 over the entire land. It was to none of these that Elijah was  
 sent, but only to a widow in Zarephath in the land of Sidon.  
 Again, there were many lepers in Israel during the time of  
 Elisha the prophet; yet not one of them was cleansed, but  
 only Naaman the Syrian."

When the people in the synagogue heard this, they were all  
 filled with fury. They rose up, drove him out of the town,  
 and led him to the brow of the hill on which their town had  
 been built, to hurl him down headlong. But Jesus passed  
 through the midst of them and went away.

**FR. ANTONY'S LETTER**

Dear Friends,

**Charlie Brown tells Lucy about his birdhouse project:** “Well, I am a lousy carpenter. I can’t nail straight. I can’t saw straight. I always split the wood. I’m nervous. I lack confidence. I have poor taste and absolutely no sense of design.” And then in the last frame he concludes, “So, all things considered, it’s coming along ok.”

**The message of this Sunday’s readings is the same.** “All things considered, it’s coming along ok,” because life is not a mere product of our ability or inability; rather life is the fruit of our cooperation with God.

**The First Reading invites those who have returned from exiles,** to rejoice and not to be sad because God is ready to begin with them a new beginning. With God “it will come along ok.” The Second reading invites us to realize how individually each member has its own weakness but God has constructed the body so as to give great honor to the body. When the members work as a body, their weakness will be turned into the strength and joy of living. Thus as a body “the weak members will become strong.”

**In the Gospel Jesus invites us to see in and around us** a new time of good news, a new state of liberty to captives, a new gift of sight to the blind, and a new situation of freedom to the oppressed. If we are disturbed with troubles, disturbances, poverty and fights etc. around us, Jesus invites us to focus on the fact that God wants to start with each of us a time that would be divinely acceptable and full of glad tidings. Individually we are weak parts of the body but together with God we begin to live as the body of Christ. As Paul says, with God we can do all things. Let us be bound together as the body of Christ. Let us hear God’s promise just as our Blessed Mary heard, “Everything is possible for God.”

**Snow and brutal weather:** God understands perfectly if you missed Sunday mass. In inclement weather, please try to spend some time at home in personal prayers, praying for yourself, your family and the people of our church. This is also the time when we feel how much we miss our support for each other. Every time we gather at Church we enrich our spiritual and social bond in Christ, in His word and in the Eucharist.

**The Church is a spiritual home in a physical building.** Here we realize our relationship for each other in Christ. I thank you all for your spiritual and financial support for this spiritual community to survive. Even if you miss a week, you supplement your support the following week. 

### How to Crush Religious Freedom:

**Anti-Catholic Bigotry: Some Senators assailed U.S. district court nominee, Brian Buescher, for his membership in the Knights of Columbus, a Catholic charitable organization, suggesting this affiliation might disqualify him for judgeship.** The questions asked seemed to be a **religious litmus test**, since the positions under examination are held and taught by the Catholic Church itself and are not unique to the Knights of Columbus.

**"The sheer ignorance, not to mention injustice, in the senators' describing the K of C as 'extreme' would be baffling - if it weren't part of a pattern of bigoted thinking already sanctified by other senators ... in (their) vulgar 2017 grilling of now-judge Amy Coney Barrett ("The dogma lives loudly within you, and that's a concern"),"** wrote Archbishop Chaput, PA.

"We were extremely disappointed to see that one's commitment to Catholic principles through membership in the Knights of Columbus - a charitable organization that adheres to and promotes Catholic teachings - would be viewed as a disqualifier from public service in this day and age," said a spokesperson for the Knights.

Rev. Eugene Rivers, an African-American Pentecostal minister, decried the "anti-Catholic bigotry" shown by the senators. **"As a leader of black Christians, I feel particularly strongly about the Knights of Columbus.** For more than a century they bravely defended minorities. If Catholics like the Knights can be targeted, what should members of my Pentecostal church expect?"

"We share traditional views on abortion and marriage. **What about Orthodox Jews, Muslims, Mormons and evangelical Christians?** Even the Rev. Martin Luther King's biblical beliefs would be anathema to (these senators).

**"It's ugly, it's vindictive, and it damages all of us,"** said Archbishop Chaput about these hostile attacks on religious faith among the nation's leading legislators.


