3. Recall a time when you experienced the work of the Holy Spirit in your life.

Family and children's question:

The Sign of the Cross is a prayer to the Trinity. Each day prayerfully make the Sign of the Cross in the morning and at night.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

The preacher began his sermon by saying, “I am not well prepared this week. It has been a terribly busy week, and I just didn’t have much time to prepare a sermon. We’ll have to rely on the Holy Spirit. Next week I’ll try to come better prepared.” This is what happens sometimes in our life too. We believe that we can handle our life better than God would.

Today is the Solemn Feast of Pentecost. Pentecost is a Greek word which means 50. Today is the 50th day after Easter, the feast of the Resurrection of Jesus from death. On the 50th day something wonderful and inexpressible happened to the believers of Jesus that the number of that day (50) itself became one of the names of the Holy Spirit who came upon them on the 50th (Pentecost) day.

The Holy Spirit came upon them, strengthening them more ably than they imagined and guiding them in newer ways than they could have devised. That is what happens to those who are led by the Holy Spirit. Let us meditate upon what happened to our Patron, Saint Thomas More.

Today we also celebrate the Feast of our Parish Patron St. Thomas More. He always prayed to the Holy Spirit and believed that he did all that he did at the inspiration of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit gave him the strength to even embrace his martyrdom, enabling him to make humorous comments to the one who beheaded him. He welcomed his martyrdom because he believed that he stood by the truth inspired by the Holy Spirit. He went where the Holy Spirit led him. He faced his life with the strength the Holy Spirit gave him. Let us pray to the Holy Spirit. Let the Holy Spirit strengthen and guide us.

Happy Feast to all of us. It is the Feast of our Patron, St. Thomas More. He is the Patron Saint of Families. Please pick up a prayer card which has the prayer for our families and prayer to the Holy Spirit. Please pray every day to the Holy Spirit individually for yourselves and for your families for the intercession of St. Thomas More.



Q & A by Fr. Antony

Today is the Solemn Feast of Pentecost. How does the Holy Spirit work in the Church?

Shine a light through a prism, or hang one in the window on a sunny day, and you'll see a rainbow. It's the same rainbow you see in the sky because, on a day with a mixture of rain and sun, each raindrop acts as a



miniature prism. White light refracts when it passes through a prism. Each wavelength refracts at a different angle, and the emergent light forms a rainbow.

God is light. God's light shines as the Holy Spirit in the Church which is the body of Christ. As light is refracted into the colors of a Rainbow the Holy Spirit fills the church with various gifts. Various ministries are the refracted colors of God the pure Light. Jesus Christ is the Prism and the Holy Spirit is the beam of God's pure light.

Various ministries are not merely a human division of labor to run an operation in a human institution. If we see these various services through the Prism of Jesus they will reflect back the pure love of God. Jesus said that whatever one does to the least of the people is actually done to Jesus. The ministries are done to the people and



they are done to Jesus. It is Jesus who turns the services into God-experience as the prism turns the colors into pure light backwardly.

The Holy Spirit is the one who enlightens the people that they are called to serve and empowers their services to bring out God-experience. The Holy Spirit makes the invisible God visible in human service. The Holy Spirit makes the mere human service to be God-experience through the Prism of Jesus.

Banning "God" from Graduation Speeches

More than two centuries after Freedom of Religion and Freedom of Speech were enshrined in the First Amendment to the Constitution, these rights are often in the news during Graduation season.

* **A H.S. graduating senior in PA, whose faith is a driving force behind everything she does, was surprised when the school tried to force her to leave out any reference to her religious beliefs from her graduation speech.** Determined not to be silenced for her beliefs, she asked First Liberty Institute for help. They sent a letter to the school district reminding them that the student's remarks were her own "private speech, not "government speech," and as such, could not violate the First Amendment Establishment Clause. The letter also cited the landmark Supreme Court decision which held that students do not "shed their constitutional rights to freedom of speech or expression at the schoolhouse gate."

* **A university in CO reversed its decision to remove a Bible verse from the graduation speech of a nursing student selected by her classmates to address the class.** Alliance Defending Freedom (ADF) sent a letter to the school stating, "It is ... well established that university officials cannot silence speech simply because it expresses a particular viewpoint, including a religious one." The ADF attorney noted that while universities often believe they are "fulfilling the commands of the First Amendment" when barring religious speech, "they're actually violating it."

* **An IL valedictorian was told just ten minutes before graduation that he would not be permitted to deliver his speech because it was too religious.** The all-star student was told to deliver generic comments devoid of the true inspiration for his academic performance. "It was terrible. I felt like I wanted to cry... For that to be taken away ..."

"These school officials ruined the only high school graduation Sam will ever know," said First liberty Institute. "How many more graduations have to be ruined before school officials will learn that the First Amendment protects student remarks at graduation?" (washingtontimes.com, 5/23/18; dailysignal.com, 5/16/18; firstliberty.org, 6/13/17; godtv.com, 5/16/19)


