Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

October 6, 2019 **Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time** Habakuk 1:2-3; 2:2-4 Psalm 95:1-2, 6-7, 8-9 2 Timothy 1:6-8 13-14 Luke: 17: 5-10

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke:

The apostles said to the Lord, "Increase our faith." The Lord replied,

"If you have faith the size of a mustard seed, you would say to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and planted in the sea,' and it would obey you.

"Who among you would say to your servant who has just come in from plowing or tending sheep in the field. 'Come here immediately and take your place at table'? Would he not rather say to him, 'Prepare something for me to eat. Put on your apron and wait on me while I eat and drink. You may eat and drink when I am finished'? Is he grateful to that servant because he did what was commanded?

So should it be with you. When you have done all you have been commanded, say, 'We are unprofitable servants; we have done what we were obliged to do."

Focus Questions:

- 1. What is the size of your faith these days?
- 2. How are you called to serve God?
- 3. Describe a time when you experienced the struggle between doing what God wants and doing what you want.

Family and children's question:

Talk about a time when someone was kind to you. How did you respond?

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Atomic Prayer: A sign in a high school restroom read: "NOTICE! In the event of an atomic event, the federal ruling against prayer in this school will be temporarily suspended." Prayer – Praying to God would look like unnecessary and superstitious when everything goes the way we wish. Once we find that things don't go according to our wishes or nothing is in our control, we turn to a higher power. We pray, plead or request that power/person to relieve/save us.

Today's Gospel story explains this clearly. The rich man was too blinded by his wealth and comfort to see the world beyond himself. The poor and wretched Lazarus, whom he ignored at the steps of his own home, becomes clearly visible to him when the rich man is deprived of his selfish world wealth and comfort. The wealth that blinds people to their fellow human beings never bringd blessing but only curse in life.

Actually the rich man begins to pray at the realization that wealth alone cannot provide or secure life. He prays for help from the supposedly poor and helpless Lazarus. He prays to Abraham to convey the message to his brothers not to depend on wealth but to be charitable to less fortunate human beings. But the answer he got was that the message should come from each one's self realization of the worth of the people and not be infused into them by others. Let us look around that the world is not merely objects but vibration of lives of people, animals, plants and universe. We are not here to possess and control but to relate and love. Prayer is just a moment of realizing and actively living this truth.

Some States Mandate Schools to Teach LGBT History

Illinois just joined CA, CO, and NJ to require K-12 schools to teach LGBT 'history' incorporated into American history courses. Maryland is now developing a similar curriculum. Advocacy groups have praised these states for expanding their definitions of American history in the classroom. The laws mandate that publicly funded schools include "the roles and contributions of LGBT people in the history of this country and this State."

These laws also have their critics. Barnegat, NJ mayor, Alfonso Cirulli, said, "The government has no right to teach our kids morality." Many parents have objected to the mandates and the laws' implementation has been slow. CA school boards didn't approve the first LGBT-inclusive textbooks for K-8 classrooms until 2017. A California based non-profit group, Queer Education, complained, "We have seen a lot of schools dragging their feet."

Parents with different points of view have spoken at school board meetings. One California parent felt that teachers reading the children books about transgender people in 1st and 2nd grade is long before she may be ready to talk to her children at home about gender and sexuality. "I should be the one to educate about those things," she said. Another California parent thinks her 5 year-old son, born a girl, would benefit from stories shared at school.

American Principles Project director, Terry Schilling, a Washington D.C. nonprofit whose mission is to reestablish human dignity as the basis for American society said, "I can't think of anything weirder than being obsessed with teaching young children about sexuality. Even most parents struggle with the topic because of its difficulty but, somehow, we as parents are OK with a complete stranger teaching them.

"Parents need to reclaim their role as the primary educators of their children - especially as it pertains to their children's sexuality. No one else has that right or responsibility."

"American children today don't even know the basics of history. They are clueless as to the founding of America. They are already essentially being taught that America was founded by white men who oppressed women and minorities instead of what America was really founded on - the notion of human dignity, that all men are created equal and have inalienable rights. They aren't taught that civil rights leaders like Frederick Douglas and Martin Luther King Jr. viewed the ending of slavery and institution of civil rights as a continuation of the founding principles and not a contradiction."




