Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

December 1, 2019
First Sunday of Advent,
Isaiah 2:1-5
Psalm 122: 1-2, 3-4, 4-5, 6-7, 8-9
Romans 13: 11-14
Matthew 24: 37-44

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew:

Jesus said to his disciples:

"As it was in the days of Noah, so it will be at the coming of the Son of Man. In those days before the flood, they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, up to the day that Noah entered the ark. They did not know until the flood came and carried them all away. So will it be also at the coming of the Son of Man.

Two men will be out in the field; one will be taken, and one will be left. Two women will be grinding at the mill; one will be taken, and one will be left. Therefore, stay awake! For you do not know on which day your Lord will come. Be sure of this: if the master of the house had known the hour of night when the thief was coming, he would have stayed awake and not let his house be broken into. So too, you also must be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come."

Focus Questions:

- 1. How often do you think of the Second Coming of Jesus? How prepared are you for this coming?
- 2. Advent is different every year because we are different every year. What in you needs a savior this Advent?
- 3. When have you felt the pressure of time keeping you from being prepared?

Family and children's question:

Talk about what you can do as a family to make Advent a more spiritual experience.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Judge: Guilty or not guilty?

Prisoner: Well, I thought I was guilty, but I've been talking to my lawyer and he's convinced me I'm not guilty. The law is so narrowly focused on actions and situations, not so much on persons or their intentions. So a lawyer's subtle tactics of applying the law to a situation can make the guilty look like innocent and the innocent look like the guilty. The law is blind potential-energy. It becomes a live and active power for better or worse in the way its potential is used or abused. But God, the merciful Judge renders justice to His people on a totally different level.

Today is the Solemn Feast of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. It is the feast of God's mercy shown and spent for us and for the whole universe in Jesus Christ. Today's Gospel depicts Jesus as the merciful and forgiving King in whose kingdom everyone is included, not on their individual merits but on the unconditional mercy of God expressed in Jesus on the Cross.

Jesus promises the repentant co-crucified criminal that he would be with Him in Paradise. Jesus shows that God's mercy is for all irrespective of one's merit or demerit. Anyone who repents and asks for God's mercy will enter God's kingdom and become a citizen of God's kingdom. By law humans can prove or disprove people as meritorious or criminal. But God in his mercy shows in Jesus that God is ready to embrace His people for life and its fullness.

This Thursday is Thanksgiving Day. Giving thanks is not one of the things that we do. It is a fundamental attitude towards life. Without thanksgiving we will be easily turned into machines or creatures of habits. Thanksgiving makes us consciously live from the heart. When we begin to live from our heart we will live every moment of life in the spirit of Thanksgiving.

Who shall we thank and what shall we be thankful for? First start with your own individual self.... Be thankful for your body, intellect, feelings, capacity to love and to be loved... etc. Be thankful for your relations and possessions... be thankful for those who provide and for all provisions we have.... etc... Living in the spirit of Thanksgiving will turn you to be a very positive person and spread your positive spirit around you. Happy Thanksgiving to one and all of you.

Why Do We Celebrate Thanksgiving Day Every Year?

Ever since 1789 when President George Washington proclaimed that a day of Thanksgiving be held to thank God for giving the American people the opportunity to create a Constitution to preserve their hard-won freedoms, most presidents have also proclaimed a national day of thanksgiving and praise to God. However, the dates and months of the celebration varied. It wasn't until President Abraham Lincoln's 1863 Proclamation that Thanksgiving was regularly commemorated each year on the last Thursday in November. Then, in 1941, Congress passed a joint resolution and officially set the fourth Thursday in November as a fixed-date for the holiday.

Since Washington's proclamation was the first of its kind, it is the legitimate standard for all future proclamations. Pres. Washington focused on God and our relationship to him. He said we should "acknowledge His providence," "obey His will," "be grateful for His benefits," "humbly implore His protection and favor." Thanksgiving should be "devoted by the people of these States to the service of that great and glorious Being who is the beneficent author of all the good that was, that is, or that will be."

Thanksgiving Proclamations:

1863 - Pres. Abraham Lincoln: "(I) invite my fellow citizens in every part of the United States to set apart and observe (a day) of Thanksgiving and Praise to our beneficent Father who dwelleth in the heavens."

2015 - Pres. Barack Obama: "Pres. George Washington proclaimed the first Thanksgiving in our country's nascence, calling on the citizens of our fledgling democracy to place their faith in 'the providence of Almighty God,' and to be thankful for what is bequeathed us."

2017 - Pres. Donald Trump: "On this Thanksgiving Day, as we have for nearly four centuries, Americans give thanks to Almighty God for our abundant blessings ... to show gratitude for our freedom, for our friends and families, and for the prosperous Nation we call home." 
