



Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

July 28, 2019 Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time Genesis 18:20-32 Psalm 138:1-2, 2-3, 6-7, 7-8 Colossians 2:12-14 Luke 11:1-13

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke:

Jesus was praying in a certain place, and when he had finished, one of his disciples said to him, "Lord, teach us to pray just as John taught his disciples." He said to them, "When you pray, say: Father, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come. Give us each day our daily bread and forgive us our sins for we ourselves forgive everyone in debt to us, and do not subject us to the final test."

And he said to them, "Suppose one of you has a friend to whom he goes at midnight and says, 'Friend, lend me three loaves of bread, for a friend of mine has arrived at my house from a journey and I have nothing to offer him,' and he says in reply from within, 'Do not bother me; the door has already been locked and my children and I are already in bed. I cannot get up to give you anything.' I tell you, if he does not get up to give the visitor the loaves because of their friendship, he will get up to give him whatever he needs because of his persistence.

"And I tell you, ask and you will receive; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you. For everyone who asks, receives; and the one who seeks, finds; and to the one who knocks, the door will be opened. What father among you would hand his son a snake when he asks for a fish? Or hand him a scorpion when he asks for an egg? If you then, who are wicked, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him?"

Focus Questions:

- 1. Describe a time when you were angry with God because you felt your prayer wasn't answered.
- 2. What do you think is meant by the phrase, "thy will be done"?
- 3. For whom or what are you praying for these days?

Family and children's question:

Each day pray the Our Father, slowly, paying attention to the words.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Two men riding a bicycle built for two came to a long steep hill. It took a great deal of struggle for the men to complete the very steep climb. When they got to the top, the man in the front turned to the other and said, "Boy that sure was a hard climb." The fellow in back replied, "Yes, if I had not kept the brakes on all the way, we would certainly have rolled down backwards." It is not how much one does for the other but how much one cooperates with the other that would help climb the steep hill.

Last week Jesus' story of the Good Samaritan encouraged us to reach out to others in action. But this week Jesus asks active Martha to be quiet like Mary her sister "who sat beside the Lord at his feet listening to him speak." So what should we do? Be active like the Good Samaritan or listen quietly to Jesus like Mary?

Jesus seems to compliment Mary saying, "Mary has chosen the better part" but to Martha, "Martha you are anxious and worried about many things." Martha's work has become anxiety and worry because it was her own human strivings to treat Jesus. Her work would have been a joyful service to Jesus if it had been inspired and supported by her loving disposition to Jesus. Mary has chosen the better part because what she did was not to show how much she could do for Jesus but to dispose herself so that all that she did becomes God's work in her. Jesus teaches that each of us have a Mary and Martha in us. When we want to do something for God, we end up in anxiety, worry and guilt. We need a Mary in us to sit quietly at the feet of Jesus to inspire and support us. That is how we would begin to live life and not do life. All our prayers, meditations and Sunday worships are attempts to bring the Mary alive in us so that the Marth-part of our life is without anxiety and worry. Jesus wants us to live our life fully well.

"Equality Act" - Grants Special Rights to Some, Denies Rights to Most

Woe unto them that call evil good, and good evil; that put darkness for light and light for darkness; Isaiah 5:20

The misnamed "Equality Act of 2019", passed by the House of Representatives on May 17, is considered an assault on religious freedom, individual conscience and free speech, by leaders of all faiths who hold traditional beliefs about the distinction between sexes, that sex is determined at conception, and about marriage. "Persons and groups holding (these) traditional beliefs ... would be marked as bigots and exposed to legal action," wrote L. Grayson, National Catholic Register.

"The bill, if enacted, would make sexual orientation and gender identity equivalent to existing protections for race, color, national origin, sex, disability and religion under the 1964 Civil rights Act, while negating the free-exercise protections of the First Amendment...This proposed bill would affect virtually every aspect of American society."

"Rather than offering meaningful protections for individuals, the Equality Act would impose sweeping new norms that negatively impact the unborn, health care, charitable services, schools, personal privacy, athletics, free speech, religious liberties, and parental rights," said the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB).

Abp. Kurtz & fellow bishops sent a letter to the House citing more ill effects of this Act:

- "Houses of worship and other religious spaces will be turned into places of 'public accommodation'.
- Many privately funded shelters for the homeless & victims of domestic violence would be rendered illegal, ripping a hole in the social safety net.
- Core rights would be stripped from religious colleges & universities
- Houses of worship, religious charities, and religious individuals will lose the protection of the Religious Freedom Restoration Act (RIFRA).
- Religious individuals would be forced to take part in weddings & funerals that violate their religious beliefs." (ncregister.com, 6/18/19; osvnews.com, 5/20/19; usccb.org, 5/19/19)


